COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

3, 4, and 5 Year-olds

class and participate in the activities with the other children.

We have two classrooms doing Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. It's a very quiet, yet hands-on approach to learning the faith. It is a Montessori

based religious formation methodology for children aged 3 to 12. It helps our youngest faithful to develop an authentic prayerful relationship with God who loves them, through the use of sensorially rich materials. It originated in 1954 through the work of Dr. Sofia Cavalleti, a Biblical scholar trained in Catholic theology, and Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori educator. Life and faith are celebrated as children learn about special seasons and days, scripture, and prayer. Children ponder the lessons and deepen their relationship with God.

First thru 5th Grade

St. Nicholas Parish has chosen to use the *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies* Faith Formation Program this year. It differs from other programs in several significant ways. It integrates faith formation with the life of the parish community experienced at the Mass.

This allows children to learn their faith within the rhythms of the liturgical year & the Mass is more meaningful to the children because they are familiar with the Gospel proclaimed each week.

This program does not use a textbook. Each child will receive a "catechism handbook" called, What the Church Believes and Teaches. It contains the doctrinal elements that are seen as essential for each grade level. Each week the children receive a new lesson dated for each Sunday of the liturgical year. Lessons on days we do not meet will be sent home. Parents should ask their child(ren) for this page each Sunday! Free resources designed for families are included: such as The Gospel at Home, a weekly summary of the Sunday Gospel with suggestions for parents to use at home, plus additional resources including an email reminder with a link to the resources that you can sign up for. Go to www.gospelweeklies.com, click on "Browse," and then click on "Resources for Families." You can gather as a family at home to talk about the lessons as a family.

Classes begin at 10:30 and end at 11:45 am.

Apostle Sundays

During the year there will be two opportunities, called Apostle Sundays, for parents to participate

with their children in events that will strengthen their "little church" at home.

The two Apostle Sundays this year are:

- * October 26th
- * February 15th

Apostle Sunday events happen during the usual Sunday RE class time.

Sacraments

First Reconciliation, First Communion, and OCIC occur outside the Sunday morning RE classes [see the brochures called First Reconciliation & First Communion and Order of Christian Initiation for Children (OCIC)]. Mass attendance & Sunday RE classes are mandatory for those in Sacramental Preparation.

Those third through fifth grade students who are already baptized but who have not had the opportunity to attend a regular RE program and need to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Communion will attend their age-appropriate class on Sundays as well as the monthly classes for Sacramental Preparation.

Extreme Weather Policy

Extremely cold weather or dangerously icy roads may result in a cancelled class. When the North Pole *Time and Temperature* message (488.1111) at 8:00 am states the temperature is –40 degrees or colder, or when the condition of roads are too icy, classes will be cancelled.
