FROM THE PASTOR'S DESKTOP

Dear Parish Family

We are in this beautiful Octave of the Nativity of the Lord, every day being a "Christmas Day." On Friday we shall celebrate the Octave Day of the Nativity when Mary and Joseph will take the Baby Jesus to be circumcised and to be given the name that designates Him as Savior of the world. Oh, and it is also New Year's Day. Yes, the new year begins on the day that Jesus was named. Truly every year is an *Annus Domini*, a year of the Lord. On Friday begins the year MMXXI *anno Domini*, and we shall be *in the year of the Lord* 2021. As hard as 2020 has been, it, too, was a *year of the Lord*, a year in which we were called to live and given the graces necessary to find our way to holiness.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. In that family the Savior of the world chose to be born and grow. From that family the Savior went out into the world to fulfill His mission, His divine vocation. So each one of us were born into a family. We were formed and grew and went forth from that family into the world to fulfill God's will for us. Some can boast of a perfect and happy family, closely modelled on the example of the Holy Family. Others suffer from wounds received in the very heart of their families that reflected less perfectly the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Whatever our experience, I hope that we can find in our parish family and the family of God's Church the love and communion with one another that sustains us through life, nourishes our faith and helps us along the road to heaven.

I rejoice at the families that have joined our parish. Two weeks ago two children of one of those families were baptized and *named* as children of God in the regenerating waters of baptism. There are children of other families who were not baptized as infants who are also undergoing preparation for this sacrament. Let us keep them in our prayers.

Here is a prayer to the Holy Family that will be known to and, hopefully, prayed by many of you. My parents taught it to me and I repeat it every night and at other times during the day. I feel it is a prayer that has offered me great protection. I commend it to you.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, I give you my heart and my soul.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, assist me in my last agony.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph, may I breathe forth my soul in peace with you.

Into your hands, O God, I commend my spirit. Lord Jesus, receive my soul.
