

Letter from our Pastor—Carta de nuestro párroco

Dear Friends,

Where have you seen Lazarus lately? Did you even notice him? This weekend's Gospel is one of the parables of Jesus that begs us to *examine our conscience*. Do I stop to notice the poor, and do I stop long enough to reach out to offer help and care for them?

Most of us are much better off than Lazarus—we have a place to stay at night, food on our table and clothing on our backs. Other pressures may weigh upon us—bills, family issues, challenges at work, or other matters. But most of us do not fear for the basics. Are those other issues giving us the excuse to *forget about Lazarus*?

When Jesus came, he challenged people to look at the world in a different way. Isn't that what we love about the Gospel—how it makes us dream of the Kingdom? The story of the rich man and Lazarus challenges us to look beyond ourselves—to see the poor and needy at our doorstep, and to realize we have a relationship with them, our brothers and sisters. Jesus' dream of the kingdom starts right here—when we recognize and love our neediest brothers and sisters!

Certainly, Pope Francis has been challenging the Church and the world to take notice of Lazarus—to go to those on the fringes, on the periphery, and to share with them the compassion and mercy of Jesus. One by one, can we start to do that?

Queridos amigos,



¿Dónde hemos visto a Lázaro últimamente? ¿Lo hemos notado a nuestro alrededor? El Evangelio de este fin de semana es una de las parábolas de Jesús que demanda un examen interior de conciencia. ¿Me detengo y noto a los pobres que encuentro diariamente? ¿Y, me detengo el tiempo suficiente para poder acercarme a ellos y ofrecerles ayuda y cuidado?

La mayoría de nosotros estamos mucho mejor que Lázaro: tenemos un lugar donde pasar la noche, comida en nuestra mesa y ropa para cubrirnos. Tal vez otras presiones pueden pesar sobre nuestros hombros y mentes: facturas que pagar, problemas familiares, desafíos en el trabajo u otros asuntos. Pero la mayoría de nosotros tenemos lo básico. Debemos reflexionar si esos otros asuntos ocupan demasiado nuestra mente y nos dan excusa para olvidarnos de Lázaro y de los necesitados a nuestro alrededor.

Cuando Jesús vino, desafió a las personas a mirar el mundo de una manera diferente. ¿No es eso lo que nos atrae del Evangelio? ¿Cómo Jesús nos hace imaginarnos y soñar con el Reino de Dios? La historia del hombre rico y Lázaro nos desafía a mirar más allá de nosotros mismos, para ver a los pobres y necesitados en nuestra comunidad y darnos cuenta de que tenemos una relación con ellos, que son nuestros hermanos y hermanas. El sueño de Jesús y del Reino comienza justo aquí, en este mundo y se hace realidad ¡cuando reconocemos, ayudamos y amamos a nuestros hermanos y hermanas más necesitados!

Ciertamente, el Papa Francisco ha estado desafiando a la Iglesia y al mundo en general a prestar atención a Lázaro, a ir a los marginados, a la periferia, y compartir con ellos la compasión y la misericordia de Jesús. Y nosotros, uno por uno, ¿Cuándo podemos empezar a hacer esto?

Water Damage after the Sept. 13th Thunderstorm

Unfortunately, the storm in the early morning of September 13th caused flooding once again in our local area. At Resurrection-Ascension, there was serious flooding again in both convents' basements as well as the church/school boiler room (five feet of water in the boiler room!). The damage is still being assessed by insurance. In addition to substantial boiler room repairs, which may include burners and other electronic equipment, we will need to repair some drainage pipes below the building that are contributing to the flooding. We will keep you posted.

At Our Lady of the Angelus, the flooding was minor in the church and rectory basements and our maintenance staff was able to handle the clean up. There is water damage in the school basement which will be addressed shortly.

La tormenta en la madrugada del 13 de septiembre provocó inundaciones una vez más en nuestra área local. En Resurrección-Ascensión, hubo nuevamente inundaciones considerables tanto en el sótano de los conventos, como en el cuarto de la calderas (boiler) de la iglesia/escuela. El daño aún está siendo evaluado por la compañía de seguros. Debido a esto, tendremos considerables arreglos que incluyen la caldera, equipo electrónico y tuberías de drenaje debajo del edificio de la iglesia que contribuyen a la inundación.

Los mantendremos informados.



En Nuestra Señora del Ángelus, la inundación fue menor en los sótanos de la iglesia y la rectoría y nuestro personal de mantenimiento pudo manejar la limpieza. Hay daños causados por la lluvia en el sótano del edificio de la escuela que se repararán pronto.

