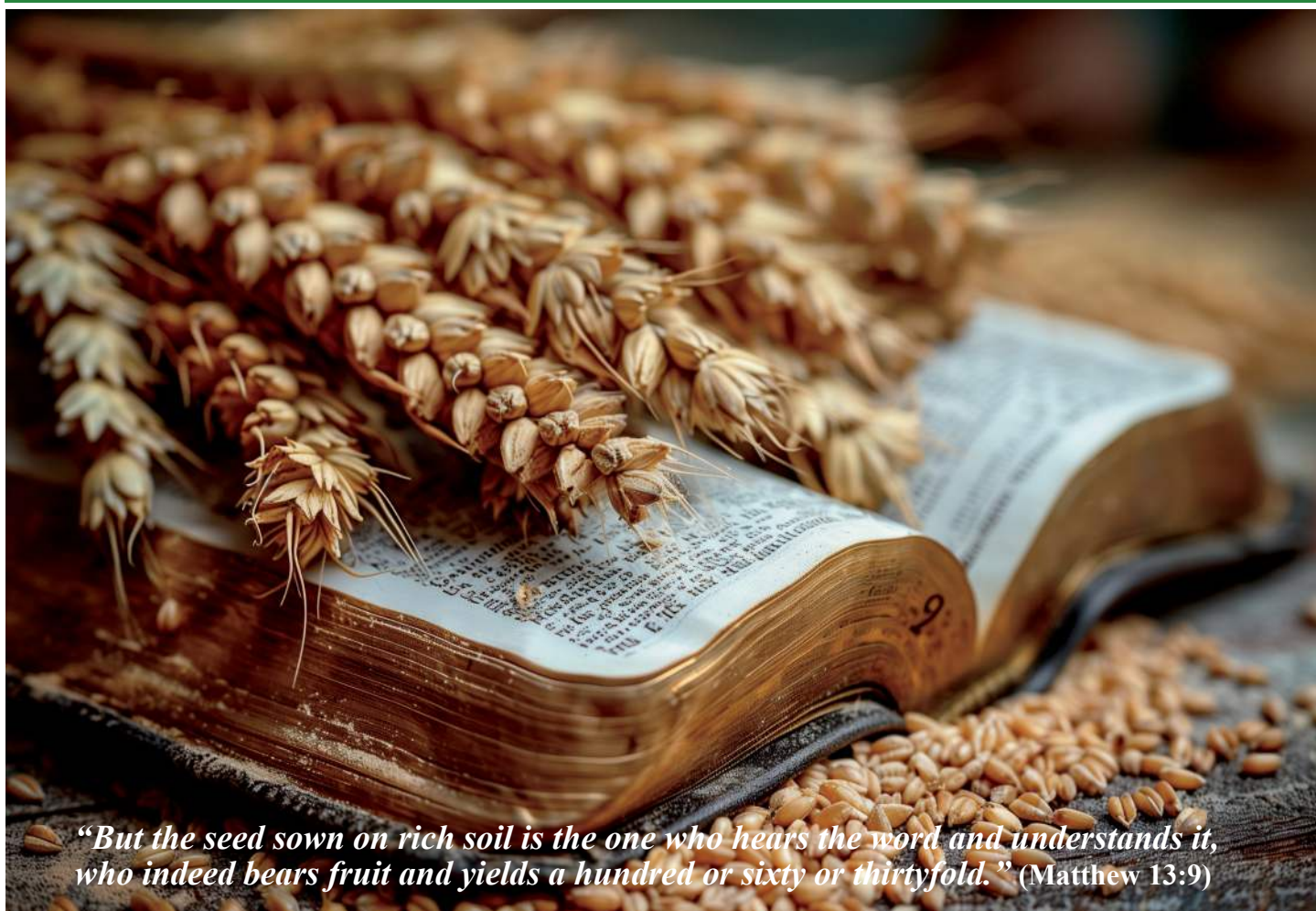

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Saint of the Week

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, Virgin
1656 - 1680

Born about 150 miles north of New York City, Saint Kateri lost her parents and little brother at the age of 4 to the smallpox epidemic. Kateri, too, was infected and was left disfigured and half blind. Adopted by her uncle who hated the presence of the Jesuit missionaries in the villages. Kateri, on the contrary was moved by their teaching, and at the age of 19 was baptized. But her conversion to Catholicism and refusal to marry caused her to be treated like a slave.

