

Saint I eo the Great

Saint Leo the Great 400 - 461

Leo the Great is known as one of the best administrative popes of the ancient Church. He worked at length to control the heresies of Pelagianism and Manichaeism. Pelagianism stated that there was no original sin and that individuals were capable of obtaining perfection through their own free will without the need for God's grace. Manichaeism, started by the Persian prophet Mani, embodied the belief that everything material was evil.

Another area of emphasis for Pope Leo the Great was the Church's teaching on the two natures of Christ. Finally, his growth to sainthood had as its basis the pastoral care of his people. He was known for delivering spiritually profound sermons that touched the every day needs and interests of those that heard them. A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Why we celebrate the Dedication of the (St. John) Lateran Basilica 324 AD-



In celebrating the Lateran Basilica's dedication, we celebrate our unity in Christ and his Church.

Today we celebrate the dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. At first glance, it seems strange to celebrate the dedication of a particular building, no matter how historic or beautiful it might be. To understand the meaning of this feast, we first must understand the meaning of church buildings in general. Of course, they serve a practical purpose by giving us a safe and inviting place to gather for the Eucharist, but they also have an important symbolic meaning.

All three of the readings today use buildings in a symbolic manner. In the first reading, Ezekiel has a vision of water flowing from the side of the temple. This water symbolizes God's grace, which brings life and renewal wherever it flows.

Saint Paul uses the image of a temple as a symbol for the Christian people, both collectively and individually; he tells the Corinthians they are built on the foundation of Christ.

In today's Gospel Jesus, after driving the money-changers and traders out of the temple in Jerusalem, uses the temple as a symbol of His body, which will die and then be raised up in three days.

Reflecting on these readings, it becomes clear that a church building is a symbol of the Church itself: Christ's mystical body, formed from the assembled Christian people, existing to bring God's grace to the whole world. (The Church = the People of God). In celebrating the dedication of a church building, we are celebrating and commemorating our own dedication as members of the Church, living stones in the temple of God. It is a day to remember that we are sacred, having been redeemed and made one with Christ through baptism.

With that background in place, we can turn to the particular symbolic significance of the Lateran Basilica. To remain part of the Church, it is necessary to remain in union with Jesus Christ; He is the head and we are the members, or as St. Paul puts it in today's reading, He is the foundation upon which we are built.

How can we tell if we are in union with Jesus and the Church He founded in a world full of competing claims and arguments? The Church gives us a simple answer: the pope, as the successor of Peter, serves as the touchstone of unity. As St. Ambrose once said, "where Peter is, there is the Church." If we are in communion with the bishop of Rome, we are in communion with Christ's Church. Practically speaking, this also means being united to our local bishops.

The Lateran Basilica is the pope's personal cathedral; in celebrating its dedication, we celebrate our unity in Christ. As we prepare to receive the Eucharist, the Body of Christ, let us ask Jesus to purify us and make us one with Him. May our union with Him drive out all division and enmity from our hearts so we can become fully integrated into His body, and provide a channel through which all people can receive God's life-giving grace.

This week let us start with loving Christ and His Church!



A Message from Rachel Witt, DOO



A note from Rachel Witt, Director of Operations

This week concludes our review of progress on facilities projects.



Deferred Maintenance is an unfortunate reality of managing facilities. Rarely, if ever, do we have all necessary resources to complete all work that would ideally be completed.

A key part of our work and responsibility is not just waiting for something to "break" before we address it. We have been working to identify needs BEFORE they become an emergency, but of course, we have to also address emergencies as they come up.

St. Mary Cathedral Projects

- IT Upgrade \$88,598 Finishing Now
- School/Office Boiler \$64,312 Complete
- Roof Working Sacristy \$22,185 Complete
- Security System (Electronic) Upgrade: \$3,918.00 Complete
- Chapel Security/Access: \$3,184.00 Complete
- Refinish Columbia St. Historic Doors: \$6400 In progress.
- Exterior Cameras 9 Replacements (obsolete): \$14,700 in progress
- Update Loop/T Coil system: \$2,593 : Scheduling now
- Repair Damaged Flooring near altar: Bidding On hold
- Waterproof Exterior Church: \$184,112 On hold
- Waterproof Exterior Social Hall: \$112,986 On hold
- Chiller Upgrade: Unknown/On hold
- Boiler(s) Replacement: Unknown/On hold
- Steeple Repair/Louver Replacement: Unknown/On hold.

