Saint of the Week

Saint John Bosco, Patron of Educators
1815 - 1888

Ordained to the priesthood in 1841, Saint John Bosco dedicated his life to working with young people, particularly the poor ones. He believed in educating the whole person, body and soul, and placing students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. To do this, he opened an Oratory (a special community) focusing on vocational education for boys. With the generous donations of wealthy patrons, he was able to provide the boys with skills in shoemaking, tailoring, and printing. John realized the importance of job training and the self worth and pride that come with developing talents and abilities.

With the encouragement of Pope Pius IX, John Bosco founded the Salesians in 1859 with just 17 men. Their focus was, and still is, on education using a nurturing approach to bring Christ's love to youth. A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Life in Christ...



Today, we are now at the **beginning** of the public ministry of Jesus. We hear proclaimed in the Gospel some **beautiful and powerful words** from Jesus. He says to these four fishermen:

I will make you fishers of men.

In His public ministry, one of the first actions Jesus took was to begin **to call disciples** to Himself. This wasn't something out of the ordinary for the time. It was not out of the ordinary for a Jewish rabbi to have disciples. The disciples of a rabbi would learn from him and model his way of life within the Jewish faith. Since books were not a common household item, learning new things and new ideas was not as easy as it is today. Back then to learn, one had to engage in conversation with others and listen to a Rabbi speak.

As such, when Jesus called the first apostles, they understood what was happening to some degree. But there was something **very different** about these disciples. Whereas the Jewish rabbis shared ideas, Jesus shared **himself**. Whereas the Jewish rabbis repeated a message, Jesus **was** the message. Whereas the Jewish rabbis had disciples who **imitated** their way of life, Jesus had disciples who **participated** in His life.

In this last distinction, what's the **difference** between imitation and participation? **A lot!**

Children may idolize a **sports star** and want to throw a football or shoot a basket just the way a famous athlete does. In this sense, these youngsters **imitate their favorite athlete**. Other children may idolize a **superhero**, and they may want to wear a mask and a cap and save the world the way the superhero does. When they dress up in this way, they are imitating what they saw in a movie or read in a **book**.

But when we as Catholics follow Christ, we **are not** merely imitating Christ. We are actually, because of **baptism**, participating in His life in a real way. We are **not just imitators** of Christ! By baptism, we are **in Christ**. That's why our charity springs from the charity of Christ. That's why our prayer is joined to the prayer of Christ. That's why our sufferings are in Christ's sufferings. We have a participation in Christ's sufferings because Christ is really in His mystical body. We are the body; He is the Head.

For these four fishermen, they are not going **to just follow** Christ; they are going to, by their baptism and **the laying on of hands**, become **another Christ** (*Alter Christus*) in the world, taking on His mission in a way that they are participating truly in this work of God.

Saint John Paul II in many of his teachings had a favorite passage from the constitution on the Church in the Modern World of the Second Vatican Council, *Gaudium et Spes* (n. 22): "The truth is that only in the mystery of the incarnate Word does the mystery of man take on light. For Adam, the first man, was a figure of Him who was to come, namely Christ the Lord. Christ, the final Adam, by the revelation of the mystery of the Father and His love, fully reveals man to himself and makes his supreme calling clear. [...] Through Christ and in Christ, the riddles of sorrow and death grow meaningful. Apart from His Gospel, they overwhelm us."

Everyone at some point in their life feels overwhelmed, disoriented, and questioning the meaning of their life or how they're living it. The distress doesn't just focus on the moment you're trying to face; it makes you think of the road traveled and where you want to go from here. It's in that moment that Christ wants to be your light, if you let Him. Let Him light the way and give meaning to even the most apparently meaningless things in your life.

This week, let us start by allowing Jesus to *make us fishers of men*...

Dear Saint Mary Cathedral and Saint Ann Church & Shrine Pastorate Family,



Praise be Jesus Christ, now and forever! I recently had an experience I thought I would share with all of you since Joni said I was up to write a column in the bulletin. Over here in Kuwait, the local Church recently had a Solemnity on Saturday, 17 January 2026 – [the Solemnity of Our Lady of Arabia](#). I have been devoted to our Mother Mary for many years because each of us has a special place in the Immaculate Heart of Saint Mary. Specifically, we have many ways to go to our Mother Mary as sons and daughters, especially by praying the Holy Rosary each day.

