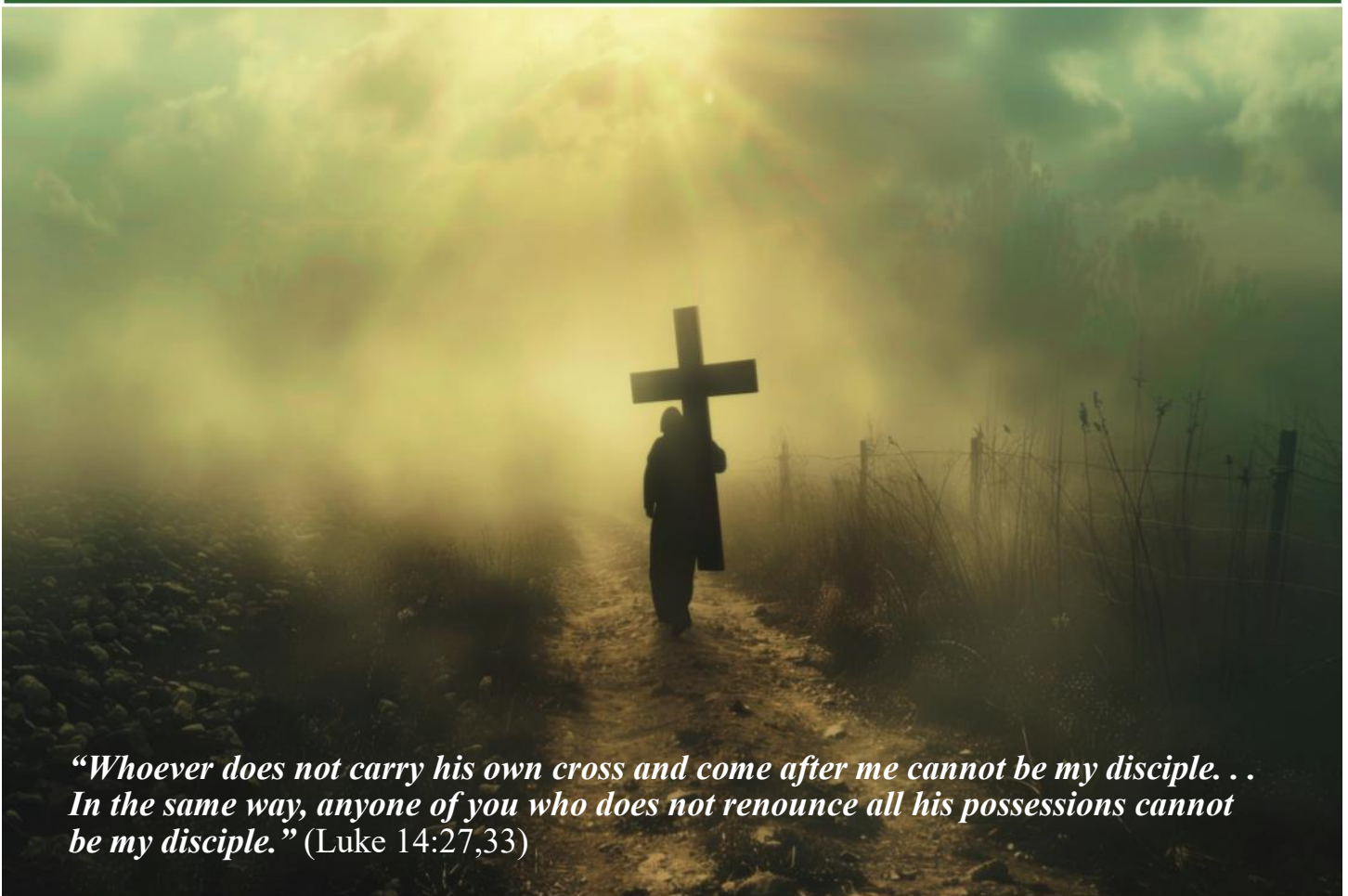

Saint of the Week

Saint John Chrysostom
347 - 407

Saint John Chrysostom, one of the early Church Fathers, was often called the “golden-mouthed preacher” because of his gift with words which developed from his life as a hermit in which he spent much time in silent prayer, penance, and fasting. His words, when preaching, were not easy to listen to and met with resistance, particularly by the rich.

Nominated as an archbishop of Constantinople against his will, he reminded the wealthy that they had no right to withhold their riches from a brother or sister. In addition, he also deposed of corrupt bishops and refused to cater to those used to eating well at the bishop’s tables.

Upon his death, St. John Chrysostom uttered these words: “Glory to God for all things.”