One night, at the prompting of a priest, Saint Kateri ran away and began a 200 mile walking journey to a Christian Indian village near Montreal. At the age of 23, she took a vow of virginity and lived out the remainder of her life practicing severe fasting as penance for the conversion of her nation. Saint Kateri died at the age of 24, and witnesses said her emaciated face had changed color and became like that of a healthy child upon her death. In 2012, Saint Kateri became the first North American native to be canonized.

A Message from Our Pastor, Fr. Ted Dudzinski

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Authentic Care for God's Creation.



Jesus knew how to communicate. He was the incarnate Word of God, true God and true man. As God, He understood all truth, and as man, He knew how to explain the truths of salvation in ways that we would understand. One of His favorite ways to explain things was through the use of parables, like the one in our Gospel this weekend. Parables are comparisons. They use a familiar, earthly reality to illustrate a difficult, divine reality, a truth about God and God's plan of salvation. The main point of the parable of the sower is that God is not going to save us and fill us with his grace and wisdom all by Himself. He will do so only if we let Him, because He respects our freedom, and longs for our friendship, not our slavery. And we let Him by responding humbly and obediently to His action in our lives. God plants the seed and gives it life, but He leaves it up to us to prepare the soil and tend the garden.

The lesson is important enough to warrant an entire homily. But a less obvious lesson in today's Reading is also important. In this and many other parables, Jesus takes His examples from nature. And in the First Reading and Psalm, the prophet Isaiah does the same thing. And in the Second Reading, St. Paul points out that all of creation has been effected by the sin of mankind, and all of creation is involved in Christ's redemption. Today, God is reminding us of how Christians should think about the environment, the physical universe in which we live.

And considering the confusion that abounds on this issue, it's worth taking some time to reflect on that reminder. How are we called to be responsible stewards of God's creation? These are the three key ideas behind the Christian's beautiful, true view of the environment.

- The natural world is God's gift to us, a book where we can contemplate His beauty, wisdom, and power, where we can experience His love.
- The natural world is not itself divine, but the result of God's creating word.
- The natural world is not superior to human life, nor is it even on the same level as human life: on the contrary, the flourishing of human life is the crown and purpose, the "center and summit" of the natural world.

Unfortunately, these truths often get lost in today's debates about environmental issues. One of the reasons may be that even we Christians don't always live in accordance with this beautiful vision of creation. Like all gifts, the gift of creation can be abused. As children of God, we are gardeners and stewards of creation, but we are not always good gardeners and stewards. Too often the gifts God has given us are used selfishly and destructively. As the Catechism puts it (#2415): *"Man's dominion over inanimate and other living beings granted by the Creator is not absolute; it is limited by concern for the quality of life of his neighbor, including generations to come; it requires a religious respect for the integrity of creation."*

Creation is God's gift to us, and we should use the gift responsibly, that means enjoying it, contemplating it, developing its potential, and also taking care of it. When we do that, it becomes a source of joy, inspiration, and prosperity.

Today, as Jesus renews his commitment to us in Holy Communion, let's renew our gratitude to Him for the gift of creation, and let's also renew our personal commitment to use all of God's gifts exactly as He hopes we will.

In gratitude for God's gift of life and all of His creation let us pray for the grace to care for and be good stewards of His creation.

The parking lot repairs were completed this week. Once we do the master plan and determine what construction will look like we will look into resurfacing the entire lot. The repairs are just to make sure we do not have any safety concerns on the lot until we are able to do a full resurfacing. The bell system will be installed next week; we look forward to having operational bells again. Thank you to all who have contributed in some way towards the cost of the system.

St. Mary Facility Updates

I understand the T-coil has had its ups and downs the last few weeks. If you are trying to get on, call me in the parish office and I will give you the IP address to type in so that you can save it to your favorites and use the system. We hope to have the final fix on the network issue very soon. If you have not noticed the changes to the gathering space, please take time to have a look. In addition to the new seating, we have painted an accent wall to help tie everything together. Some things that are coming down the path are sealing of the church exterior, repairs to the steeple, repairs to the roof, and interior wood floor repairs and sealing in the church. You will be hearing more about this in the near future from the building committee.

