REFLECTION

“I Am The Good Shepherd”

On this Sunday, traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday, the readings offer us a magnificent meditation on salvation. The description of Jesus as shepherd falls into two distant yet related sections, each introduced by the self-proclamation “I am the Good Shepherd”.

The first section depicts Jesus as a conscientious shepherd who is willing to protect his flock even to the point of risking his own life for them.

The second section shows Jesus, the shepherd as intimately related to God. Jesus states that he has a mutual, intimate relationship with his sheep. He goes on to say that this relationship is based on the mutual, intimate relationship that he has with God. Jesus is willing to care for and die for other sheep, who though they are not yet included in his flock, are also his. Jesus is saying that there are other sheep that will recognize him and will then be brought into his flock. In the end there will be one flock and one shepherd. This shepherd continues his work in the world, calling those lost to come together to form one flock led by one pastor, in whose presence they can find rest and life.

We thank the following parishioners and Building Board members who attended the meeting with the Bishop and the Diocesan Building Board on Wednesday, April 18: Daniel Beyer, Roy Drabek, Boyce Etlinger, Gussie Machalac, Danny Rother, Ben Wenske and Mark Zimmerman. The Board reaffirmed its approval of the project. The contractor (Diamond J Buildings) will continue to update the Board on the progress of the project.

The construction is progressing steadily. This week 71 piers 10-15' deep with 48" bell bottoms were dug. The auction building slab and the auctioneer platform has been poured together with the piers. Phase one of the electrical work has been done and the plumbing has been completed. Next week we look forward to pouring the cement for the main building and open pavilion areas.
