

A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Christ Comes to Make His Dream for Our Lives Come True

It was so gratifying to see so many of you attending our Patronal Feast Day, The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Monday, our Holy Day of Obligation. Being open to God's dreams for us is best exemplified in Mary. Immaculately conceived she said yes to God's invitations throughout her life. This is unlike Eve, who at some point said, NO to God's invitation for her to love Him completely. When we fail to respond to God's dreams for us, which are found in Sacred Scripture, Tradition, and His bride, Holy Mother Church, we fall short of the glory (dream) God has in store for us.

Today the color of our vestments has changed. The priest doesn't wear purple or midnight blue, but rose. It is a visual symbol that Christmas is closer. Just as the dark night sky begins to glow with a pale, rose-colored light as the sun starts to rise, so the color of our vestments goes from dark to light. In our hearts the color should be changing, too.

For the first weeks of Advent, we have meditated on our need for God, our sinfulness, our helplessness in achieving the meaning and fulfillment that we long for. Today we switch gears. Without forgetting about our need for a Savior, we focus our attention more on that Savior himself. Christ came on the first Christmas in order to make his dream for this fallen world come true. Pope Benedict XVI reminds us of the need for the Hope of our Savior.

It becomes evident that man has need of a hope that goes further. It becomes clear that only something infinite will suffice for him, something that will always be more than he can ever attain... we need the greater and lesser hopes that keep us going day by day. But these are not enough without the great hope, which must surpass everything else. This great hope can only be God, who encompasses the whole of reality and who can bestow upon us what we, by ourselves, cannot attain. (Pope Benedict XVI Spe salvi, #30-31)

And Jesus wants to come again into our hearts this Christmas for the same reason, to make His dream for our lives come true. When Jesus came to earth, He met the blind and gave them sight; the poor and gave them hope; the lame and gave them strength.

He has begun the same work in us and is eager to continue it. We are blinded by ignorance and selfishness, and He offers us light in the teachings of His Church and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We are poor in virtue, and He fills us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We are lame, unable to pray as we should, to bear witness as we should, to love as we should, and He heals and strengthens us by nourishing us with His very self in the Eucharist.

Jesus has a dream for each one of our lives, and He is coming to make that dream come true. As we continue with our Advent Homily Series based on Sacred Silence, it is a great time to reflect on how Our Lord wants to speak into the silence of our hearts and minds from the depths of His infinite love, the Holy Mass.

This week, let us start by loving Jesus in the sacred silence of the Mass and our personal lives.



Incensation Schedule for St. Mary Cathedral AND St. Ann Church



A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen



People Look East

Last week I went to the grocery store to shop for ingredients for dinner. Yet the moment I stepped inside, my simple errand dissolved into a swirl of Christmas flowers, holiday bouquets, wreaths, candies, gift boxes—every corner overflowing with signs of the season. Suddenly, my mind leapt ahead: *How many Christmas cards should I write? Whom should I include? Which cookie recipes should I try this year?*

Look here. Look there. Look East.

Eleanor Farjeon (1881–1965), the poet who penned this beloved Advent hymn, begins with that very imperative: a call not to holiday busyness, but to attention. To turning the eyes and the heart toward the **coming of Christ**.

A devout Catholic, she published the hymn as "Carol of Advent" in *The Oxford Book of Carols* in 1928. Farjeon's text draws from ancient Christian practice. Early Christians often prayed facing east, the direction of rising light, anticipating the return of the Messiah. Farjeon reminds us that Advent is a season of anticipation and *expectant hope*.

In "People, Look East," Farjeon uses vivid imagery.

- Verse 1 invites us to prepare our homes—and our hearts—for a guest.
- Verse 2 turns to the quiet patience of seeds growing into a rose.
- Verse 3 evokes the fledgling bird learning to fly, a tender image of readiness.
- Verse 4 lifts our gaze to the stars shining as guides.

Each image is both ordinary and luminous, grounded in daily life yet pointing beyond it. Together they lead us to the climactic promise of verse 5:

"People, look east and sing today: Love, the Lord is on the way."

Sung to the traditional French carol tune **BESANÇON**, the hymn sparkles with joy. Its lively triple meter gives it a gentle dance-like motion, as though the whole creation is swaying in welcome. It is a melody that not only proclaims hope but *embodies* it—light, rhythmic.

At this time of year, when distractions crowd everywhere and to-do lists grow long, Farjeon's words invite us to pause, and look toward the center of the season. Advent is not about hurrying to Christmas, but about cultivating hope, wonder, and readiness.

Look East. Love, the Lord, is on the way.


