Saint of the Week

Saint Charles Borromeo
1538 - 1584

Patron Saint of bishops, seminarians, and catechists

Charles Borromeo was an Italian Archbishop and important leader and reformer of the Catholic Church during the Protestant Reformation.

At a very young age, he was committed to a life of service to the Church, particularly the poor. At the age of 25, he was ordained a priest and appointed Archbishop by his uncle, Pope Pius IV, a year later. His mission as Archbishop was to work to educate the clergy in the midst of the spreading Protestant Reformation and its doctrinal errors. He founded schools, seminaries, and colleges for them, but never lost sight of the needs of the poor. When a famine broke out in Milan, followed by the plague, many of the wealthy and powerful fled the city. Charles remained in the city and used his own money to feed starving people. Eventually, Archbishop Borromeo's life work took its toll and he died at the young age of 46.

November: On Death & Purgatory, praying for All of the Faithful Departed, (All Souls!)



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Yesterday, All Saints' Day, we praised God for His masterpieces: the saints, those Christians who reached spiritual maturity in this life, and so entered heaven immediately after death.

Today the world's one billion Catholics are joining together to pray for the eternal repose of our many brothers and sisters who died in friendship with Christ, but who hadn't yet reached spiritual maturity. Instead of entering heaven immediately, these souls were taken by God to the spiritual hospital called purgatory. Purgatory is where God lovingly purifies and heals His children from the damage their sins inflicted on their souls while they were still on earth. Through prayer and the Mass, we are speeding up that painful process and hastening our departed brothers' and sisters' full entrance into heaven. During my many years of priestly ministry, I have come to understand that many Catholics don't like to pray for their departed loved ones. It can be painful to think of them, either because we feel their loss so sharply, or because it reminds us of the uncomfortable reality of our own death, which isn't too far away.

But the Church is a good mother, and she knows that it is a good thing to think of and pray for the dead, so she gives us All Souls' Day. It helps us cut through life's superficial distractions and reminds us of the big picture, which includes life, of course, but which also includes death, judgment, heaven, and hell [the four last things]. All Christians believe in those four realities, which Christ himself taught us about. But not all Christians believe in purgatory and the value of praying for the dead, of which Jesus also taught.

The first reason backing up the doctrine of purgatory and praying for the dead is simple common sense. We all know there is no selfishness in heaven. It simply can't exist there, because God is pure love, pure unselfishness. But we also know that not all of us, not even all good Christians, die completely freed of selfishness and selfish tendencies. Therefore, when we keep our friendship with Christ alive in this life without really giving it top priority, we allow sinful and selfish habits to grow in our souls like weeds in a garden. In that case, after we die, God has to pull out the weeds and clean out the garden before we can fully enjoy the divine presence in heaven - that's the painful process of purgatory. So, common sense tells us that most of us will need some spiritual cleaning up after we die and before we enter heaven.

The second reason backing up the doctrine of purgatory is history. Christians have prayed for the dead since the very first centuries of the Church. Masses in the catacombs were offered for the dead. St Augustine's mother, in the 300s, asked him to *"remember her at the altar"* when she died - in other words, to pray for the repose of her soul, just as we are praying for the deceased today. Later that same century, St. John Chrysostom, doctor of the Church, wrote simply *"Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."* In fact, history teaches that NOT praying for the dead is the new practice - it started in the 1500s, when Martin Luther began a large-scale revolt against Catholic doctrine and practice.

Finally, the Bible also supports this ancient Christian teaching. Although the word Purgatory itself doesn't appear in Scripture, there are various passages that have always been interpreted as referring to it. For example, in Matthew 12:32, Jesus points out that blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is the only sin that will not be forgiven, *"either in this world or in the next,"* implying that some purification from sin does take place after death. He also speaks more than once about sinners being kept in prison until they have *"paid the last penny"* (Matthew 5:26, Luke 12:59), referring to a period of purification between earthly life and heaven. One of the most explicit passages is when St. Paul says that some people will be saved, but only *"as through fire"* (1 Corinthians 3:15). In other words, being passively purified after death. Finally, the Second Book of Maccabees (12:41-45) praises offering prayers for the dead.

Common sense, history, and the Bible all agree: purgatory is real; many, if not most of us, will need to be purified from the vestiges of sin and selfishness after we die so that we can fully experience the joys of heaven. We just know three things for certain: that a purification after death exists, that it involves some kind of pain, and that it can be assisted by the prayers and offerings the living make to God. We can make our offerings to God by accepting the small and large sufferings of life on earth with faith, uniting them to Christ's sufferings on the cross. Thus we can grow closer to Christ in this life, getting our purification done faster and less painfully now instead of later. Next, we can alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters who have died and are now in purgatory by praying for them, offering Masses for them, obtaining indulgences for them... God has generously connected our lives to theirs.

Let us consider this week All Souls' Day anew and with all our hearts, glorifying God for making us members of a Christian family that shatters the limits of time, space, and even of sin through our acts of charity.

