

Saint of the Week

Saint Juan Diego (1474 - 1548)

Saint Juan Diego was an Indigenous Mexican convert and visionary associated with the apparitions of Our Lady of Guadalupe. It wasn't until he was about 50 that he was baptized by a Franciscan missionary.

On December 9, 1531, on his way to Mass, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to him requesting that a shrine be built in her honor. When the local bishop asked for proof, the Virgin directed Juan to gather roses blooming miraculously in winter. He carried the roses to the bishop in his cloak on December 12 (the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe) and upon opening his cloak, the roses fell to the floor leaving an image of our Lady on the fabric.

Juan Diego spent the rest of his life as a hermit near the chapel of the Virgin devoting himself to prayer, service, and caring for pilgrims.

A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Finding God's faithfulness in sacred silence. One of the greatest Christian poems of all time was written by Francis Thompson, a British poet from the late 1800s. He had a difficult life: his career in medicine was a failure; his rift with his father forced him into homelessness for years; and his addiction to opium was a lifelong plague. Both his circumstances and his sins made his life miserable.



Yet, his greatest work, an autobiographical poem called, "The Hound of Heaven," tells about a God who refuses to abandon even the most determined sinner. In it, the protagonist is madly searching for happiness in all the wrong places. During the search, he is being relentlessly pursued by a hunting dog, a hound. The hound is a symbol of God who loves us too much to ever give up on us. God is like a well-trained hunting dog, a hound that is on our trail and nothing we can do will ever shake him off!

The poem begins with a description of his flight from God and his vain search for happiness in other things:

- I fled Him, down the nights and down the days;
- I fled Him, down the arches of the years;
- I fled Him, down the labyrinthine ways
- Of my own mind; and in the mist of tears
- I hid from Him, and under running laughter.

But at the end, when he has nowhere else to run to, the hound catches up to him and says,

- Rise, clasp My hand, and come!
- ...Ah, fondest, blindest, weakest,
- I am He Whom thou seekest!
- Thou drivest love from thee, who drivest Me.

Nothing we do can lessen God's love for us: he is faithful, and his hand is always outstretched to save us from ourselves. We are the privileged ones - we know that God is faithful. We attend Mass today, being reminded of God's faithfulness. We have chosen, by God's grace, to try and live this Advent meaningfully, turning our attention to God's faithfulness, power and love. Because of that, God is already at work in our hearts, drawing us closer to him, making us wiser, stronger and readier to be victorious in the battle of life.

But what about all those people who are not here today with us, all of our friends, colleagues, and family members, strangers and neighbors, who will probably show up for Mass on Christmas Eve, but who are missing out on all the reminders and graces that God is sending us during Advent? They, too, are thirsting for someone to trust - they are searching for a God who is faithful. Unfortunately, many of them are searching in the wrong places: in money, pleasure, comfort, new age spirituality, some self-absorbed spin-off church, or any number of false idols.

God wants to convince them of His faithfulness; He wants them to discover true hope - the hope that comes from Him, the only hope that will never let them down. But He needs us to help Him. God revealed Himself and His faithfulness to the world 2000 years ago through two poor, uneducated, working class people: Mary and Joseph. Through them, the Savior entered the world.

Through us, through our words, example, and actions, He wants to send Jesus, the Savior, into the lives of those around us who are searching for the light. He wants to do it, and He will do it, if we let Him.

The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand, very near to everyone around us, because it is truly present in our hearts through God's grace - this Advent, let's not keep it to ourselves.

A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen

O Come, Divine Messiah

Advent is a season of holy waiting. *O Come, Divine Messiah*, with text by Abbé Simon-Joseph Pellegrin and a translation by Sr. Mary of St. Philip, beautifully expresses this waiting. Set to a gentle 16th-century French carol, the hymn invites us to pray deeply.

The opening line, "O come, divine Messiah, the world in silence waits the day...", immediately places us in that sacred stillness. This is not a silence of emptiness, but of expectation. We wait for the day when "hope shall sing its triumph and sadness flee away." Advent teaches us that waiting is not wasted time. In our fast, impatient world, this hymn invites us to slow down, to listen, to reflect, and to look for the quiet ways God moves.

The second verse widens that sense of longing: "O Christ, whom nations sigh for, whom priest and prophet long fore-told..." The cry for redemption is older than we are. Across history, people have yearned for peace, justice, and release from all that binds them. The words, "come, break the captive's fetters", remind us that Christ comes to set us free - to liberate hearts and heal communities.

The third verse reveals the nature of the Messiah we await: "You come in peace and meekness, and lowly will your cradle be." The Savior the world waits for enters not in power but in humility. God chooses to come among us in human—an infant who needs everything, a child who will grow, hunger, learn, and suffer. And yet, as the hymn says, all clothed in human weakness shall we your Godhead see." In Christ's meekness, we meet the fullness of God.

The refrain is our Advent prayer: "Dear Savior, haste! ... Dispel the night and show your face." We ask Christ to hasten because our world still longs for healing, for peace.

As we sing this hymn, may we wait, hope, and welcome the humble Messiah.



A Message from Fr. Matthew and Chris Alter

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

On Saturday, December 6, the Church celebrated the feast of St. Nicholas. Tradition says that Nicholas was born in Asia Minor (modern-day Turkey) in the fourth century. Tragically, when he was quite young, both of his parents died during an epidemic. As a result, Nicholas inherited a substantial sum of money and was determined to devote it to charitable works.

There is a story that one day Nicholas came into contact with a father who had lost all his money and could no longer afford to support his three daughters or pay their dowries so they could be wed. This placed the family in dire straits. One evening, Nicholas took a bag of gold and threw it into an open window of the man's house. The gold was enough to cover the dowry for his oldest daughter. Eventually, Nicholas did the same for the man's second and third daughters. This generous spirit would be a hallmark of Nicholas throughout his entire life.

Eventually, Nicholas was ordained a priest and later became the bishop of Myra in Turkey. Nicholas was known during his time as bishop for continuing to cultivate that generous spirit, while also defending the truth of who Jesus Christ was in a world that was doubting whether he was truly God. Tradition says Nicholas even attended the first ecumenical council in Nicaea in 325 A.D.

St. Nicholas today is best known as the patron saint of children. Children leaving their shoes out on the evening of December 5 to receive candy the next day is a tribute to the story of Nicholas paying for the three dowries, along with other stories of kindness toward children and those in need. St. Nicholas serves as a reminder to us, during these busy and hectic days of the Advent season, to remember, as St. John Paul II often said, "Man cannot fully find himself, except through a sincere gift of himself." If we want peace and joy during these days, it comes from generosity—both of our time and of the material gifts the Lord has given us. It is a generosity toward God, giving Him time in prayer, and a generosity toward our neighbor.

During this Advent season, seek the intercession of St. Nicholas and ask to embody that magnanimous spirit and truly live with a generous soul.






