MESSAGE FROM DEACON JOE

Dear Friends:

On the last Sunday of the year, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. This feast reminds us that we are part of a human family and at the same time we belong to God's family, the Church. In both of these families, we have privileges and responsibilities. In both, we work out our salvation together as women, men, and children living and working in love and peace. Let us try our best to make life pleasant for other members in our family, and let us begin once again today. In the First Reading today, we hear God's promise that there would be numerous descendants of Abraham. This began unexpectedly when Abraham's wife, Sarah, gave birth to Isaac. Today, Judaism, Christianity, and Islam consider Abraham as their father.

In the Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, the sacred author shows us the trusting faith of Abraham. That trust was first manifest in Abraham's willingness to move his whole family to an unknown place to which God said he would lead him. Secondly, Abraham and Sarah trusted God's power to give them a son, born to them in their very old age. And finally, we hear Abraham's unwavering faith in his God, which enabled him to obey, without hesitation, God's order to sacrifice his only son.

Today's Gospel presents Joseph, as the head of the Holy Family, faithfully obeying the Mosaic Law concerning purification by presenting Mary and the baby Jesus in the Tem-

By celebrating the Sunday following Christmas as the Feast of the Holy Family, the Church encourages us to offer the members of our own families on the altar for God's blessing; then to look to the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph for inspiration, example, and encouragement. They were a model family in which both parents worked hard, helped each other, understood and accepted each other, and took good care of their child so that he might grow not only in human knowledge but also as a child of God. Jesus brought holiness to the family of Joseph and Mary just as he brings us holiness by accepting us into his family, if we would only let him.