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

September 25, 2022

*“Father Abraham, have pity on me.
Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger
in water and cool my tongue.”*

Luke 16:24



NO ROOM FOR THE LUKEWARM

Our liturgy today picks up right where we left off last Sunday. It is still about making positive choices for the greater good, and that there is no room for the lukewarm. The prophet Amos continues preaching his gloom and doom, as he calls out the complacent. Paul urges Timothy to a life completely opposite that of Amos' complacent ones, as an athlete competing for the faith to “Keep the commandment without stain or reproach until the appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ.” In Luke’s parable of Lazarus and the rich man, we see someone who is unwilling to do the right thing until he tries to save himself. By then it is too late for him.

NOTHING WRONG WITH THE GOOD LIFE

You know, there is nothing wrong with studying and working hard, and building up stability and wealth for your family. It is a good and positive thing to have money for retirement, vacations, or even to have a little nest egg in case of an emergency. But with those blessings comes more responsibility. This is where the rich man in today’s Gospel parable fails miserably. Wearing finery and having gourmet meals is not a sin, but he does nothing to reach out his hand to aid Lazarus or those in need around him.

From what we know, the Gospel doesn’t say the rich man was rude to Lazarus, or that he scoffed at the poor man. His sin was one of omission. He simply put his blinders on and failed to see. He didn’t send a meal out to him or have someone from his household check on the man. He just left him there to suffer.

LIVE RESPONSIBLY AND SHARE WHAT YOU HAVE

In heaven, Lazarus is raised and freed from his sufferings, while the rich man suffers greatly in the flames of hell. He implores God to send a messenger to his family, but God tells him that since they ignored the messages of Moses and the Prophets, nothing is going to change them, not even someone coming from the dead. Sadly, sometimes we fear and avoid street people because we suspect them of drug abuse, mental illness or, nowadays, carrying the Covid virus. Don’t use that as an excuse to write them off. Write a check to your parish or favorite charity. Make a donation to the food pantry or, better yet, sign up for a shift to work in the food pantry as a family and make it a teachable moment. Pay it forward. Invite someone who is with you to join in your family meal. When you go in to grab a coffee pick up an extra and give it to the first person you see who needs it. Learn the lesson of the parable, and open your eyes and your heart to the needs of others around you.

VIGÉSIMO SEXTO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

25 de septiembre de 2022

Nuestra liturgia de hoy continúa justo donde la dejamos el domingo pasado. Sigue tratándose de tomar decisiones positivas para el bien mayor, y de que no hay lugar para los tibios. El profeta Amós sigue predicando su pesimismo y condena a los complacientes. Pablo insta a Timoteo a una vida completamente opuesta a la de los complacientes de Amós, como un atleta que compite por la fe para “guardar el mandamiento sin mancha ni reproche hasta la aparición de nuestro Señor Jesucristo.” En la parábola de Lucas sobre Lázaro y el hombre rico, vemos a alguien que no está dispuesto a hacer lo correcto hasta que intenta salvarse. Para entonces ya es demasiado tarde para él.

LA BUENA VIDA NO TIENE NADA DE MALO

No hay nada malo en estudiar y trabajar duro, y en acumular estabilidad y riqueza para tu familia. Es algo bueno y positivo tener dinero para la jubilación, las vacaciones o incluso tener un pequeño nido de huevos en caso de emergencia. Pero con esas bendiciones viene más responsabilidad. Aquí es donde el hombre rico de la parábola del Evangelio de hoy fracasa estrepitosamente. Llevar galas y tener comidas gourmet no es un pecado, pero no hace nada para extender su mano para ayudar a Lázaro o a los necesitados de su entorno.

Por lo que sabemos, el Evangelio no dice que el hombre rico fuera grosero con Lázaro, o que se burlara del pobre. Su pecado fue de omisión. Simplemente se puso sus anteojeras y no vio. No le envió una comida ni hizo que alguien de su casa se ocupara del hombre. Simplemente lo dejó allí para que sufriera.

VIVE CON RESPONSABILIDAD Y COMPARTE LO QUE TIENES

En el cielo, Lázaro es resucitado y liberado de sus sufrimientos, aunque el hombre rico sufre mucho en las llamas del infierno. Implora a Dios que envíe un mensajero a su familia, pero Dios le dice que, puesto que han ignorado los mensajes de Moisés y de los profetas, nada va a cambiarles, ni siquiera alguien que venga de entre los muertos. Lamentablemente, a veces tememos y evitamos a la gente de la calle porque sospechamos que son drogadictos, enfermos mentales o, hoy en día, portadores del virus Covid. No uses eso como excusa para descartarlos. Haz un cheque a tu parroquia o a tu organización benéfica favorita. Haz un donativo a la despensa de alimentos o, mejor aún, apúntate a un turno para trabajar en la despensa de alimentos en familia y conviértelo en un momento de enseñanza. Repartan el dinero. Invita a alguien que esté contigo a participar en tu comida familiar. Cuando vayas a tomar un café, coge uno de más y dáselo a la primera persona que veas que lo necesita. Aprende la lección de la parábola y abre tus ojos y tu corazón a las necesidades de los demás a tu alrededor.
