Dear Friends,

Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist are known as Easter sacraments, because they initiate, confirm, and nourish us in the new life of Christ. Through baptism, the life that we live everyday is given new meaning and an exciting mission through our likeness to Christ, who died and who rose again, victorious over sin and death itself.

We who share his humanity and his cross will also share his resurrection. Meanwhile, our mission is to be in the world as Jesus was: A priest, who gave himself for the life of others; a prophet, who lived and taught fidelity to the covenant of justice, love and peace that unites God and the people; and a king, who ordered all things – time, talent, and treasure - toward the common good of all.

Baptism makes us disciples of Jesus through faith, and it gives us hope; baptism also makes us missionaries, who are eager to share with the world the good news of God's love that God has lavished on us.

Confirmation strengthens us in our Christian identity through the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It is important that we recognize these gifts, cooperate with them, and put them into practice. Like muscles of the soul, the gifts of the Spirit will grow stronger from exercise and use; like precious silver, they will shine more brightly when they are taken out of the drawer, polished, and put into service. The Spirit's gifts are many, but prominent among them are wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, and fear of the Lord (see Isaiah 11: 1-3).

The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament of the Body and Blood of the Lord. It nourishes us under signs of bread and wine so that our communion with the Lord becomes stronger and more intimate. By approaching the Table of the Lord worthily, attentively, and devoutly, we strengthen our discipleship and our missionary zeal.

Here at Christ the King, we celebrated many baptisms and confirmations at Easter; On April 25th, we will celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation with Archbishop Sartain at the 5:00pm Mass; and on April 18th at 10am and May 3rd at 10:30am, we will welcome many to their First Communion.

The Spirit is moving among us in powerful and sacramental ways during this Easter season, which gives us reason for joy and hope, thankfulness and praise. Alleluia!


