REFLECTION

Jesus

The Shepherd to Emulate

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally *Good Shepherd Sunday*, but John 10:1-10 refers to Jesus as the gate as much as the shepherd. The claim of Jesus to be both the gate and the good shepherd of God's people follows immediately upon a rather heated exchange between Jesus and some of the Pharisees. The Pharisees are represented as the strangers to whom the sheep will not listen because they do not care for the sheep as Jesus does. While the Pharisees were content to criticize and condemn, Jesus had compassion, called sinners to forgiveness and healed both body and spirit. Jesus through his fresh interpretation of the law, opened the gate then enabled sinners to come home to God. Eventually, Jesus laid down his life for his sheep.

If this is the manner in which Jesus exercised his mission, then we, his disciples are to do likewise. Being a gate means offering witness that lights the path and eases the journey of others. Being a gate as Jesus was, involves a willingness to lay down our lives and spend ourselves in service for the sake of others. Such is the daily challenge of those called disciples of Jesus.

Communiqué from St. Joseph's, Moulton and St. Mary's, Praha Parish Office – April 28, 2020

In the light of Governor Abbott's press conference on Monday, concerning the Corona Virus and the loosening of restrictions in Texas, Bishop Cahill has come out with new directives for the celebration of Masses in the Diocese of Victoria, beginning May 1st.

Bishop Cahill's new directives concerning the celebration of Mass with a congregation on Sundays beginning May 1st were discussed with a group of parishioners from Moulton and Praha Churches. The following decisions were made:

1. Mass will be on demand on our Facebook page and website as usual at 9:00 a.m. from either Moulton or Praha Church on Sundays until further notice for all those who for some reason cannot participate in person at Mass.
2. Mass will be celebrated under the pavilion at the Social Center at 9:00 a.m. this Sunday in Moulton. Next Sunday's Mass will be celebrated under the auction pavilion in Praha. Parishioners from Moulton and Praha may participate in the Mass of their choice. Social distancing protocol will be observed. Parishioners are encouraged to follow the safety guidelines proposed by our state and local officials.

In addition:

1. The Church Bulletin will be mailed weekly to parishioners as in the past. Extra bulletins will be available in the Church.
2. Morning Mass will be celebrated in Moulton on Wednesdays and on Fridays at 8:00 a.m. in the Family Room. On Thursdays, Mass will be celebrated at Praha Church at 5:30 p.m. Social distancing protocol will be followed.
3. For any pastoral needs feel free to contact the Parish Office.

Your support and prayers at these challenging times are greatly appreciated. Hopefully soon, all of us will be able to come together to celebrate the Eucharist.
