Sacraments at St. John Parish

RECONCILIATION—By appointment or Saturdays via drive-up from 4-4:30 PM in parish office parking lot.

BAPTISMS—Baptism of infants and young children is celebrated on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. All parents are asked to attend a Baptism Registration session. Also, a Baptism Preparation class for parents of first-born dren is scheduled monthly. Advance registration is necessary for the session, the preparation, and the sacrament.

Contact the parish office about Baptism of children aged 7 and older.

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST EUCHARIST—Preparation for children begins in 1st grade, and the sacraments are received in the fall and spring of 2nd grade, respectively. Preparation for adults and older children is done through the RCIA program. Preparation begins in September, and the sacraments are received during the Easter Vigil Mass.

CONFIRMATION—The Sacrament of Confirmation is offered to anyone in High School who has completed their 8th grade year of Catholic Religious Education. Preparation takes place through the Teens in Ministry program. The sacrament is conferred in October. Confirmation for adult Catholics is celebrated in the archdiocese twice a year. A period of preparation includes prayerful discernment and catechesis.

Adults who desire to become members of the Catholic Faith receive the sacraments through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).

MARRIAGE—Couples preparing for marriage should contact the parish office at least 6 months in advance of their desired date.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK & HOME COMMUNION— The Anointing of the Sick is available on the second Sunday of the month, following the 9 AM Mass (SUSPENDED). Please notify the parish office if a member of the parish is ill and would like to receive Communion at home.

From the Pastor's Desk

TRINITY SUNDAY: CALLED TO LIVE THE LIFE OF THE TRINITY, NOT THE MYSTERY



The Gospel this Sunday presents the last words of Jesus on earth, before He ascended to the Father. As a caring person, He provides to us His last words with great significance and seriousness. As a mystery provides clues to decipher, this solemnity provides clues though the Gospel of what we can put together that will give us an idea of God, who is loving and involving us in His mission - through the Great Commissioning.

"All power in heaven and earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you..."

This commissioning tells us that we are His people and we are entrusted with a mission. God, our Father, wants us to be loving and co-creative in sowing the love He has begun in our world. He becomes present when we allow Him to accompany us in the life of transformation, or when we help others to be become His disciples. We live the life of the Trinity when our lives are filled with loving desire to save, to rescue, to help others from the traps of the world. The Holy Spirit becomes present when we open ourselves to His inspiration and power. It is His presence and power that strengthen us to become His disciples according to His purpose and ways.

I encourage you to open yourselves in the life of the Trinity, who shapes us to become forgiving rather than condemning. Living this life will take our lives and decisions to building up and affirming rather than tearing down. This life will lead us to become self-sacrificial and not self-centered, giving rather than holding or hoarding, and healing rather than wounding

Look at the way you live your life within your home with your family. The life of the Trinity is best affirmed and nurtured within our homes. For it is in a family that we not only belong, but also where we discover, nurture, and affirm our own unique and individual personalities. It is in living the reality of being truly a family that we have a glimpse into the life of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

May God bless you (+) the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.



Preparing Casseroles: Disposable pans and printed recipes are available in a bin outside the parish office. The recipe can also be downloaded at http://www.sjehydes.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/our-daily-bread.pdf. When making casseroles, please ensure that the chicken is thoroughly cooked, particularly around the bone. Then cover in foil, label with the date and "Chicken & Rice" and freeze before drop-off day.

Dropping-off Casseroles: Simply place the frozen casseroles in the trunk of your vehicle, and when arriving at SJE, go straight to the parking lot between the chapel and the bell tower. Volunteers will remove the frozen casseroles from your trunk, so there is no need to exit your vehicle.


