"He will come again to judge the living and the dead..."

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that "Christ is Lord of eternal life. Full right to pass definitive judgment on the works and hearts of men belongs to Him as Redeemer of the world" (CCC 679).

As we reflect upon the Last Things (Heaven, Hell, Purgatory and Judgment) in this last month of the Church's liturgical year, it is both beneficial and sobering to reflect upon the Last Judgment. We will all stand before the judgment seat of God where Christ who knows the deepest dispositions of our hearts will render to each man according to his works and according to his acceptance or refusal of grace (CCC 682). That judgment has eternal consequences.

There's a story that during the Civil War a young Confederate soldier was brought up on charges before General Robert E. Lee. The young man was nervous, afraid and shaking. Lee said to him, "Soldier, you need not be nervous, you will get justice here." The young man replied, "General, that's what I'm afraid of."

If justice were the sole criterion when we stand before Jesus in judgment, we too should be full of fear and dread because we are all sinners. But if we have faith, if we have repented of our sins, have striven to amend our lives through prayer, penance and charity and have been merciful to others, justice will not be the sole element of our judgment. Mercy, shown most perfectly in Christ's redeeming death on the Cross, will give us hope. For "the Son did not come to judge, but to save and to give the life He has in Himself. (CCC 679). Aware of God's mercy, we should live in hope. But hope is not presumption. Presumption can take the form of relying on oneself without God's help, or casually presuming on God's mercy without repentance, conversion and the amendment of life.

Our first reading this weekend warns, "Lo, the day is coming..." (Malachi 3:19). Let us be prepared, for we know not the day nor the hour (Mt 25:13). Let us remember God's judgment, examine our lives, repent of our sins, confess them and amend our ways that we may grow in holiness and closeness to God. If we do, the day that comes, "blazing like an oven" when "all the proud and evildoers will be stubble" will bring not terror, condemnation and dread but "the sun of justice with it's healing rays" (Malachi 3:19-20).
