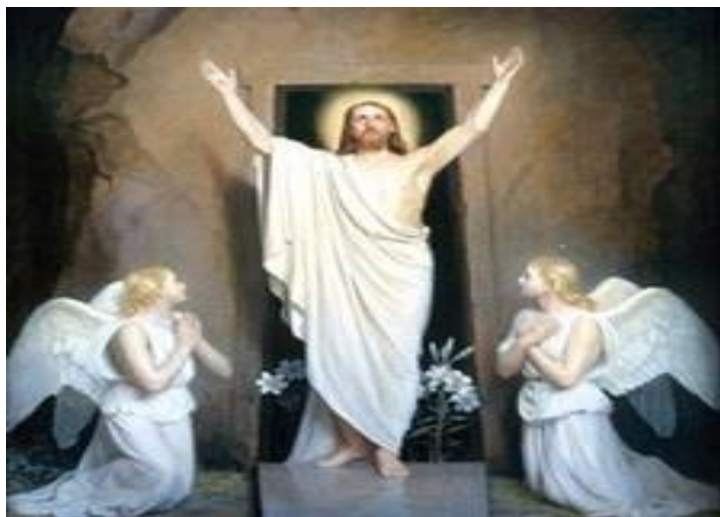

Dear Friends & Easter Visitors:

Egyptian pyramids are world-famous as one of the “Seven Wonders” of the ancient world. Actually, they are gigantic tombs containing the mummified bodies of Egyptian Pharaohs. Westminster Abby is famous, and thousands visit it because the dead bodies of famous writers, philosophers, and politicians are entombed there. Then there is the Church of the Holy Sepulcher in Jerusalem. Pilgrims from all over the world visit a tomb there that is **empty** with a note at its entrance that says, “He is not here.”

The Church of the Holy Sepulcher is famous because Jesus Christ, who was once buried there, rose from the dead, leaving an empty tomb as He had told his disciples he would. By doing so, He worked the most important miracle in His life, defying the laws of nature, and proving that He is God.

We Catholics rejoice at this great and unique event by celebrating Easter, not only today but at every single Holy Mass.