A Message from Fr. Joshua and Rachel Witt

Dear sisters, brothers, my friends in Christ,



As we begin the month of November, we start with two very significant liturgical commemorations. First, on Saturday, November 1st, our attention is on the Solemnity of All Saints. I like to refer to All Saints as our future Feast Day because, as we each strive in this life to become holy saints, we look forward to joining all the Saints in Heaven, as our Church recognizes them throughout the year. Many of our favorite saints have their own designated Memorials, Feasts, or Solemnities that we celebrate. I always love celebrating those Masses each year. All Saints deals with all the unnamed and often unknown saints that have gone before us, who are also holy and with God in Heaven. One of my favorite scripture verses that speaks of our process of becoming saints is from Saint Paul's Second Letter to Timothy, chapter 4, verses 7-8. "I have competed well; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith. From now on, the crown of righteousness awaits me, which the Lord, the just judge, will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but to all who have longed for his appearance." Let us all make sure we are also competing well and running the race of life in Christ all the way to the finish line – eternal life in Heaven.

Another significant day for us in this new month is All Souls' Day, or the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, on Sunday, November 2nd. Not only are we praying for the faithful departed on November 2nd, but your priests traditionally are given permission and the privilege to celebrate three Masses on this day for the following intentions: one Mass for a particular intention, the second Mass for all the faithful departed, and the third Mass for the intention of the Pope. This is always a special day to remember and pray for those who have gone before us.

Since I left you all for my deployment to Kuwait almost a month ago, I have lost two friends, Terry S. and Bruce C. For myself, it is hard to be away from home and not be able to be present for their funeral Masses and be part of their being laid to rest. Thankfully, I have already been able to offer prayers and Masses for them both because it is good to do so. In the Old Testament, 2 Maccabees 12:43-45, we hear about the Israelite leader Judas Maccabeus, who orders a sin offering for his fallen soldiers, which is presented as an honorable act motivated by a belief in the resurrection of the dead. The author explains that it would be foolish to pray for the dead without believing they will rise again. Thus, Judas's thought was considered holy and pious, and his atonement sacrifice was made so that the dead might be delivered from their sin.

Dear friends, please remember Pope Leo's monthly intention during November, specifically "to pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life." Also, we can all pray for those who have gone before us throughout November, and all the while striving to become holy saints ourselves and encouraging one another in this most awesome calling. A note from Rachel Witt, Director of Operations

This week continues our review of progress on facilities projects.
Here are a few summary bullet points for context. To be continued next week...

Over the past 9 months, we have:

- restarted routine meetings with Facility Committees for both SMC and SAC
- built and implemented a work order system
- completed security and maintenance inventories for every property of the pastorate
- collaborated with LCSS on a successful School Safety grant application
- applied for Department of Homeland Security Safety Grants for both SMC and SAC (status pending)
- selected and documented a preferred facility vendor list and streamlined vendor payments
- established HVAC preventative maintenance contracts for all properties
- completed necessary IT and phone upgrades at SMC and are finalizing bids to begin SAC
- identified key vulnerabilities resulting from deferred maintenance and have started to address the most urgent as funding is available.

This last bullet point is one you will be hearing more about. While we have been able to accomplish a great deal over the past months, and streamlining operations has been a step in the right direction, there are significant large projects on all pastorate properties that cannot continue to be put off indefinitely. These will require prayerful consideration and response from each of us.

MUSIC AND LITURGY A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen



With All the Saints

I was listening to J. S. Bach's *Cantata BWV 106, Gottes Zeit ist die allerbeste Zeit*—(God's time is the very best time)—and was reminded that God holds all things in His time: the moments of living and of dying, of joy and of sorrow. Though we often have many unanswered questions, though we do not always understand why suffering comes or life ends when it does, we can trust that God is in control.

As I listened, I found myself thinking about my grandparents, my uncle, and my aunt—their laughter, their quiet presence at family gatherings, their courage through illness, their final moments. Memory brings tenderness and ache in equal measure. Yet even in the sadness, I believe that death is not the end of life, but the beginning of a transformed life with God.

The hymn "*With All the Saints*" captures that same mystery of communion and hope. In the first verse, we sing "*With all the saints, with prophets and martyrs, with holy Mary and Joseph, with those who came before and those who will follow...*" reminding us that faith unites all generations—past, present, and future—into one body in Christ. On this All Souls Day, we join our voices with theirs.

As the hymn continues, we remember *all in need* (v. 2), *refugees* (v. 3), *all who live* (v.4), *all who work for the city* (v.5), expanding our prayer to include all who suffer, all who long for mercy and home. In the final verse, we sing, "*So may this flock, this church once more gathered, faithfully follow its Shepherd's voice.*" These words call us not only to remember but to live: to become, in our own time, "*a sign and sacrament of Christ.*"

On this day of remembrance, as we pray and remember those dear to us, may we feel that we stand indeed "with all the saints"—held in God's time, sustained by God's love, and joined in one eternal song of life.


