



2nd SUNDAY OF LENT





Catechism Paragraphs 1427-1429



I mentioned last week that I am listening to the audiobook of Fr. Timothy Gallagher's *The Discernment of Spirits*, which I have very much on my mind. St. Ignatius gave us several helpful rules about the spiritual life. In his third rule he defines spiritual consolation as an interior movement in the soul through which the soul becomes inflamed with love of the Creator. He also calls it consolation when one is moved to tears out of sorrow for sins or for the passion of Christ our Lord.

When have we been moved to sorrow for our sins? I have been meditating on that myself. On Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and Good Friday we will reflect on the acts of St. Peter and Judas. Both betrayed Jesus. At a look from Jesus, Peter went out and wept bitterly. "Jesus' look of infinite mercy drew tears of repentance from Peter and, after the Lord's resurrection, a threefold affirmation of love for him" (CCC 1429). Judas could have received Jesus' love and mercy; he chose not to.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen talked about the Second Look. Jesus had first looked at Peter at his calling. Archbishop Sheen attributes these words to Jesus at the denial. "Peter, I love you still. You have denied Me, but I will not deny you. I cannot give you up." Despite our failings or how many times we have fallen and need help up, the Lord looks at us again. Can we do as Peter did?

We heard on Ash Wednesday and last week "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Our first conversion happened at our Baptism. It was a turning away from sinfulness and toward a life of Christ. If we were baptized as an infant, that movement of turning away and a life of Christ was meant to happen in the home as we grew.

That sorrow for sins and the Second Look is a second conversion. The catechism refers to it as an uninterrupted task, which means acknowledgment of our sins and asking the Lord for mercy is a lifelong endeavor. Thus, we need regular penance and renewal. I like this line from the catechism: "This endeavor of conversion is not just a human work. It is the movement of a 'contrite heart,' drawn and moved by grace to respond to the merciful love of God who loved us first" (CCC 1428). As often as we prayerfully reflect and find that our heart does not wholly belong to God, God is lovingly and mercifully calling us back.

If we have not had tears of repentance for a while or if we have difficulty seeing our own sins, it is a good time to ask God for this healthy sorrow. Lent after all is a more intense time of turning back to the Lord. I like what Fr. Mike Schmitz said when covering this section as asking for sorrow may seem like an odd thing. "It's better to have a heart that's hurt by our sadness over our sins, our grief over our sins than a heart that is hardened." In this light recall the beatitude, "Blessed are those who mourn for they will be comforted."

I remind that this section of the catechism is about confession, and my motivation is to motivate us to love the sacrament and frequent it more. I pray that your Lent is going well.




