

### A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

### His "Amazing Grace"



John Newton, the author of <u>Amazing Grace</u>, lived a life marked by rebellion and sin before discovering God's love and his Christian faith. Born in 1725 in London, Newton was a sailor whose early years were defined by disobedience, the slave-trade, and blasphemous profanity. Because of deserting his post, he wound up forced onto a slave ship. While aboard, a violent storm off of Ireland changed everything in his life. As the ship nearly sank, Newton, fearing death, cried out, "Lord, have mercy upon us!" Newton's life was saved, and as a result, Newton began to recognize his own sinfulness and his need for God's mercy.

His conversion wasn't instantaneous, but rather it was a step-by-step journey. The storm he survived had planted a seed. He realized God's love didn't demand perfection all at once. Instead, he began the long road of humility. Coming before God as a broken man, Newton found grace that "saved a wretch like me."

He wrote the words to the hymn that made him famous. In it, he reveals the truth of his life: God's love meets us in our sin, requiring only a humble heart to receive it. Newton's life teaches us that no sin is too great for God's redeeming grace. We are all sinners like the tax collector and the Pharisee. All of us are saved by "Amazing Grace".

One thing Sacred Scripture reveals is those who recognize their need for God will get God. Why was the tax collector's prayer better than the Pharisee's prayer? Because the tax collector actually made a connection with God, but the Pharisee only made a connection with himself. Tax collectors were despised by the Jewish community in Palestine. They were Jews who collaborated with the occupying Roman forces by collecting taxes from fellow Jews. They often collected more than the law required, pocketing the extra. The Pharisees were just the opposite. They were the most respected members of the Jewish community, the elite, the undisputed religious leaders of the nation.

And yet, Jesus praises the tax collector's prayer and criticizes the Pharisee's prayer. Through the centuries, in fact, the tax collector's simple prayer, "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner," has been taken up as a complete summary of Christian spirituality. There are even cases of monks who made this prayer the only words that they spoke and reached heights of sanctity by means of it.

This prayer makes a connection with God because it recognizes two things. **First**, it acknowledges God's greatest quality in relation to fallen mankind, His mercy. The word "mercy" comes from the Latin "misericors: miser (wretched, miserable) + cor (heart)". Literally, it means to take someone else's wretchedness into one's heart. That's what God does with us.

**Second**, the tax collector's prayer recognizes his need for that mercy. He accuses himself of being a sinner, someone who has selfishly abused God's gifts and used instead of loved his neighbor. Whereas the Pharisee's prayer shows no knowledge either of God's mercy or of his need for God; rather, it is an exercise in narcissism, in self-admiration.

God wants to connect with us, but He can only do so if we let Him, and we can't let Him if we don't think we need Him.

This week, let us begin by connecting with Jesus, humbly acknowledging our need for His mercy and accepting it.

### A Message from Fr. Matthew and Rachel Witt

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

In our Gospel this Sunday, our Lord speaks on the centrality and importance of the virtue of humility. After illustrating the importance of humility through the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector, our Lord says, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Luke 18:14)



Indeed, no virtue might be more challenging to inculcate within our souls than that of humility. The constant tendency of our fallen human nature is to go toward pride instead of humility, following the path of our first parents—Adam and Eve—instead of the humble and Sacred Heart of our Lord. In an overly individualist society, where self-assertion and self-reliance are so encouraged, it can be even more challenging to see the value and necessity of humility.

One potential method to increase humility within our hearts is to pray the Litany of Humility. This litany is usually attributed to Cardinal Rafael Merry del Val, who was the Vatican Secretary of State from 1903-1914 and then the head of the Holy Office (now called the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith until his death in 1930. Even if Cardinal Merry del Val didn't write the litany, there is good evidence that he prayed it every day. Though he held high office within the Church, he constantly tried to cultivate humility within his own heart and did so through the powerful words of this prayer.

The litany concludes with these words: That, in the opinion of the world, others may increase and I may decrease...that others may be chosen and I set aside...that others may be praised and I unnoticed...that others may be preferred to me in everything...that others may become holier than I, provided that I may become as holy as I should...Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it.

These are challenging words, but they drive home the point that humble union with our Lord is better than any honors the world can give. Perhaps pray this litany today or this week and ask for an increase in that great virtue of humility.

### A note from Rachel Witt, Director of Operations 🕳

Last week I gave a '9 month' review of our progress on Financial Reporting, Accounting and Administration. This week begins a review of our progress on facilities projects. I'll start this week with basic background information to give a little bit of context to the details as well as a facility update on the Cathedral Campus.

## Both St. Mary and St. Ann have Facilities Committees, consisting of members from each parish with unique professional experience in building and/or trades.

The purpose of the Facility Committees is to:

"Assist the pastor in the review of the current building facilities on an ongoing basis, plan for repairs, renovation, maintenance, accessibility, safety and space planning needs and make recommendations to the pastor (for facilities work)."

Many years ago, St. Mary Cathedral initiated a long-range plan for acquisition of property on the block immediately west of the Cathedral as it became available. Those visionary leaders of the parish saw a need to plan for future growth and neighborhood stabilization. A new acquisition was completed last month for the two properties on the far west boundary of the block; The office building occupied by a local CPA and the multi-unit residential structure that was destroyed by an arson fire last year. As part of the acquisition, we (re)assessed the structures on the block. The office building is of acceptable use, is rented and occupied by its previous owner and will remain; The remaining three structures have been scheduled for demolition. They are a significant liability for trespass, further fire damage, and personal injury. The burned-out building and 'carriage house' do not have any salvageable components. We have been working with local historical association representatives to remove any salvageable features from the structure on the corner of 11<sup>th</sup> and South St. All three structures will be fully demolished and returned to green space to best prepare them for any future plans as determined through a Master Planning process. In the coming weeks, you may notice heavy equipment and closure of portions of the neighboring parking lot closed while this work is being done. Thank you for your understanding!





#### Hymn Reflection: "God, We Praise You"

Text: St. Nicetas of Remesiana (ca. 335–414), tr. Christopher Idle Tune: NETTLETON ("Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing")

I was writing and reflecting on this hymn, and outside my window, there is this maple tree with the gorgeous orange, red, gold color of its leaves in the crisp autumn air. I witness the changing hue and color as the temperature shifts—beautiful autumn—so different from Helena, Montana. In moments like this, I'm reminded to slow down, to observe and appreciate the very small things around me. Nature's quiet transformation invites us into praise, just as the hymn, "God, We Praise You", invites our hearts to join into sing and give praise to God.

This hymn, drawn from the ancient *Te Deum Laudamus* ("Thee, O God, we praise"), was written by **St. Nicetas of Remesiana** in the fourth century and translated by **Christopher Idle**. Its words gather the voices of angels, apostles, prophets, martyrs, and all believers into one universal hymn of adoration. When we sing it, we are part of that same timeless chorus, joining heaven and earth in proclaiming God's glory.

Set to the beloved tune **NETTLETON**, familiar from "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing", the text takes on a tender warmth. The melody's simplicity allows the grandeur of the words to shine: God's holiness, Christ's victory, and the Church's eternal hope. It moves from majestic praise—"God, we praise You! God, we bless You!"—to humble prayer—"Save Your people, Lord, we pray."

As the maple leaves outside turn red and gold, I am reminded that creation itself echoes this hymn—constantly changing, yet always pointing back to the Creator. "God, We Praise You" invites us to lift our gaze from the small beauties of the world to the eternal beauty of God, whose glory shines through all seasons and whose love endures forever.

Let us raise our voice, "God, We Praise You."
