FROM THE PASTOR'S DESKTOP

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we commence the month dedicated to the meek, humble and Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I was wondering if there was any work of art that depicted both the Blessed Trinity and the Sacred Heart, and was very happy to find the one featured on the cover of this bulletin. Here is the description given on the Prado Museum's website, translated from the Spanish.

"The iconography is singular. High up, surrounded by clouds and angels, is an enormous Heart of Jesus surrounded by a crown of thorns. In the center on a cloud, the Trinity with the Father, a venerable old man, and the Son with a naked torso. Between them flies the dove of the Holy Spirit. At the bottom, a multitude of saints on clouds. They can be recognized by their attributes or by fidelity to their traditional representations, as the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, St. John the Baptist, St. Mary Magdalen, St. Catherine, St. Dominic, St. Francis, St. Ignatius, St. Francis Xavier, St. Francis Borgia, St. Barbara, St. Isidore, St. James, St. Cecilia, St. Jane de Chantal..

"The presence of the Heart of Jesus is related to the rise of this new devotion at that time. The feast of the Sacred Heart was established by Pope Clement XIII in 1729 and was warmly welcomed by the Jesuits and by the Order of the Visitation (founded by St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane de Chantal), precisely the order chosen by the Spanish Queen Consort, Bárbara de Braganza, for her foundation of the Monastery of the Visitation, in which Giaquinto painted an altar where St. Francis de Sales and St. Jane de Chantal appear adoring the Sacred Heart."

In this work of art, we see depicted the love of the Most Holy Trinity manifested in the loving and Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Let us rejoice that love is the heart of God. Let us abhor the deadly sin of pride and learn from Jesus for He is meek and humble of heart and thus we shall find rest for our souls. (Mt. 11:29) ~ Fr. John

MASS TIMES CHANGE?

Last Sunday I mentioned a suggested possibility for resolving a pastoral conflict that I face on Sunday mornings, namely, not being present for the faith formation classes at OLPH. As their pastor, I really desire to get to know the children and young people who are attending class on Sunday mornings, having the opportunity of being with them in class, and to be able to offer some classes to parents while their kids are in class. I am unable to do these things as I am in, or on the road from, Creswell. How could this be overcome? Here are some possibilities.

1. Have Saturday evening Mass at SPB and an early morning Mass (e.g. 8/8:30) at OLPH.
2. Move the 8:30am Mass at SPB to 8:00am (not very popular in the winter?)
3. Move the 10:30am Mass at OLPH to 11:00am, starting classes half an hour later.
4. Any other suggestions?

I am open to hearing your thoughts and suggestions. Please ensure that you pray about what is best for the parish before replying. A key factor is how the pastor is best able to fulfill his ministry. Please provide your suggestions in charity. Anonymous messages will not be considered. As we prepare to welcome and receive blessings from the newly ordained Reverend Father Matthew Knight, let's remember the men still in seminary. A WORD ABOUT MODESTY

A reminder about modesty particularly when we attend Mass, whether we are male or female.

Remember that the body is a temple of the Holy Spirit. How we dress shows how much we respect: the dignity of our bodies as temples of God and made for eternal life; ourselves; others. It also shows what we think of the Mass. We are coming to the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross made present on the altar. There is nothing informal about the Mass. While we should not be motivated by vanity, we do well to "dress up" and to "dress well."

Particularly in hot weather, while one might wish to dress comfortably, one should avoid exposing too much flesh. Please: arms should be covered at least as far as somewhere between shoulder and elbow, i.e. dresses, shirts, blouses, tee-shirts, etc. should have sleeves, whether short or long; legs should be covered to at least just above the knee; shoulders, chest and back should be covered; necklines should be modest (err on the higher side). Revealing clothing, whether

because it fails to cover the body (e.g. midriff, cleavage, etc.) or is so tight that it is, in fact, revealing, (e.g. tight pants, dresses, skirts, or tee-shirts) is to be avoided. Ripped jeans are not respectable attire for Mass. It is possible to dress well yet comfortably.

Let us be respectful of ourselves, others, and the occasion: the Holy Mass.

BLUE BAG RETURNABLES

Thank you for the constant generous donations of refundable containers for the youth group. The blue bag Bottledrop system we are using has made this fundraiser easy and successful.
