





4TH SUNDAY OF LENT

FATHER, I'M SO ASHAMED OF MY SINS, I JUST WANT TO HIDE IN THE DARK MOST OF THE TIME.





IVF



I saw a picture of someone holding a sign which said "I'm here because of IVF." I started to wonder: How many people are not able to hold a sign saying "I am not here because of IVF"?

I am going to break for a week on discussing the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. The Alabama Supreme Court ruled in February that embryos are people. This put into question the practice of in vitro fertilization. A week later their state legislature voted to protect doctors from criminal or civil liability if embryos they helped to create were damaged or destroyed. This presents a teaching moment on something that is difficult to find the right context to discuss. The catechism discusses IVF and describes it as morally unacceptable.

In the catechism, paragraph 2377 is part of the discussion about the sixth commandment. The problem with IVF is that it disassociates the sexual act from the procreative act. A child is brought into being not by the loving embrace of his or her parents but through the power of doctors and biologists and technology. I used the words "helped to create" above due to the moment of conception being completely different. Because of the immense dignity we have as human beings, we are not to be created by anyone other than the Creator. "Such a relationship of domination is in itself contrary to the dignity and equality that must be common to parents and children."

I mentioned that this discussion was part of the section on the sixth commandment in the catechism; however, IVF is also problematic in that it violates the fifth commandment, you shall not kill. During IVF, multiple human beings are made. Not all of these human beings are ever born. Through some process, someone must make a determination which of these humans are most suitable for implantation. The rest are

discarded. An article I read from National Catholic Register reported this as almost half.

With IVF there is the possibility of multiple pregnancies. While this is becoming less common, something called multifetal pregnancy reduction has been paired with IVF. Multifetal pregnancy reduction are three words to describe abortion. For these reasons I stated there are people who are not here because of IVF.

A child is not something owed to one, but is a gift. The "supreme gift of marriage" is a human person. A child may not be considered a piece of property, an idea to which an alleged "right to a child" would lead. In this area, only the child possesses genuine rights: the right "to be the fruit of the specific act of the conjugal love of his parents," and "the right to be respected as a person from the moment of his conception." (CCC 2378).

The next line of the catechism reminds that infertility is a share in the Lord's Cross. I pray for you as one that gave up children (Mark 10: 29) to become a priest and as one who has no nieces or nephews. I realize this article is going to produce a range of emotions. Perhaps you did not know. Not knowing something is sinful reduces our culpability. As have been writing about the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation during Lent, this is something else to bring to this sacrament to receive the Lord's healing and grace. This is certainly something to bring to prayer to understand the good that the Church is upholding.

This is the first in a series of articles about the West Oakland Family of Parishes

Part 1 Why is there a Family of Parishes?

The current health and economic crises have accelerated the process of renewing the way our parishes are organized and structured. With declining parishioners and priest shortage, we now have fewer material resources to keep our mission active. Archbishop Vigneron, in consultation with clergy and lay advisors (Synod16) gathered to discuss and discern the future of the Archdiocese and decide on the steps we need to take to turn us into a diocese of joyful missionary disciples.

The goal of Synod 16 was to make us into missionaries and to change the DNA of the archdiocese of Detroit. To achieve these goals, the focus was on evangelization and moving from a maintenance-focused Church to a mission-focused Church. Synod 16 was a catalyst for Unleash the Gospel.

One of the responses was the creation of Families of Parishes. These are groups of parishes, sharing resources to advance the mission, including having multiple priests and deacons serving the Family of Parishes. This new model will allow the priests, deacons, religious and lay staff associated with each parish to better share their gifts and talents with the whole Family of Parishes.