This project list is not comprehensive. The Cathedral update was completed in 2000 and at 25 years old, many building components are nearing end of life and being closely monitored by the Facility Committee and Finance Council at this time.

St. Ann Church Projects

The St. Ann Facility Committee have recently taken up the work of evaluating and fact gathering. We have also recently completed a security vulnerability study as part of a federal grant application. The hope is to initiate a Master Planning process to engage in a larger planning and growth conversation. In addition to multiple "small jobs", recent completed projects have included: >Security upgrade and full re-key, >Plumbing repairs and remediation of associated water damage in all buildings, >warehouse gutter/downspout work, >HVAC cleaning and maintenance across all buildings, >IT upgrade (expected early 2026), >Awning replacements (in progress, expected by end of November), >Memorial Center replace storm windows and blinds (complete).

A Message from Fr. Matthew and Wendy Yuen

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Thursday, the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. Known during her life as Mother Cabrini, she has a remarkable story and was the first United States citizen to be canonized. She was canonized on July 7, 1946, by Pope Pius XII.



Cabrini was born in Italy but always had a desire to spread the Gospel to the ends of the earth. She wanted to travel to China. Pope Leo XIII persuaded Cabrini to change her plans. The pope told her "not to go East, but to go West." And she did! In 1889, Cabrini arrived in New York City with a desire to found orphanages and minister to Italian immigrants.

Cabrini, however, faced significant challenges upon her arrival in New York. She did not have a building for her orphanage and experienced limited success in her missionary work. The archbishop himself tried to persuade her to return to Italy, saying she would find little success in New York. Yet, Cabrini persisted in her efforts, relying on her deep faith in Jesus Christ. And thank God, she continued on. After 35 years of missionary work, she established over 67 institutions that supported the poor and cared for those often marginalized by society. She helped strengthen the faith of many immigrants arriving in the United States, especially those from Italy.

Cabrini founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and traveled around the world to spread the Gospel, including in Central America and South America. The Lord's Providence guided her along the way (Cabrini was even supposed to be on the maiden voyage of the *Titanic*, but changed to an earlier voyage on a different ship!). Cabrini died in 1917.

Cabrini exemplifies the importance of persistence and perseverance, even in the face of great difficulties. She is an American saint who shows us how to spend ourselves in complete service of Jesus Christ and His Gospel. When faced with great difficulties in our vocation or our faith, Cabrini is a good intercessor to turn to.

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, pray for us!

A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen

The Church's One Foundation

This Sunday, as we celebrate the Feast of Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, we honor not only the mother church of Rome but the very meaning of the Church herself. The Lateran Basilica stands as a visible sign of the unity of God's people throughout the world—a reminder that the true temple of God is not made of stone, but of the men and women who form the living Body of Christ.

Pope Benedict XVI reflected on this feast, reminding us that the temple of stones is "a symbol of the living Church, the Christian community," built of "living stones," that is, of believers themselves, "upon the one foundation of Jesus Christ, who is called the cornerstone" (1 Corinthians 3:9–11, 16–17; 1 Peter 2:4–8; Ephesians 2:20–22). Saint Paul wrote, "Brothers, you are God's building... holy is God's temple, which you are." The Lateran Basilica is more than an ancient monument—it is a mirror of what God desires to build in every generation: a spiritual temple of people who worship Him in spirit and in truth.

Our hymn, "The Church's One Foundation," echoes this truth. It reminds us that the Church remains one in Christ. Her unity does not come from human agreement but from her cornerstone—Jesus, who holds all things together. In every Eucharistic liturgy, the "ecclesia"—the gathered assembly of believers—is formed anew as the Church of living stones. From the table of the Word and the table of the Eucharist, we are formed into the very Body of Christ.

When we sing this hymn, may we be united with the whole Church—the living temple of God built on Christ our cornerstone. As we share in Word and Eucharist, the Spirit forms us into His Body, living stones of God's dwelling. The music is *maestoso* and reverent, inviting us to sing with strength and conviction. The hymn's opening phrase, built on five repeated notes, seems to proclaim the steadfastness of our faith—each note like a pillar resting on the sure foundation of Christ. In its beauty and dignity, the music leads us to stand together as one body, joined in praise of Him who is **the Church's one foundation.**