A Message from our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Brothers and sisters in Christ,



God needs you and so does your parish family. *"I thirst"* Jn. 19:28 and *"It is finished."* Jn. 19:30

This week in his weekly Wednesday Catechesis Pope Leo XIV communicates to the Church, *"At the heart of the account of the Passion, in the most luminous and at the same time darkest moment of Jesus' life, the Gospel of John gives us two words that contain an immense mystery: 'I thirst' (19:28), and immediately afterwards: 'It is finished' (19:30). These are His last words, but they are filled with a whole lifetime, revealing the meaning of the entire existence of the Son of God. On the cross, Jesus does not appear as a victorious hero, but as a supplicant for love. He does not proclaim, condemn or defend himself. He humbly asks for what He, alone, cannot give to Himself in any way.*

The thirst of the Crucified Lord is not only the physiological need of a tortured body. It is also, and above all, the expression of a profound desire: that of love, of relationship, of communion. It is the silent cry of a God who, having wished to share everything of our human condition, also lets Himself be overcome by this thirst.

This is the Christian paradox: God saves not by doing, but by letting Himself do. Not by defeating evil with force, but by accepting the weakness of love to the very end. **On the cross, Jesus teaches us that man does not realize himself in power, but in trustful openness to others**, even when they are hostile and enemies. **Salvation is not found in autonomy, but in humbly recognizing one's own need and in being able to express it freely.** The fulfillment of our humanity in God's plan is not an act of strength, but a gesture of trust.

I ask for your trust and to accept an invitation

As we prepare to transition from summer to fall and as the start of a new school year is upon us, so too, do we resume parish/pastorate activities. As we continue our mission of knowing, loving and serving the Lord as His disciples, **I want to invite all of you to consider attending a listening session to help my leadership (Ms. Kelli Conlon & Mr. Roy Molter) and me understand who we are as a pastorate.** The result of your answers will help us focus on our greatest areas of need. There will be a facilitator and note-taker and myself (perhaps an associate pastor at each of these sessions.) The groups will have up to 20 people and the following three questions will be asked of everyone to share with the group. These questions are meant to be grounded in a discernment guided by the Holy Spirit of how best we grow as disciples in love and service of Jesus and His Church.

- As a disciple of Jesus what is most inspirational to you in regard to our parish/pastorate?
- As a disciple of Jesus what is an area of opportunity for our parish/pastorate?
- Having answered the first two questions and heard the responses of the group, what is the one thing you would like to add in regards to our parish/pastorate?

A Message from Dr. Wendy Yuen



Christopher Walker's (b. 1947) *Laudate, Laudate Dominum* is a song that reminds us of the joy of praising God together. Written for the dedication of the Cathedral of Our Lady of Los Angeles, it has since resounded in great celebrations of the Church, including the Papal Mass during Pope Francis' visit to Washington, D.C., in 2015. The words "*Laudate Dominum*" mean "*Praise the Lord*"—a call that echoes across centuries of Christian worship.

For Christopher, text has primacy over music in worship. His inspiration for composing is to serve the Church, with the hope that his music sparks faith in people, encouraging them to "*sing, have faith, and carry on.*" That spirit shines beautifully in *Laudate, Laudate Dominum*. It is more than music - it is prayer, joy, and unity woven together.

Let us raise our voices, and together proclaim: *Laudate Dominum—Praise the Lord!*

A Message from Fr. Joshua and Rachel Witt

Praised be Jesus Christ, Now and Forever...

Greetings to you all, and thank you for reading my bulletin article. I am grateful to be able to share some of my thoughts with you all a few times each month. I am hoping to keep checking in with you for the next several months through bulletin articles, so I look forward to that, dear friends.



This weekend is significant because in Rome, Italy, two individuals will be canonized and declared “Saints” – Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis on September 7th. And our American Chicago-born Pope Leo XIV will be the one led by the Holy Spirit as things unfold. I heard from a young adult from our local area the other day who was planning to travel to Rome to attend a significant event. Also, Fr. Dominic Petan, a former pastor of Saint Mary’s Cathedral and currently the Vicar for Clergy and Director of Vocations, will be in attendance as well.

Pier Giorgio Frassati was given the name “The Man of the Beatitudes,” and his often-quoted words “*Verso l’alto!*” (“To the Heights!”) reminding us of the importance of keeping Heaven on our sights. He loved climbing mountains, and the goal of a mountain climber is to reach the summit of a mountain. Similarly, a follower of Jesus Christ, moving through life and in the life of faith, is striving and moving towards the goal of Heaven. Pier Giorgio Frassati had a love for serving the poor. And, he found his strength in the Eucharist both at Mass and in time with the Lord Jesus in Adoration.

Carlo Acutis said that the Eucharist was his “Highway to Heaven.” Jesus and Carlo were tight, and their relationship was sound. His love for Jesus and the Eucharist was contagious, as Carlo’s mom specifically experienced a turnaround in her life, growing more and more in her relationship with God, because of the witness of her son. Please remember dear young people, that like Carlo, your love for God can spread to your loved ones and those around you. Your witness is essential! Carlo’s love for the Eucharist and Eucharistic Miracles led him to create a website that is still in existence. 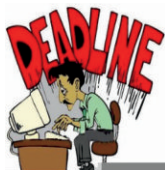
