Letter from our Pastor—Carta de nuestro párroco

Dear Friends,

March 13th will be the tenth anniversary of the election of Pope Francis. His teachings and his actions focus on mercy, on the love of God for all, on the importance of reaching out to the poor and disenfranchised. He has felt free to make some unusual choices—such as not living in the papal palace; on Holy Thursday washing the feet of women, prisoners, non-Christians, among other choices. All to a purpose—to get us to realize *our calling*—to bring the Good News to those who need to hear it—to let God's love be made known. Hearing this week's Gospel of Jesus speaking with the Samaritan woman at the well made me think a little of Pope Francis. You could just imagine him doing the same thing. This behavior shocked the disciples of Jesus—they probably thought "what's the teacher doing sitting alone, with this woman, a Samaritan at that, and accepting a drink of water from her?"

Jesus just saw someone who was empty, and yearning to be filled, someone who needed to hear the message of God's love. Jesus saw someone who had been ostracized—and he took the time to talk with her, even though that defied the accepted practices of his day. That conversation leads to her conversion. Both meet at the well because of thirst—but while the woman's thirst may start with water, it really goes much deeper. And Jesus sees that.

Where is Jesus meeting us this Lent? In what unusual place has Jesus chosen to speak with us, to invite us to a change of heart, to quench our thirst?

As we continue our Lenten journey, we need to ask ourselves, where is Jesus sending us? The Samaritan woman does not keep this Good News to herself. Are we being sent by Jesus to bring his message of mercy and forgiveness in a new way this Lent? Are we seeking out opportunities to share the Good News of Jesus with our neighbors, our family, our co-workers? The Samaritan woman is changed by her conversation with Jesus, by his great gift. But she does not keep the gift to herself. She shares it with others! What about you?

Queridos amigos,



El 13 de marzo celebraremos el décimo aniversario de la elección del Papa Francisco. Sus enseñanzas y sus acciones se centran en la misericordia, en el amor de Dios por todos, en la importancia de acercarnos a los pobres y marginados. El Papa ha tomado algunas decisiones inusuales, por ejemplo, no vivir en el palacio papal, el lavarle los pies a mujeres, presos y no cristianos durante el Jueves Santo, y algunas otras más. Todo con un propósito: lograr que nos demos cuenta de nuestro llamado a llevar la Buena Nueva a aquellos que necesitan escucharla, nuestro llamado de dar a conocer el amor de Dios. El Evangelio de esta semana, cuando Jesús se encuentra con la mujer samaritana en el pozo me hizo pensar un poco en el Papa Francisco. Podríamos imaginarnos al Papa haciendo lo mismo. Este comportamiento sorprendió a los discípulos de Jesús; probablemente pensaron "¿qué hace el maestro sentado solo, con esa mujer, una samaritana, y aceptando de ella un trago de agua?"

Jesús simplemente vio a alguien que se sentía vacío y anhelaba ser llenado, alguien que necesitaba escuchar el mensaje del amor de Dios. Jesús vio a alguien que había sido condenado al desprecio, y se tomó el tiempo para hablar con ella, aunque hacer eso desafía las prácticas aceptadas de su época. Esta conversación con Jesús condujo a la conversión de la samaritana. Ambos van al pozo sedientos, pero aunque la sed de la mujer es inicialmente solo de agua, en realidad su sed es mucho más profunda. Y Jesús se da cuenta de eso. ¿En dónde nos encontramos con Jesús en esta Cuaresma? ¿Qué lugar insólito ha escogido Jesús para hablar con nosotros, para invitarnos a un cambio de corazón, para saciar nuestra sed?

A medida que continuamos nuestra jornada cuaresmal, debemos preguntarnos, ¿adónde nos envía Jesús? La mujer samaritana no se reserva esta Buena Nueva para sí misma. ¿Estamos nosotros siendo enviados por Jesús para llevar su mensaje de misericordia y de perdón de una manera distinta en esta Cuaresma? ¿Estamos buscando oportunidades para compartir la Buena Nueva de Jesús con nuestros vecinos, nuestra familia, nuestros compañeros de trabajo? La mujer samaritana es transformada por su encuentro con Jesús, por el gran don que Él le da. Pero ella no se guarda ese don solo para ella. ¡Ella lo comparte con otros! ¿Y usted, hace lo mismo?

St. Patrick was a 5th century missionary to Ireland who later served as bishop there. He is one of the patron saints of Ireland. He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing his message. He was a humble, pious, gentle man, whose love and total devotion to and trust in God should be a shining example to each of us. So complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission, he feared nothing -not even death. We invite all to pray the "Breastplate," St Patrick's poem of faith and trust in God:

***Christ be within me, Christ behind me,
Christ before me, Christ beside me,
Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me,
Christ beneath me, Christ above me,
Christ in quiet, Christ in danger,
Christ in the hearts of all that love me,
Christ in mouth of friend and stranger." Amen.***

We know that **St. Joseph** was a compassionate, caring man who loved Jesus and Mary. We also know that Joseph respected God and followed his commands. He is the patron saint of the Universal Church, of families, fathers and expectant mothers, travelers, immigrants, engineers, craftsmen, and working people in general.

