

A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Understanding Heaven- is it more than harps?

St. John, the author of the Book of Revelation, paints a picture of **heaven** for us today. His vision used to be **inspiring**. But in the last hundred years this image of heaven as filled with choirs of singing angels and throngs of bowing saints has given heaven a bad reputation. It makes people think that heaven is **boring**.

What happened? Why did the idea of "praising God for all eternity" **inspire** the first Christians, and why does it **turn off** many of today's Christians? Perhaps, in recent times, many Christians have forgotten what "praising God" really means. In the Bible, "praise" means much more than singing songs and clapping our hands.

Let's listen again to **St. John's description of heavenly praise**. He writes, "Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, everything in the universe, cry out: 'To the one who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor, glory and might, forever and ever.'"

He says that **all** creatures, **all** things in the universe cried out with praise to God. How can they do that? How can rocks and Saturn's rings and mosquitoes cry out with <u>praise to God?</u> Certainly not by singing songs, having a party and being self-centered and self-serving. <u>That is not the substance of praise</u>. <u>Rather, they praise God by being fully what they were created to be, by reflecting God's wisdom through being true to themselves.</u>

As humans, we are rational beings; we have the ability to love and to be loved. We praise God fully by **becoming fully alive**. In heaven we praise God **fully**, not because we will float on clouds playing harps, but because we will finally **be fully alive**. All our capacities for knowledge, love, wisdom, joy, and creativity will be **boundless in** heaven.

Our earthly worship of God helps us to experience this heavenly reality. While our worship is, in part, what we do, true worship is a complete giving of ourselves to God. Last week I shared that Ms. Wendy Yuen would become our Director of Music and Liturgy effective May 19. One reason we are excited both from a diocesan and pastorate perspective is that Wendy's prayer, life experience, and qualifications will help to elevate our ability to worship God. Her ability to play the piano/organ and other instruments, direct choirs and teach us about the music we participate in, is perhaps one of the key components missing in many Catholic Churches. I pray that we are able to take full advantage of Wendy's gifts and talents to expand our worship opportunities. I know she is open to developing voices and musicians for the life of our worship. We envision multiple choirs and musical instrument accompanists, such as was offered by our Interim Music Director Eileen Weis on Easter Sunday at the 11:00 a.m. Mass and which was so well received! So many of you commented on how heavenly the music was, and I agree!

We praise God by **becoming fully alive**. In heaven we praise God **fully** not because we will float on clouds playing harps, but because we will finally be **fully alive**. All our capacities for knowledge, love, wisdom, joy, and creativity will be **boundless** in heaven.

As we continue our Easter celebration and acknowledge Jesus as, "My Lord and My God" and in the Divine Mercy, prayer, "Jesus, I trust in You" —may all of our thoughts, words and actions make the grace of the Resurrection event and therefore, heaven, known in and through us on earth.

A Message from Fr. Matthew and Rachel Witt

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we continue in this Easter season, there are many things that we continue to celebrate in the life of the Church. This Sunday, both of our parishes celebrate the First Communion for many of our young people. Recently, I attended (along with some of our high school and middle school students) a documentary on Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young man who died in 2006 and lived a life of heroic sanctity and was deeply in love with the Eucharist. I was struck during the documentary by what Blessed Carlo was reported to have said after he received his First Communion, "Jesus, make yourself at home! Live within me as if it were your own dwelling!" If only we all saw the Eucharist in such a way, as our Lord truly making his home within us whenever we reverently receive the Blessed Sacrament. Please pray for our First Communicants today. Let's also pray for each other, that we might have the same Eucharistic faith as Blessed Carlo and that we might receive the Eucharist as if it were our first time, every time!

This Wednesday also marks a significant and exciting chapter in the life of the Church with the conclave that will elect Pope Francis' successor. Today is the final day of the *Novemdiales*, or the nine days of prayer traditionally observed for a pope. Please pray for Pope Francis today, that he might be in Heavenly paradise. Please also pray for the College of Cardinals. Their task is a weighty one. The man selected as the Vicar of Christ, the successor of Peter, has an unenviable responsibility and burden. Pray that the Cardinals, and the man elected Pope, will be docile and receptive to the Holy Spirit.

I think of a legendary quote from Pope St. John XXIII, who in the evening—after a long, hard day—would pray, "It's your Church Lord, I'm going to bed." It is the Lord's Church. The Lord is the one who is in charge; we have no need to worry or fret. However, we should pray that the Lord's will be done in this conclave. As a pastorate, we will be offering our 5:15 PM Mass on Tuesday for the conclave. This Mass will be followed by a Holy Hour. I hope you all can join!


