## ***Letter from our Pastor—Carta de nuestro párroco***

Dear Friends,

You know, one of the excuses some people give for not going to church on Sundays—they say that they know many regular churchgoers who are hypocrites, acting holy on Sunday, but not treating anyone with kindness on Monday. I'm not so sure. My experience is more that most of us at church on Sundays are there because we see our need to grow in holiness, we know too well our sins and imperfections. We come for healing, we come for guidance. We come that we might see.

Today's Gospel account of the healing of the man born blind speaks of both physical and spiritual blindness—and it is the spiritual healing that is the greater challenge. The blind man's physical healing takes place in a few verses—his spiritual vision is only 20/20 by the end of an entire chapter! In contrast, the Pharisees, who claim to see, are so blind to the power of God at work in Jesus, so full of self-righteousness and so quick to condemn.

Our faith reminds us to avoid arrogance, harsh judgment and ready condemnations. We are invited to remember God's first action in the story of creation, as he declares "let there be light," as we open ourselves to the light of his truth, mercy and forgiveness. We are invited to come to Jesus so he can heal our blindness and lead us to his light.

La curación física del ciego se lleva a cabo en unos pocos versículos: ¡su visión espiritual se recupera completamente solo al final del capítulo completo! En contraste, los fariseos, que afirman ver, están tan ciegos al poder de Dios obrando en Jesús, tan llenos de soberbia y son muy rápidos para condenar.

Nuestra fe nos recuerda que evitemos la arrogancia, el juicio severo y las condenaciones prontas al prójimo. Estamos invitados a recordar la primera acción de Dios en la historia de la creación, cuando declara "hágase la luz". Estamos llamados a abrirnos a ver la luz de su verdad, misericordia y perdón. Estamos invitados a venir a Jesús para que Él pueda sanar nuestra ceguera y guiarnos a su luz.

## 10 Things to Remember For Lent

As our journey to the foot of the Cross continues, use this list to see how your Lenten Journey is going:

1. **Remember the formula.** The Church does a good job capturing certain truths with easy-to-remember lists and formulas: 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season.
2. **It's a time of prayer.** Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.
3. **It's a time to fast.** With the fasts of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast. And maybe that's why it gets all the attention. "What are you giving up for Lent? Hotdogs? Beer? Jelly beans?" It's almost a game for some, but fasting is a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.
4. **It's a time to work on discipline.** The 40 days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. "I'm going to exercise more. I'm going to pray more. I'm going to be nicer to my family, friends and coworkers."
5. **It's about dying to yourself.** The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control – it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.
6. **Don't do too much.** It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.
7. **Lent reminds us of our weakness.** Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.
8. **Be patient with yourself.** When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. "What a bad person I am!" But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.
9. **Reach out in charity.** As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection basket; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.
10. **Learn to love like Christ.** Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.

## 10 cosas para recordar durante la Cuaresma

A medida que continúa nuestra jornada hacia el pie de la Cruz, use esta lista para ver cómo va Cuaresma:

1. **Recuerda la fórmula.** La Iglesia captura ciertas verdades con listas y fórmulas fáciles de recordar: 10 Mandamientos, 7 sacramentos, 3 personas en la Trinidad. Para la Cuaresma, la Iglesia nos da: oración, ayuno y limosna, como las tres cosas en las que debemos trabajar durante la temporada.
2. **Es un tiempo de oración.** La Cuaresma es esencialmente un acto de oración que se extiende a lo largo de 40 días. Mientras oramos, emprendemos un viaje que, con suerte, nos acerca a Cristo y nos deja transformados por el encuentro con él.
3. **Es tiempo de ayunar.** Con los ayunos del Miércoles de Ceniza y Viernes Santo, los viernes sin carne y nuestras disciplinas personales intercaladas, la Cuaresma es un momento en que muchos católicos realmente hacen ayuno. Y tal vez por eso llama tanto la atención. “¿De qué te abstienes esta Cuaresma? ¿Panito dulce? ¿Cervezas? ¿Dulces y caramelos?” Es casi un juego para algunos, pero el ayuno es una forma de penitencia que nos ayuda a alejarnos del pecado y acercarnos a Cristo.
4. **Es un momento para tener más disciplina.** Los 40 días de Cuaresma son también un buen momento para trabajar en la disciplina. En lugar de abstenerse de algo, pueden ser hacer algo positivo. "Voy a hacer más ejercicio. Voy a orar más. Voy a ser más amable con mi familia, amigos y compañeros de trabajo".
5. **Se trata de morir a uno mismo.** El aspecto más serio de la disciplina Cuaresmal es tener más auto-control: se trata de encontrar aspectos de uno mismo que no imitan a Cristo y dejarlos morir. El sufrimiento y la muerte de Cristo son lo más importante en nuestras mentes y corazones durante la Cuaresma, y nos unimos a estos misterios. sufriendo, muriendo con Cristo y resucitando en forma purificada.
6. **No trate de hacer mucho a la vez.** Existe la tentación de hacer de la Cuaresma un período ambicioso de reinvenión personal, pero es mejor mantenerlo simple y enfocado. Hay una razón por la cual la Iglesia trabaja en estos misterios año tras año. Pasamos toda nuestra vida tratando de acercarnos a Dios. No intentes lograrlo todo en una sola Cuaresma. Esa es una receta para el fracaso.
7. **La Cuaresma nos recuerda nuestras debilidades.** Incluso cuando nos fijamos metas simples durante la Cuaresma, aún así tenemos problemas para cumplirlas. Cuando ayunamos sin espíritu de sacrificio, solo pensamos que estamos a tan solo una comida de ya no tener hambre. La Cuaresma nos muestra cuan débil puede ser nuestra voluntad. Esto no es fácil de aceptar, pero reconocer cuán indefensos somos nos hace buscar la ayuda de Dios con renovada urgencia y sinceridad.
8. **Sea paciente con usted mismo.** Cuando nos enfrentamos a nuestra propia debilidad durante la Cuaresma, la tentación es enojarnos y frustrarnos. “¡Qué mala persona soy!” Pero esa es la lección equivocada. Dios nos está llamando a ser pacientes y a vernos como él lo hace, con amor incondicional.
9. **Acérquese a la caridad.** A medida que experimentamos debilidad y sufrimiento durante la Cuaresma, debemos renovar nuestra compasión por aquellos que tienen hambre, sufrimiento o necesidad. La tercera parte de la fórmula de Cuaresma es la limosna. Se trata de algo más que tirar unos cuantos dólares extra en la cesta de la colecta; se trata de llegar a los demás y ayudarlos sin dudas, con amor y compasión, como una forma de compartir la experiencia del amor incondicional de Dios.
10. **Aprenda a amar como Cristo nos ama.** Dar de nosotros mismos en medio de nuestro sufrimiento y abnegación nos ayuda a amar como Cristo ama. El, sufrió y se entregó incondicionalmente en la cruz por todos nosotros. La Cuaresma es una jornada por el desierto hasta el pie de la cruz el Viernes Santo, mientras buscamos al Cristo crucificado, le pedimos ayuda, nos unimos a su sufrimiento y aprendemos a amar como él ama, incondicionalmente, hasta dar la vida por aquellos a quien El ama.
