Saint of the Week

Saint Andre Bessette
1845 - 1937

Saint Andre Bessett was the 8th of 12 children born to a French Canadian couple near Montreal. After holding various jobs from farmhand to factory worker, Andre entered the Congregation of the Holy Cross at 25. Due to his weak health which he had from birth, he was given jobs such as doorkeeper, sacristan, laundry worker and messenger.

Having a special devotion to St. Joseph, Andre would credit St. Joseph for curing people of their illnesses when he would visit them and lightly rub oil on them. According to some estimates over 10,000 people were cured by Andre through the intercession of St. Joseph.

A chapel was built on Mount Royal in Montreal called the St Joseph Oratory where many miracles of healing did occur and where Andre Bessette lies in rest.

A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers & sisters in Christ, Happy Feast of the Epiphany,

Today we celebrate the coming of the Three Wise Men. We celebrate the manifestation of Christ to all peoples. We celebrate our own ability and willingness to follow the "star" that leads us to Jesus and the joy He offers us!



Epiphany "Epiphany" means "manifestation." It comes from Greek roots that mean "to show, to display." An epiphany is thus a time when something is shown, displayed, or manifested to an audience. *The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee... . The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations.* (CCC 528)

The Epiphany calls us to turn toward the promise that has been fulfilled by Christ's birth. The "star" will lead us to Jesus and the lasting joy that He offers.

Our weeks of Advent, in which we spent time in Sacred Silence, a time for a *Quiet Encounter with Jesus*, now call us to share the *Joy of Jesus*.

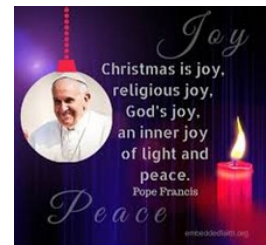
As our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV reminds us, the Christmas message is one of joy, and the Feast of the Epiphany calls us to manifest that joy in our own lives. We are called to share the joy that is Jesus.

Joy is the true gift of Christmas, and we can communicate this joy simply: with a smile, a kind gesture, a little help, forgiveness. And the joy we give will certainly come back to us. (Pope Benedict) Pope Benedict further highlights why we might not know or experience the joy of Christ. *Many people perceive Christianity as something institutional - rather than as an encounter with Christ and His Bride, the Church- which explains why they don't see it as a source of joy.*

My brothers and sisters, if this is true, then how sad Christmas has truly become. Christmas, and especially the Feast of the Epiphany, once again manifest to us the Person of Jesus and all that He offers us.

Do I know Jesus, His Church and the Joy They Offer?

When one says, "I do not go to Church, but believe in Jesus," too often what they mean is, "I don't go to Church because it is inconvenient and I am busy. However, I do believe in Jesus... a couple of times a year, but I do not really know Jesus, or His teachings, or the way He chooses to share Himself with me... in the Sacraments, in the Mass, in the Blessed Sacrament..."



Thus, we wander aimlessly, wondering why we don't have peace and joy. But that is not how it should be. I understand how easy it is to be distracted by all the things that surround us. Our families, our jobs, our daily routines, life's good moments and not so good moments cannot be discounted. However, God has given us a gift. A gift that is meant to be inserted in all these other things.

As Pope Francis notes: *God never gives someone a gift they are not capable of receiving. If He gives us the gift of Christmas, it is because we all have the ability to understand and receive it.*

My brothers & sisters in Christ, may the joy and peace of Christ be ours every day, and may we share it with those both near and far.

Then we will discover that a light shines even in the darkest nights: the light of Jesus, the radiant morning star, the sun of justice the merciful splendour of God, who loves every man and woman, and all the peoples of the earth.

A Message from Fr. Matthew and Rachel Witt

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our Christmas season continues this Sunday with the great solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. This feast commemorates our Lord's manifestation to the nations, specifically through the arrival of the magi from the East, which we hear in our Gospel at Sunday Mass.



A unique tradition associated with this feast day is the "chalking of the doors" (also known as the Epiphany house blessing). This blessing is done by writing what looks like a math equation above the entrance to one's home. This year, the blessing would go as follows: **20 + C + M + B + 26**. Each of these signs has a meaning. Obviously, the first and last numbers represent the new year we have just entered—2026. The letters represent the traditional names of the magi who visited our Lord—Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase "*Christus mansionem benedicat*," meaning "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross.

This tradition of "chalking the doors" is centuries old and is a good way to rededicate our homes to the Lord as the new year begins. The tradition also recalls the hospitality the Holy Family showed to the magi (a representation of all the Gentile nations coming to the Lord). Moreover, the blessing has deep biblical roots, dating back to the Old Testament, when the Israelites sanctified their homes during the Passover by placing the blood of the sacrificial lamb on the doorposts.

This Sunday, as we give out blessed chalk in the parish, please take a bag home and bless your home. Place your home under the protection of Almighty God in this new year of 2026.

A Christmas Reflection

Christmas has been a true blessing for our church. On Christmas Eve, we were graced with the music of our Children's Choir, Youth Choir, and Adult Choir, whose voices lifted our liturgies with joy and reverence. Their singing reminded us that music, offered prayerfully, can open hearts to the mystery we celebrate. **I am deeply grateful to everyone in the music ministry at St. Mary Cathedral and St. Ann Church who served so generously on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day—your time, preparation, and dedication made these celebrations truly prayerful and beautiful.**

One of the most moving moments came during *Silent Night*. As the congregation joined together in song, the church seemed wrapped in stillness and light—a quiet echo of the night of Christ's birth. In that shared singing, we were drawn into a moment of deep peace.

Silent Night has a humble beginning. First sung on Christmas Eve in 1818 in a small village in Austria, it was written by a young priest, Joseph Mohr, with music by Franz Xaver Gruber, a schoolteacher and organist. Accompanied simply by a guitar, the carol was born out of necessity and faith. Perhaps that simplicity is why it continues to speak so powerfully to hearts across generations.

Over the centuries, *Silent Night* has crossed cultures and even divisions. During World War I, it is remembered that soldiers on opposing sides sang it together during a Christmas truce—a reminder that music has the power to unite where words and circumstances often fail.

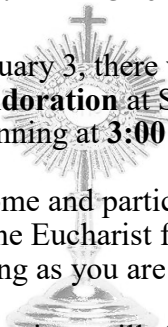

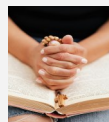
