#### From the Pastor's Desk

"Observe what is right, do what is just, for my salvation is about to come, my justice, about to be revealed." (Is 56:1).



Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thank you to all who participated in 40 Hours this past week and spent time with our Lord in adoration, allowing His transformative grace to work in your life. Remember that there is perpetual adoration offered in Lafayette at St. Francis Chapel at 1501 Hartford Street, Lafayette, IN. They would like to have more than one adorer at each of the hours, and there are currently 43 hours, of the 168 hours each week, that have only one adorer. Many of those hours are in the middle of the night. I invite you to sign up and commit to an hour of adoration each week, and you may do so by going to <a href="https://adorationpro.org/lafayettein">https://adorationpro.org/lafayettein</a>. If you have any questions, feel free to email <a href="mailto:adorationlafayette@gmail.com">adorationlafayette@gmail.com</a>. That is a beautiful chapel to go and pray, and spend time with Jesus.

As the school year begins, we can easily get caught up in being busy and running from task to task, especially if you slept through your morning alarm. However, we want to offer our work to God, and praying before such activities help us to do so. Perhaps Jesus is asking you this question, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Lk 18:8). To assist with this, I offer a morning offering prayer that was said by St. Therese of Lisieux, who said that it is not necessary to do great or heroic deeds to attain holiness, but rather to do the little things in life with love for God and others.

O my God! I offer You all my actions of this day for the intentions and for the glory of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. I desire to sanctify every beat of my heart, my every thought, my simplest works, by uniting them to Its infinite merits; and I wish to make reparation for my sins by casting them into the furnace of Its Merciful Love.

O my God! I ask You for myself and for those whom I hold dear, the grace to fulfill perfectly Your Holy Will, to accept for love of You the joys and sorrows of this passing life, so that we may one day be united together in Heaven for all Eternity. Amen.

I find this prayer to a beautiful way to direct oneself in the beginning of the day. As one goes about the day, it is easy to forget how one started and begin to go different directions. That is where simple prayers throughout the day can help you stay spiritually aligned with God. Jesus says we are to always pray, and don't let the excuse of not living in a convent to keep you from prayer. Pope Francis gives, in his Angelus from 16 October, 2022, a good reminder about making aspirations throughout the day. An aspiration is a short, easily memorized prayer that can be said throughout the day. Pope Francis recommends:

"For example, as soon as we awaken, we can say: "Lord, I thank you and I offer this day to you". This is a short prayer. Then, before an activity, we can repeat, "Come, Holy Spirit". Between one thing and another, we can pray thus, "Jesus, I trust in you. Jesus, I love you". Really short prayers that help us stay in contact with the Lord. How often we send text messages to the people we love! Let us do this with the Lord as well so that our hearts remain connected to him."

May our days be filled with regular conversation with the one whom your heart desires!

#### **Parishioners Reflect on the Eucharist**

As part of our Pastorate celebration of the National Eucharistic Revival, we will occasionally have parishioners from the Pastorate share their thoughts on what the Eucharist means to them.

#### A Eucharistic Reflection

I have been a Catholic for nearly half of my life. Years ago, during my instruction and formation I learned what all Catholics are taught. That Jesus is fully present in the Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. That the Eucharist is not merely a symbol of Christ. It is Christ. I believed all these things, even if I didn't fully understand them. But over time I have come to a deeper understanding of the meaning of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and what it means to receive Him, the very gift of HIMSELF.

A bit of reading and study of the gospels opens up Jesus' own words to us and opens us to their meaning. The time I spend "in the Word," as one friends calls it, has helped me begin to understand Jesus' desire for a relationship with me. The deepest, most profound kind of relationship—a covenant. A traditional covenant is an exchange of goods between two parties. The marriage covenant is an exchange of persons. The husband and wife give themselves to each other. Likewise, the New Covenant ushered in by Jesus is an exchange of persons.

Jesus tells us at the Last Supper that his own blood seals the New Covenant between God and us. Between God and us his people, yes, but also between God and ME. Between God and YOU. It's that personal! And how does he give himself to us but in the bread and wine of the Eucharist. "This is my body.... This is my blood," Jesus clearly states in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In the Gospel of John, he tells us his flesh is "true food" and "the bread of life" offered to us. In the Eucharist Jesus gives me his entire self. So, by covenant I must give myself to Jesus. It's not easy, but the nourishment of the Eucharist—Christ's whole self—strengthens me to at least try to give my whole self to him, if only one step at a time, one day at a time.

Understanding and accepting the truth of Jesus' Real Presence in the Eucharist might take a bit of effort on the part of the believer. Jesus' own disciples asked him to increase their faith so they might better understand and believe the truth he was giving to them. Turn to the four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) daily. Listen to Christ's own words to you. Be fed and receive HIM!


