#### Saint of the Week

Saint Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions

Andrew Dung-Lac, a Vietnamese Catholic priest, was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. Those martyred along with him included 11 Spanish missionaries, 10 French missionaries, and 96 Vietnamese priests and laity.

Christianity came to Vietnam when the Jesuits opened the first permanent mission in Da Nang and ministered to Japanese Catholics who had been driven from Japan.

In 1821, the emperor of Vietnam banned all foreign missionaries and tried to make all Vietnamese deny their faith. Between the years 1625 and 1886, approximately 130,000 Catholics were killed or subjected to great hardship. Despite over 50 decrees banning the Christian faith, the Church has grown to almost 6 million Catholics in Vietnam.

### A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Blessed Christ the King 2025! I pray we all find time on this Solemnity of *Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, (Christ the King)* to contemplate how blessed we are to be beloved daughters and sons of our Heavenly Father. To consider how God has blessed us, with our Savior and King! Certainly, this celebration of *Christ the King* should help us celebrate our Thanksgiving as the United States of America-Blessed Thanksgiving 2025!



As for me this Thanksgiving, I must share with you that aside from my faith and family, I am so very grateful for you, my faith family. Your witness of faith, prayer, and reverence at Mass and the many who give witness to faith through charity and acts of service within our parish and community is so very inspirational. I pray we may all find time to enjoy some relaxation and good food with family and friends.

The Solemnity of Christ the King, which every Catholic throughout the entire world is celebrating today, is a relatively new thing. The Church has existed for almost 2000 years, but this Solemnity is less than 100 years old. It was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925. He explained his reasons for doing so in an encyclical letter called *Quas primas* (In the first). First, he explained that throughout history, liturgical feasts have been instituted in response to particular needs that arise in the life of the world and the Church (#22). He gives the example of the feasts in honor of the martyrs, the celebration of Corpus Christi, and the Sacred Heart. And then he explains which need this new celebration addresses.

He was writing this encyclical in 1925 when the world was still trying to recover from World War I which had devastated Europe and shattered modernity's hopes for unlimited progress based solely on human reason. 1925 was also only a few years after the Russian Bolshevik Revolution, which had given birth to the world's first explicitly atheist totalitarian regime: Soviet communism. Everywhere the pope looked, he saw human societies abandoning Christian values and trying to build paradise on earth through other means (secularism). But if humanity had been able to perfect itself by itself, without God's help, then Jesus Christ would never have come to earth. The fact is, Jesus did come. He brought His Gospel and His grace to a fallen race, and only by believing in that Gospel and accepting that grace can individuals and societies achieve true and lasting peace and prosperity.

Pope Pius XI instituted today's Solemnity as a way to remind the world that to reject Christ, either in private life or in public life, is to reject our only hope, and to accept him is to accept salvation.

As Pope Pius XI wrote: "...When once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony... That these blessings may be abundant and lasting in Christian society, it is necessary that the kingship of our Savior should be as widely as possible recognized and understood, and to that end nothing would serve better than the institution of a special feast in honor of the Kingship of Christ." (Quas primas, 19, 21)

May the graces of *Christ the King* and the realization of our blessings at *Thanksgiving* prepare us for the beginning of Advent next Sunday. Our Clergy Team is excited to share with you our Advent Homily Series on *Silence* and how silence helps us to encounter and experience the Divine. We are praying and hoping that we may all enter our Advent season with hearts full of gratitude as we anticipate Christ's return in Glory and His birthday in and through his daily coming into our hearts.

# Matthew 25 Care and Share Soup Kitchen News



### A Message from Fr. Matthew and Rachel Witt

Brothers and sisters in Christ.

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King, which marks the final Sunday of the liturgical year. The feast of Christ the King dates back to Pope Pius XI in 1925 and was originally celebrated on the final Sunday in October. In 1969, the feast was moved to the final Sunday of the liturgical year. This Sunday is a reminder that all of salvation history, everything we have celebrated liturgically over the past year, points to Jesus Christ and His Kingship. Though the world can be quite chaotic at times, Jesus Christ has won the final victory. He is the king of the universe and of all time. For all of the storms of the world, Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Remember this central fact today!

This Sunday is also a good time to begin preparing for the season of Advent, which begins next Sunday. Now is the time to look back over the past year to see the good spiritual habits that have formed and to reinforce those in the year ahead. This is also a time to look back on the past year and see where bad habits, sin, and vice have crept in, and make resolutions to begin again in this new liturgical year. Like a New Year's resolution, it can be a good practice to make one or two specific resolutions for what we want this next liturgical year to look like spiritually.

Our pastorate will be offering many opportunities to spiritually refocus during the season of Advent. One of these opportunities is a weekly Vesper service. 

### **Understanding Our Worship Aids and Hymn Choices**

Following my last bulletin article about stepping away from *Breaking Bread 2025* and using worship aids for our Sunday Masses, I received several thoughtful questions from parishioners. Some of you asked, "What hymnals are we going to use for the music now?" Others wondered, "Are we going to sing new songs at every Mass?" I wanted to take a moment to address these questions and offer some clarity about how we choose music for our liturgies.

#### First, what is a hymnal?

Hymnals are curated collections of hymns and songs put together by a team of editors—usually musicians, theologians, and liturgists—who work with certain goals in mind. Every hymnal reflects the editorial principles of the group that produced it. For example:

- **Credo Hymnal** emphasizes strong doctrinal texts, traditional hymnody, and musical settings rooted in the Church's heritage.
- **Breaking Bread** (the 2025 edition) has a mixed collection of chants, traditional hymns, and, contemporary songs.

Each of these hymnals is shaped by the theological perspective, musical priorities, and pastoral vision of its editors. That means every hymnal has strengths—but also limitations. No single book contains the full richness of the Church's musical treasure.

### So what are we doing?

By moving to worship aids, we are no longer tied to the contents of one specific hymnal. This gives us the freedom to draw from a wider and richer pool of sacred music—chants, traditional hymns, quality contemporary works—always selected with the text in mind.

This approach also lets us to choose the best music for the liturgy and the theme of the homily. Having worship aids allows us to choose the right text for the right moment.

### Are we going to sing brand-new songs every week?

The answer is: no.

My goal is always to balance:

- Familiar, beloved hymns the parish knows well
- Seasonal hymns that help us pray the liturgy more deeply
- Monthly new music that enriches our worship and brings fresh life to our singing

### Why this matters

The purpose of music at Mass is to lift our hearts to God, to express the theology of the Church, and to unite us as one voice in worship. The flexibility of using worship aids helps us choose texts and melodies that best serve the liturgy and deepen our prayer.

As always, I am deeply grateful for your willingness to sing, your openness to learning, and your love for our parish's worship. Please continue to share your questions—I am always happy to talk about our music ministry.


