Saint of the Week

Saint John of Damascus (675 - 750)

Raised in a prominent Christian family serving under Muslim leaders, John's father ensured his son received an excellent education from the Sicilian monk named Cosmas. Trained in theology, philosophy, law, and the sciences, Saint John succeeded his father in office, living as a devout Christian in court before renouncing public life to become a monk at a monastery near Jerusalem.

In the monastery, Saint John devoted himself to study, prayer, and writing. When Emperor Leo III condemned the veneration of icons, Saint John became one of its fiercest defenders, composing treatises that upheld the ancient Christian practice of honoring sacred images. He did not live to see the end of iconoclasm, but the church did uphold his position and reinstated the holy images at the Second Council of Nicaea in 787.

"...if He said, 'Let there be light', and it happened; why should He not be capable of making bread His Body and wine and water His Blood?... "(Saint John Damascene)

A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Another Advent is upon us. Why? Why does the Church lead us along the same path every year, repeating the same seasons, even the same readings? Is it for lack of creativity and imagination? No, the Church is always young, and never runs out of creativity. In every generation she gives the world new saints, new religious orders, new artists. The Church is ever ancient, and yet ever new. The Church is a wise, loving mother who knows her children well, sincerely respects them, and is always leading them forward, never backward. The Church may often be demanding, but when she is, it is for our benefit, not our destruction.

So what is the reason for another Advent? The word "advent" comes from the Latin "ad-venire", meaning to come to, to come towards. This season spotlights the three comings of Christ: the first, 2000 years ago; the last, sometime in the future; and the present - Christ's constant coming into our lives through His grace, His providence, and His sacraments. This is why our Penitential Rite will be different during Advent and our Intercession response will be, *Come, Lord Jesus!*

We live in the final age of human history, the age which will end in Christ's second coming, the destruction of the cosmos as we know it, and the creation of a new heavens and earth - the full establishment of Christ's Kingdom, as today's readings described. We are already citizens of that Kingdom because Jesus is the Kingdom of God among us, we are members of His Church and God dwells in us!

The Church gives us the season of Advent in order to remind us of this, and to give us a chance to check up on the quality of our citizenship. Considering the three comings of Christ, and that we are called to live in the present with Jesus, to know our past and prepare for our future, I ask you to consider helping us grow with Jesus in the following ways this Advent.

- 1. As a faith family by actively engaging in our pastorate and community. We need you! As I have just finished watching Pope Leo XIV dialogue with our Youth in Indianapolis at the National gathering of Youth, he invited our youth to develop a personal relationship with Jesus, through prayer, the Mass, Adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and the Sacrament of Reconciliation!!! We have been made for this time in salvation history. Let us cooperate with God's grace!
- 2. Please consider helping us financially to maintain our beautiful places of worship, our campuses and cemetery. Please consider a year end gift and consider weekly/monthly gifts specifically for maintenance beyond regular giving. Every gift counts! Our Director of Operations, Rachel Witt has shared the various ways we are trying to preserve our facilities. As a reminder:
 - a. St. Mary Cathedral Church was renovated and the addition added 25 yrs ago. We are faced with maintenance needs and refreshing certain areas.
 - b. Our beautiful St. Mary Cemetery has ongoing and deferred maintenance needs. We have recently removed several trees and limbs that presented life and safety dangers; parts of our roads and fences were overgrown. We need to care for graves, replace trees, care for our roads and all within the cemetery.
 - c. St. Ann's Worship space was last renovated 45 years ago and shows significant wear (this has been-the number one concern that parishioners have brought to my attention). I am grateful that a new roof and tuckpointing has taken place over the past four years. It is time to address the Church interior and buildings through a Master Plan.

We are praying and hoping that we may all enter our Advent season with hearts full of gratitude as we anticipate Christ's return in Glory and His birthday in and through His daily coming into our hearts.