We pray for all fathers, that through the example of St. Joseph, they may fully embrace their vocation and accept the privilege and responsibility of caring for their children as St. Joseph cared for Jesus. THIRD SUNDAY OF Lent

MARCH 12, 2023

THIRST

There is thirst, as we feel when we need a glass of water, and then there is the sort of thirst about which Jesus speaks with the Samaritan woman at the well. The conversation started on the level of the sort of thirst that is quenched by a soothing drink. Yet, the conversation between Jesus and the woman quickly became about a deeper sort of thirst, the yearning for spiritual nourishment. The Israelites fussed about being thirsty, yet their thirst also had a spiritual dimension. Was the Lord with them or not, they wondered? On this Third Sunday of Lent, the elect participate in the first of three scrutinies as they prepare for the living waters of baptism. We share their thirst and open our hearts to the living water that Jesus offers, the water of life, hope, and peace.

ARE YOU THIRSTY?

Do you feel unsettled or sense that life is about more than the daily details that fill your time, energy, and attention? Are you anxious or worried and yearn for peace? Is there an ache in your heart that longs for relief? The thirst for meaning, purpose, peace, and solace is real. We humans have a tendency to seek relief from such thirst with wealth, material things, or social status, failing to recognize that these things are fleeting. We may distract ourselves with constant activity, keeping ourselves busy and preoccupied rather than allowing ourselves to acknowledge the yearning in our hearts. We fail to see that only Christ can quench our thirst.

LET JESUS QUENCH YOUR THIRST

It was likely hot in the midday sun on the day that Jesus encountered the woman at the well. Scholars tell us that she must have been shunned by the other women in the community, leading her to avoid the cooler early morning time when others filled their jugs. Add to this that Jews and Samaritans shared longstanding animosity toward one another. No wonder she was surprised and perplexed when Jesus asked for a drink. Yet she did not run away. Jesus sought her out and she opened her heart and mind to his offer of salvation. Jesus seeks us out, too. Our Lord desires that we open our hearts and minds to the fullness of love, forgiveness, mercy, and peace that is only found in God. For what do you thirst at this time? Compassion, justice, consolation? Only Christ can truly quench your thirst. Jesus desires to do so. Open your heart today; "hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Romans 5:5).

SED

Hay sed, como la que sentimos cuando necesitamos un vaso de agua, y luego está el tipo de sed sobre la que Jesús habla con la mujer samaritana en el pozo. La conversación comenzó con el tipo de sed que se sacia con una bebida calmante. Sin embargo, la conversación entre Jesús y la mujer pronto se convirtió en un tipo de sed más profunda, el anhelo de alimento espiritual. Los israelitas se quejaban de tener sed, pero su sed tenía también una dimensión espiritual. ¿Se preguntaban si el Señor estaba con ellos o no? En este Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma, los elegidos participan en el primero de los tres escrutinios mientras se preparan para las aguas vivas del Bautismo. Compartimos su sed y abrimos nuestros corazones al agua viva que ofrece Jesús, el agua de la vida, la esperanza y la paz.

ESCUCHAR DURANTE EL VIAJE

¿Te sientes inquieto o tienes la sensación de que la vida es algo más que los detalles cotidianos que llenan tu tiempo, tu energía y tu atención? ¿Estás ansioso o preocupado y anhelas la paz? ¿Tienes un dolor en el corazón que anhela aliviarse? La sed de sentido, propósito, paz y consuelo es real. Los seres humanos tenemos tendencia a buscar alivio a esa sed con riqueza, cosas materiales o estatus social, sin reconocer que esas cosas son efímeras. Podemos distraernos con una actividad constante, manteniéndonos ocupados y preocupados en lugar de permitirnos reconocer el anhelo de nuestros corazones. No vemos que sólo Cristo puede saciar nuestra sed.

DEJA QUE JESÚS CALME TU SED

El día en que Jesús encontró a la mujer en el pozo, probablemente hacía calor bajo el sol del mediodía. Los eruditos nos dicen que debió de ser rechazada por las demás mujeres de la comunidad, lo que la llevó a evitar la hora más fresca de la madrugada, cuando los demás llenaban sus cántaros. Añádase a esto que judíos y samaritanos se tenían animosidad mutua desde hacía mucho tiempo. No es de extrañar que se quedara sorprendida y perpleja cuando Jesús le pidió de beber. Sin embargo, no huyó. Jesús la buscó y ella abrió su corazón y su mente a su oferta de salvación. Jesús también nos busca a nosotros. Nuestro Señor desea que abramos nuestros corazones y nuestras mentes a la plenitud del amor, el perdón, la misericordia y la paz que sólo se encuentran en Dios. ¿De qué tienes sed en este momento? ¿De compasión, de justicia, de consuelo? Sólo Cristo puede saciar verdaderamente tu sed. Jesús desea hacerlo. Abre hoy tu corazón; "la esperanza no defrauda, porque el amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones por el Espíritu Santo que nos ha sido dado."