As we enjoy titles of Mary in the United States, such as the Immaculate Conception, Our Lady of Guadalupe, and even Our Lady of America, in Kuwait and other parts of the Middle East, Mary's special title is [Our Lady of Arabia](#). A significant event occurred on Friday, 16 January 2026, that I was able to attend and be part of, namely, attending the Mass of Dedication naming [the parish Church of Our Lady of Arabia a Minor Basilica](#). This is the first Church in Kuwait to be elevated to the rank of a Minor Basilica. It is also the oldest Catholic Church in the State of Kuwait. [Pope Leo XIV](#) sent his Secretary of State, [Pietro Cardinal Parolin](#), to preside over the special Mass. One of the prayer intentions I definitely brought to this Mass was for **peace in our world**, especially in the Middle East and back home in the States. There is so much angst and disunity, and, frankly, many people in our world are just not aware of the God who loves all people. Please join me in praying for peace each day, especially for unity between nations. The consolation of attending this special Mass last Friday for the Dedication of Our Lady of Arabia Parish Church, now Our Lady of Arabia Minor Basilica, was getting to meet many more priests, including Cardinal Parolin. I shook the Cardinal's hand, spoke to him, letting him know where I am from, and extending my appreciation to our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV. I even gave Cardinal Parolin a gift to give to Pope Leo XIV.

In conclusion, I continue to pray for all of you, dear parishioners, my sisters and brothers in Christ, and I depend on all of your prayers as well. **Thank you for all the amazing Christmas gifts, cards, and love that many of you sent my way to bring me some comfort while I am away from you all. Some of you have asked if there is anything else that I need over here in Kuwait. Yes, we need Keurig Coffee Pods for our Chapel, where guests come visit 24/7 for some rest and relaxation (and coffee).** At this point, I believe we are good on espresso coffee beans.

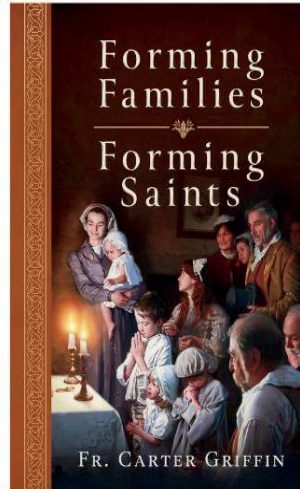

All People That On Earth Do Dwell

All People That on Earth Do Dwell is a proclamation of who we are before God and why we gather to worship. From the first notes, the hymn invites every voice to join in praise. Worship here is cheerful, confident, and communal. We come before the Lord with rejoicing hearts.

This sense of joyful confidence is strengthened by the hymntune **OLD HUNDREDTH**, one of the most familiar and beloved melodies in the Church's musical tradition. Its strong, balanced phrases and steady forward motion give the congregation a firm musical foundation, making it possible for everyone to sing together with conviction.

At the heart of the hymn is a clear confession of faith: the Lord is God indeed. God is our Creator, who made us without our aid, and our Shepherd, who claims us as his people and cares for us faithfully. We sing because we belong to God, and our praise rises naturally from gratitude and trust.

As the hymn unfolds, praise becomes more than sound—it becomes movement toward God. We approach God's presence with thanksgiving and joy, blessing God's holy Name because it is right to do so. The enduring goodness, mercy, and truth of God give us every reason to sing with confidence, even in changing times.

Joined by the strength of **OLD HUNDREDTH**, our voices are lifted into a song that reaches beyond ourselves. We are united with the whole Church—on earth and in heaven—offering praise to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In singing this hymn, we take our place in a chorus of glory, now and forever.

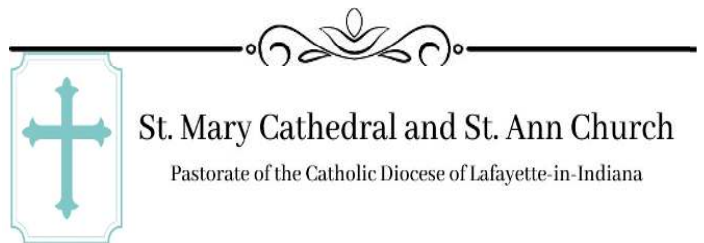
