FROM THE PASTOR'S DESKTOP

World Mission Sunday reminds us that the Church is, of its nature, missionary. We have been commissioned by Jesus Christ to go and teach all nations and to baptize those nations in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The purpose is clear: to gain converts, to win souls for Christ, to "compel them to enter" the wedding feast of the Lamb, by entering into a spousal relationship with Christ through membership of his bride, the Church.

The service missionaries render to others is, however, in no way conditional upon conversion. Each person already contains within him/herself the image of God. No matter who they are, we find Christ already present in some way in those who are materially or spiritually poor, sick, imprisoned. St. Teresa of Calcutta hoped that, before a poor person died, he or she would see the face of Christ in one of her Missionaries of Charity. The Church is the greatest provider of care and education in the world and she does so, and you and I do so, unconditionally.

Yet through the witness of their lives, missionaries hope to transmit the faith to those whom they serve. This is our mission too: to gain disciples for Christ. One of the reasons for participating in the apologetics program currently taking place in the parish is to learn how to give a reasoned witness of our faith. I encourage you to join up and participate.

I would also like to encourage you to get hold of a short and very readable book entitled *From Christendom to Apostolic Mission* published by the University of Mary. The essential thesis of the book is that we no longer live in a society ordered according to Christian principles. Therefore, acknowledging that we live in a post- or non-Christian environment, we are called once again to be missionaries to the people among whom we live, even to our fellow Catholics who have fallen prey to worldly ways of thinking. As the authors write: "If that Christendom world is no longer present and the society is going in a different direction, Christians will need to find ways to create a societal architecture that incarnates an increasingly counter-cultural Christian vision." A study guide to accompany the book is available at tinyurl.com/3ejp324c. Let me know if you'd like to form a study group.

We can neither swim in the direction of the culture nor calmly co-exist with the culture. We must swim *against* the culture as fish that are alive swim upstream against the flow. Even our disinterested service of the poor will be counter-cultural. Our attention to the poor rather than our concern at combatting poverty will be a scandal to the globalist mentality of today. But let us not forget the primacy of prayer. I encourage you to pray the Rosary daily, to spend time in the Church, to prayerfully meditate on Sacred Scripture, to center your lives on the Eucharist, to attend daily Mass if possible, to frequently confess your sins. May Christ and His Mother bless us. *Fr. JB*

CATHOLIC APOLOGETICS CLASS

Catholic Apologetics means to give a reasoned explanation for the truth of the Catholic faith and a defense against objections. The class is led by Fr. Boyle. The first class was on Thursday, October 21. **If you missed the first class you are still welcome to join!** The next class will be November 4 at 3:30pm in the Newman Room. Starting in December it will be on first and third Thursdays. Order your starting material at shop.catholicapologetics.com and order the *Apologetics Starter Pack* and the booklet *Beginning Apologetics 7: How to Read the Bible*. That would give you 4 pieces of resource material from the San Juan Seminars organization. This organization tells us that a Catholic apologist charitably explains and defends Catholic doctrine using Scripture, history, and common sense.

PLANNING AHEAD FOR FULFILLING YOUR CHRISTMAS AND SUNDAY OBLIGATIONS

Christmas Day falls on a Saturday. There will be a Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve, Midnight Mass, and morning Masses at the usual Sunday times on Christmas Day. If there is an evening Mass on Saturday (yet to be decided), it will be the Mass of Christmas Day. The Mass of Sunday will be celebrated only on Sunday morning. There are two obligations to fulfill: that of Christmas and that of Sunday. The Sunday Mass obligation can be fulfilled by attending Mass on the previous evening, even if it is not the Mass of Sunday, but you cannot do a "two for one," i.e. fulfill both obligations by attending only one Mass. You may fulfill these obligations in one of the following ways:

- Attend the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve or Midnight Mass or Christmas morning or Christmas evening Mass AND Mass on Sunday morning.
- Attend the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve or Midnight Mass or Christmas morning Mass AND Christmas evening or Sunday morning.

If you have any questions or feel you need a dispensation from one or both of these obligations, your pastor has the faculty to grant such a dispensation.
