Saint of the Week

Saint Rose of Lima 1586 - 1617

Saint Rose of Lima was born when South America was in its first century of evangelization. Having a deep admiration of Catherine of Siena, Saint Rose carried out, what would be considered, an extreme attempt to avoid anything that would endanger her relationship with God. One thing she considered a distraction was her beauty, so Rose used to rub her face with pepper to produce "disfiguring blotches". In addition, she used to wear a crown of silver with studs that pierced her head like a crown of thorns.

Being refused to enter a convent by her father, Rose opened a room in her house where she cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick. Her care of these less fortunate lead to the start of Social Services in Peru.

A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today's gospel reading is striking. Whenever we read the gospel it's important to imagine the vocal undertone of Christ's words. Like any other person, sometimes His voice would have been gentle and calm, and sometimes it would have been tense. And in today's gospel Jesus proclaims: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." There's a vibrant urgency to these words that must have been apparent in His voice.

What does He mean? Why is He so passionate about this? In the ancient Jewish world, fire was generally associated with judgment. We usually associate judgment with punishment. Yet Christ himself said in the gospel of John that He did not come to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. So what kind of judgment does Jesus bring? He brings the judgment of the Cross. He brings the judgment that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son for us. He brings the judgment that brought Saint Paul to exclaim that, "He loved me and He gave himself for me." So when we really look at the crucifix we see the judgment of God. We see the horror of sin and the infinitely greater love of God who came to die, to set us free from sin, and unite us to Himself.

Christ reaffirms this in today's gospel when he says that there is a baptism with which He must be baptized, and that He's in anguish until it's accomplished. The Greek verb we translate as baptize is *baptizein*, which literally means to submerge. It refers to a difficult experience, and here Christ is referring to His suffering, death, and resurrection. Christ came, then, to set the earth on fire by His death and resurrection. That brought us into a new relationship with Him, setting us free to truly love Him and, in Him, to truly love others. And He invites us to share in that cruciform fire, to say with Him: "I also have a mission to set the world on fire with freedom and love for God."

St. Therese of Avila said that the Devil likes to incite us to think about the great things we might someday do for God, and to forget about the good we can actually do right now. And there's one thing that we can all do that seems very small, but it makes all the difference in the world. We can invite someone else to the Sacraments. As Catholics we believe that the Mass renews Christ's sacrifice on the Cross. Jesus loved each one of us, personally, and died for us. He has wanted to stay with us in the Eucharist until the end of time. We're never alone; God is near us. We also believe that Jesus wants to forgive our sins in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. No matter what we've done or failed to do, He wants to give us the tremendous joy of hearing the words: "I absolve you from your sins in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

If we really believe that, why not invite someone else to experience it, too? Most of us know someone who has fallen away from the Church. Why not tell them about our experience of Reconciliation and invite them to go, too? Or why not invite them to come to Mass some Sunday? We also know people who are searching in life for meaning, we can invite them to OCIA, a non judgmental opportunity to encounter God in Christ Jesus and His Church. Just think if every active parishioner invited just one person to OCIA, an encounter with Christ and His Church, how quickly our parishes would grow and be transformed.

The little things make the greatest difference. A tiny spark can set the world ablaze. Every Sunday, in the Mass we prepare to receive a small host transformed into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. God takes the little things and makes them into something unfathomably great – he wants us to share in that same power of his eternal love.

Flowers with Long Roots by Tim and Mandy Weaver St. Mary's Parishioners


Longtime St. Mary parishioner, Fred Klinker, farmed in Montgomery County, Indiana. Along with his normal crops of corn, soybeans, and wheat, Fred was known to have a very nice flower garden. One of his prized flowers was a variety of Canna Lily called Tall Tropicana Black that has glossy, dark maroon leaves with brilliant red, orange flowers.

Approximately 50 years ago, Fred gave several of his Canna bulbs to his relative Dee Newell, also a St. Mary parishioner.

After the expansion of St. Mary's in 2001, Dee started maintaining and landscaping the area outside the doors entering the Gathering Space. One of the first things Dee planted was his prized maroon Canna Lilies.

Dee passed the torch to Tim and Mandy Weaver (Fred Klinker's niece). They have continued the tradition of planting the bulbs in the spring and storing the bulbs over the winter. So, as you walk inside the doors of the Cathedral, be mindful of and enjoy the three generations of parishioners who have been caretakers of these flowers.

Lift High the Cross

Text: George William Kitchin (1827–1912), revised by Michael R. Newbolt (1874–1956)

Tune: CRUCIFER, Sydney Hugo Nicholson (1875–1947)

Sir Sydney Nicholson composed the hymn tune *CRUCIFER* in 1916. The text, "Lift High the Cross," calls Christians to unite in proclaiming Christ's victory through the cross—a paradoxical symbol of both suffering and triumph.

We sing this hymn today as the Entrance Hymn, which is part of the Introductory Rites of the Mass. These rites are designed "to ensure that the faithful who come together as one establish communion and dispose themselves properly to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily" (Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship, no. 140). The refrain, with its repeated cry, "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim till all the world adore his sacred name", reminds us who and why we worship and perfectly serves the purpose of gathering us as one body of Christ. The upward opening leaps of the two notes in the hymn tune beautifully reflect the words "lift high the cross," giving the music a sense of rising strength and proclamation.

May we be gathered, as one body in Christ in both voice and spirit, to praise to the Risen One who died and rose for us.

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last Tuesday, many of our schools in Lafayette opened their doors for another academic year. It is exciting to have all our students and teachers back! Please pray for all our faculty and students, that they might have a successful year and might draw closer to Jesus Christ and His Church.



With the start of the school year, it is also a good time to reflect in gratitude on the gift of education and the importance of educators in our Catholic tradition. Reflecting on the gift of Catholic education and the purpose of Catholic schools, Archbishop J. Michael Miller (former Archbishop of Vancouver) lists out five principles that should mark a Catholic school. I believe these marks can also apply to all educators who seek to draw people closer to Jesus Christ.

They are inspired by a supernatural vision — They set their students minds on Heaven

They are founded on a Christian anthropology — They teach the truth of the human person as God created us
They are animated by community and communion — This is lived out perfectly in the celebration of the Eucharistic liturgy

They are sustained by Gospel witness— The faculty and staff are a witness of the Gospel and always point toward Jesus Christ

Pope Benedict XVI, when speaking to educators, echoes this point about teachers being a witness of the Gospel. Pope Benedict says, "The central figure in the work of educating...is specifically the form of witness...The witness never refers to himself but to something, or rather, to Someone greater than he, whom he has encountered and whose dependable goodness he has sampled. Thus, every educator and witness finds an unequaled model in Jesus Christ, the Father's great witness, who said nothing about himself but spoke as the Father had taught him [cf. John 8:28]." (Address from June 6, 2005)

Let us pray for all teachers, educators, catechists, and individuals who will help form students over the course of this academic year. Let us pray that they might be that Gospel witness and always point their students toward the true and perfect teacher, Jesus Christ.