A Message from Fr. Joshua and Rachel Witt

Dear Saint Mary and Saint Ann Pastorate Family,

Happy First Sunday of Advent!! Guess who? Yes, it's me. Fr. Joshua, one of your priests. How are you doing? How did everything go with Thanksgiving? I hope you all had a nice time with your families and loved ones, sharing in all the blessings God has given you and delicious meals around your dinner tables. Thanksgiving was different for me this year, over here in Kuwait. And, no, I did not eat camel on Thanksgiving. I honestly haven't even seen a camel yet, but perhaps I'll see one soon. I did get the opportunity to be present each day with the other military members who are over here with me, doing important work for the United States of America. Thank you, dear family, for being part of this through your prayers and support, and for knowing that, as I serve, I am representing God, our Church, and each one of you. I am grateful, and this is just one of the things I am giving thanks for this year.

I am also thankful for the opportunity to assist others in growing closer to God and strengthening their Catholic faith. I hold Mass each day, Monday – Thursday at 12:30 pm, Fridays for Embassy Families here in Kuwait at 10:15 am, a Saturday Vigil Mass at 6:00 pm (with a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration one hour before Mass), and a Sunday morning Mass at 9:00 am (with confessions one hour before Mass). We also head to the Green Bean coffee shop on base after Sunday Mass for some coffee, sweets, and time for conversation. During my Masses and times of prayer, I can reflect more deeply on God's word and pray for many people. If any of you have prayer intentions, please email those to me at fr.jianko@dol-in.org. I am happy to keep you and your prayers in mind at Masses and other prayer times. In addition to the Masses and Holy Hours, I have been leading an OCIA class on Monday nights, and one of my Catholic members, Omar, who hopefully will be able to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Christmas Day, 12/25/25, when Archbishop Broglio is here for a pastoral visit. If you are ever interested in learning more about the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, please visit their website www.milarch.org. Thank you also if you were able to contribute to the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA, a few weeks ago. Finally, on Thursday evenings, I meet with a couple of people for a Bible Study at 6:00 pm. We start with a Rosary at 5:45 pm, and then we dive into our materials. We are currently working through a seven-week study on Scriptural Apologetics. So far, it has been a nice time of prayer, study, and fellowship.

I just wanted to give you an update on what I've been up to here in my Catholic ministry. I am also keeping busy with military members across four squadrons: the Civil Engineering Squadron (including the firefighters), the Contracting Squadron (money spenders), the Force Support Squadron (gyms, cafeteria, recreation facility, lodging office, and education office), and the Communications Squadron (lots of areas these folks support – computers, phones, cable, email, etc.). I am keeping busy! Please also pray for my Chapel co-workers (teammates) deployed here with me: Clayton (from California), James (Utah), Scot (California), Danielle (Michigan), Ruth (New York), Zachary (California), and Carmyn (Washington, D.C.).

A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Advent always begins quietly—with deep purple, candlelight, and contemplative, chant-like melodies such as *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*. This hymn invites us into a world that is very different from the one we live in today. Ours is a culture of instant answers, one-day shipping, rapid notifications. Advent proposes something countercultural: **waiting.** Holy, hopeful, deliberate waiting.

Each verse calls Christ by a different name—titles rooted in Scripture.

- Emmanuel "God-with-us." God who chooses to dwell among His people.
- Wisdom from on High. Christ is the One who shows us how to live in God's way.
- Lord of Might. This title recalls the God who gave the Law on Sinai.
- Root of Jesse. a biblical metaphor for the Messiah, who is a descendant of Jesse, the father of King David. A reminder that Jesus Christ, who would bring new life and establish a kingdom.
- . Key of David. The One who opens doors no one can shut.
- Dayspring. Christ to come and bring his light.
- Desire of Nations. The One who unites what is divided, healing our world's fragmentation and our own divided hearts.

Each verse is a prayer in itself—a longing for Christ to enter the very places where we are still waiting for healing, forgiveness, peace.

And so Advent challenges us. The Church gives us four weeks to remind us that **God forms us through waiting**. Delayed gratification isn't merely a psychological exercise; it is spiritual training. It creates space for us to wait, to long for what truly matters.

When we sing *O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*, we practice this holy longing. We learn to desire God more than immediate comfort. In a world that urges us to skip straight to Christmas, Advent invites us to slow down, breathe, meditate, and remember that **the deepest joys are worth waiting for.** Christ will come. Christ always comes. And in the singing, in the prayer, in the longing, in the waiting, our hearts are made ready to receive Him.
