A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

Christian Leadership Starts with Personal Example



Every single one of us is called by Christ to be a leader, in some way or another. We are all called to have a positive influence on others, on those around us. Maybe some of us can have a wider influence, because of a special God-given talent or an important position in society which gives us a wider reach. But every one of us has some kind of reach: within our family, with our friends, classmates, coworkers, within our community and country...

We are not just isolated, single-cell organisms. No: we are all involved in a unique, complex network of relationships - every one of us. And Jesus is reminding us today, energetically, that we are called to be salt and light in every one of those relationships - to share with others the meaning, the hope, the forgiveness, the goodness we ourselves have received from the Lord. This is every Christian's job, because the Sermon on the Mount - today's Gospel passage is taken from the Sermon on the Mount - is meant for every Christian.

So how do we do it? How do we exercise this Christian leadership, this influence of salt and light? Jesus makes it clear that the first and foremost way of being the leaders we are called to be is through our personal example. ". . . *Your light must shine before others,*" he explains, "*that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.*" As members of a family, we are well aware that it takes all members to serve unconditionally and sacrificially for the success of the whole, and so too with our faith family known as a parish, diocese and universal Church. The Church and her ministries are very important to the very fabric of society.

The Annual Catholic Ministry Appeal (CMA) is a chance for Catholic Leadership to shine. CMA supports our seminarians and vocations, clergy and permanent deacons, Catholic schools, college ministries, Hispanic Ministry, the Saint Joseph Retreat & Conference Center, charity and donations. CMA directly supports our parishes and schools through assistance with administration, building services, human resources, communication, stewardship, technology, pastoral accompaniment and leadership development, the marriage tribunal and divine worship. Our pastorate goal is \$269,000; if we exceed that goal, we will keep the first 25% overage. I have listed that here as we do have some important maintenance needs:

St. Mary Cathedral: \$205,000 x 25% = \$51,250
St. Ann Catholic Church: \$64,000 x 25% = \$16,000

My prayer is that we meet our goal by March 25th in honor of The Annunciation of the Lord - through 100% participation so that we are a model for the diocese in our response to our ***Called to Serve***, and we can move forward with our pastorate/parish mission.

The Catholic Ministries Appeal (CMA) 2026 Commitment weekend is this weekend February 7/8, 2026. Please bring your CMA pledge to Mass where we will have a special collection. I also ask that you make part of your daily prayer our beautiful CMA prayer for the success of our campaign.

Merciful and Loving God, You tell us in your Word, "*As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied grace*" (1 Peter 4:10). By the power of your Holy Spirit, help us to love and serve You above all. Grant us the grace and courage to serve others as Jesus did, that we may show mercy, compassion, and kindness toward all. As we participate in the Catholic Ministries Appeal to support Christ's mission in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana, grant us generous hearts that recognize all we have is a gift from God. May we share your gifts and your love with others through our service, reflecting your presence in all we do.

With Mary and Joseph, we ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

A Message from Fr. Joshua

Dear sisters, brothers, my friends in Christ.



In a few weeks, Lent will begin. Please plan for this upcoming Season of Lent by committing to a 40 Day focus on **Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving!** **Prayer** opportunities will be available, including our Eucharist celebrations and spending time in Eucharistic Adoration. There is always the Liturgy of the Hours (<https://divineoffice.org/>), and the familiar traditional devotions such as the Stations of the Cross (please look for opportunities on our Fridays of Lent), and of course, pray your daily rosaries. I heard a cute quote long ago about Mary and the devotion to pray the Rosary. The quote says: *"Call your Mother, she hasn't heard from you in decades."* Pray also for our OCIA friends!

Then, there is **Fasting**. Fasting can be both communal and individual. We will have Fasting and Abstinence Days on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Additionally, all Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat. Remember, fasting under normal conditions involves having one normal-sized meal and two smaller meals each day. Let's do our best to keep our meals simple on our Fasting Days this coming Lent. One element of fasting is remembering those who are poor and have less than we do. We can also consider what we will give up this Lent or what we decide to do less of (maybe less complaining, good one for me) as we all strive to grow closer to God. For example, you might be zealous and say, "I will not watch TV this Lent." Well, how about watching only faith-centered content on television or online that might inspire you in your walk with the Lord? The Chosen Series (<https://watch.thechosen.tv/>) is definitely a must-see!

Finally, **Almsgiving** is the third area we focus on in Lent. Remember that Almsgiving includes works of charity, participation in supporting a local charity or non-profit, or extending a hand to support the poor. I know that at Saint Ann Church in Lafayette, Indiana, we have a Matthew 25 Soup Kitchen (<https://smcsaclafayette.org/matthew-25-soup-kitchen>) that provides meals and other items to people in need five days a week. They are always looking for donations to bolster their food supply so they can take care of the guests who visit. We are truly blessed to be able to take care of others, and we need not look far. Also, consider sharing your treasure for our **Catholic Ministries Appeal 2026** with the awesome theme **"Called to Serve"** (1 Peter 4:10). We can all give something, no matter the amount. Remember the wisdom of Matthew 6:3-4: *"Don't let your right hand know what your left hand is doing."* (<http://www.dol-in.org/cma>)

In conclusion, I still miss you all terribly. I ask you to continue to pray for me, the people I serve with (chaplains and religious affairs airmen), and the military members we are serving with over here. Things are tense right now, and I have spoken with many anxious heroes who are here voluntarily serving our nation. Each of them raised their right hand, like I did, to protect our nation. One quote from G.K. Chesterton brings me some comfort these days: *"The soldier goes to war not because he hates the enemy in front of him, but because he loves those he has left behind him."*

Why We Need a Choir

From the earliest days of God's people, worship was never meant to be a solo act. Scripture tells us, "*Come, let us sing joyfully to the Lord (Psalm 95:1)*". God calls His people to lift their voices together - and a choir helps make that possible.

In the Old Testament, King David appointed trained singers to lead worship in the Temple (1 Chronicles 25:1). Their music was not for performance, but for prayer. Through song, they proclaimed God's word and helped the whole community worship more deeply.

After the exile, when Jerusalem was rebuilt, Scripture records that "*The singers sang loudly with joy, and the sound was heard far away*" (Nehemiah 12:43). A choir was a sign that worship—and hope—had returned.


