Diocesan Protocols In Place At Church And Parish Office

Following the diocesan protocols during the current pandemic can sometimes seem overwhelming as parishioners—not only in the Diocese of Reno but throughout the nation and the world—adapt to the mandates of their government officials and church leaders. However, the requirements are a small sacrifice in order to protect our fellow human beings and ourselves from contracting the coronavirus and experiencing its deleterious effects

Information on Public Masses and **Reconciliation/Adoration:**

Public Masses during the weekend and on Wednesday and Friday at St. Patrick's resumed in early June after being shut down for more than two months. Reconciliation and Adoration on Thursday afternoons also started up again although St. Pat's pastor, Father Tony, hears confession in a new location: the old offices on the east side of the church building and adjacent to the Rose Room. This area was adapted with a specially constructed door installed between the penitent and priest to allow for communication but also keep them both protected.

Parishioners are reminded that, when they attend Mass, they are required to enter information on a "sign in" list so that, should one or more of the attendees contract the virus, contact tracing can take place to notify others who were present at the Mass of the situation. Self-quarantine may then be necessary. Hand sanitizers are readily available to use once a person has used the pen to sign in.

In addition, facial coverings or masks and social distancing are mandatory while attending Mass. The

parish can provide a mask if an individual comes to the church without one. Every other pew in the sanctuary is blocked, and chairs in the Rose Room spaced at six or more feet from each other, to assist parishioners in maintaining social distancing.

A maximum of 50 individuals at each Mass is allowed entrance to the church.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, Bishop Calvo has granted a dispensation from the obligation of Sunday Mass in the Diocese of Reno to anyone who should not attend Mass for health reasons or who do not feel safe in coming to the church. This dispensation continues until further notice. The Diocese of Reno hosts a Catholic Mass on KOLO TV, Channel 8, on Sunday at 9 a.m. EWTN also provides several opportunities on Sunday to view a Catholic Mass.

Gratitude for the Volunteers:

We are grateful to the volunteers who greet parishioners at the beginning of Mass and ensure they sign in and are wearing masks, and also the volunteers who, using a fogger, sanitize the church, its pews, and the Rose Room—including door knobs or handles—after each service. If you would like to volunteer as a greeter, or someone to help sanitize the church and Rose Room (the effort takes about 15-20 minutes once the simple process is learned), call the parish office at 423-2846. More volunteers would allow for greater flexibility in scheduling among all.

Parish Office Closure:

The parish office remains closed during the pandemic until instructions come from Bishop Calvo of the Dio-

cese of Reno to re-open to the public. However, the staff continues to work within its confines and according to the normal work schedule. Parishioners can call the parish office at 423-2846 to conduct business or to let the staff know if they have a pressing need to stop by and be allowed access. Visitors must wear facial coverings, or masks, upon entering and during their visit, observe social distancing, and sign a Visitor's Log at the front counter for contact tracing purposes.

Ministry Activities:

Basically, St. Patrick's ministries or activities are suspended until such time as Bishop Calvo indicates they can become operational. Parishioners are asked to periodically check the parish website located at www.stpatricksparish.org for updates on the resumption of ministries or activities and for messages or notices from the bishop or St. Pat's pastor. The church bulletin under "News and Events") as well as the monthly parish newsletter (on the home page) are also posted on the parish website.

Adults of all education levels are invited to enroll in the third year of CBS. Participants will

learn how to interpret the Bible in accordance with the teachings of the Catholic church and in light of modern Biblical scholarship.

The focus of this year's CBS is "Exile and Restoration: Prophets, Lamentations, Ruth, Song of Songs, Psalms."

CBS will meet on Thurs., beginning Sept. 10, from 6-8 p.m., at three different sites: Our Lady of Sorrows in Reno, St. Robert Bellarmine in Fernley, and St. Joseph's in Elko.

Although a four-year program, individuals may attend any year or all four years.

Brochures and registration forms can be downloaded at the diocesan website at renodiocese.org under Our Works, followed by the Lay Ministry tab. Interested persons may also contact Dr. Lauri Anne Reinhart at laurianner@catholicreno.org for a brochure and registration form to be mailed to them. A book list to cover the upcoming instructional year is also available on the diocesan website.

Registration forms should be completed and submitted to the Diocese of Reno by Mon., August 24, so that the number of enrollees at each instructional site may be determined.

Because this is a college-level class, and whether taking it for credit or audit, the annual cost is \$550 each plus books. Full tuition must be paid by Sept. 19.