St. Mary Cemetery Updates

Work continues on cleanup around the cemetery - old overgrown areas are being cleaned out and prepared for future landscape, mowing has been non-stop since March, and several other areas are being addressed as we move towards an even more beautiful cemetery campus. Our Sexton started concrete foundations this week for grave markers and hopes to move through the backlog quickly. Our maintenance staff has helped install new garage doors on the barn as we prepare to replace the roof and siding. We look forward to having this much needed maintenance done to the barn so it will last for several more years to come. A boundary tracing was done so we have a clear recorded picture of the cemetery property. This will also be important as we do landscape and other property improvements.

In Our Pastorate

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

First, thank you. Thank you for your prayers, letters, messages, coffee, and support during my recent six-month deployment to Kuwait as an Air National Guard chaplain. Knowing that my parish family at Saint Mary Cathedral and Saint Ann Church and Shrine was praying for me was a tremendous source of strength.



Returning home from military service is a blessing, but it is also a journey. During deployment, chaplains accompany service members through moments of great stress, suffering, grief, and uncertainty. Those experiences can leave what some have called "invisible wounds" or **moral injuries**—deep spiritual, emotional, and psychological wounds that can arise when one witnesses or experiences the harsh realities of conflict. As one scholar has written, war can "wreck the soul as well."

As I continue my own transition home, I want you to know that I am working with a counselor through the Veterans Administration (VA) and making use of the many resources available to veterans. Healing is a journey, and I am grateful not to walk it alone.

I also ask for your understanding and forgiveness. If at times I have seemed distracted, unusually quiet, short-tempered, or simply not quite myself, please know that I am continuing to readjust and heal. If I have unintentionally hurt or disappointed anyone, I sincerely ask your pardon.

Please continue to pray for me, for all veterans and for their families. The Church reminds us that no one should carry their burdens alone, for "the whole Church takes up the burden" through prayer and love. Be assured of my prayers for each of you.

Music and Liturgy A Message from Dr. Wendy Yu

Seeds, Scattered and Sown



In the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1–23), Jesus tells of a farmer who scatters seed over every kind of ground. Some seed is lost, some withers, and some bears an abundant harvest. The sower casts the seed to different ground. The parable reminds us that while every heart receives God's Word differently, God never ceases to offer his grace with patience, and hope.

Dan Feiten's *Seed, Scattered and Sown* beautifully extends this image into the mystery of the Eucharist. The hymn traces the journey of grain and grapes from the fields to the altar, where the gifts of creation become the sacramental signs through which Christ nourishes his Church. Nourished by the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation, we are drawn into communion with Christ and with one another.

The life of St. John Bosco (1815-1888) beautifully reflects the generosity of the sower. Serving abandoned, delinquent boys in nineteenth-century Turin, he refused to see anyone as beyond hope. He believed that every young person possessed a good heart waiting to be nurtured. Around 1850, Don Bosco began identifying boys who showed signs of a vocation to the priesthood. In 1859 with 22 of them, he formed the Society of St. Francis de Sales—the Salesian Society. In the 1870s, with St. Mary Domenica Mazzarello he founded the Salesian Sisters to do the same sort of work for poor girls. Don Bosco understood that his role was to sow faithfully and cultivate what God had begun.

As we sing *Seed, Scattered and Sown*, we are invited to become both good soil and generous sowers. May our hearts be open to receive God's Word, and may the Eucharist strengthen us to share Christ's love, trusting that God will bring forth a harvest beyond what we can see.

Do you feel alone and floundering in a storm-tossed sea after the loss of a loved one? If so, you are not alone.

Grieving comes to everyone in one form or another. It is part of the life experience. For many, it can become a lonely process that calls for support from someone who has experienced grief first-hand. *Grieving with Great Hope* is about understanding what to expect and providing the support of others who understand.

Grieving with Great Hope is not an effort to move you away from the remembrance of your loved one, but an effort to support you as you move forward in the grieving process. It is not a counseling program, but caring support from those who understand grieving.

Grieving with Great Hope is a five week program offered on Thursday evenings in August in the lower level of St. Mary Cathedral in the Bishop Higi Room. A donation of \$20 is requested to offset material costs. Pre-registration is required as a minimum of 6 participants is needed to conduct the workshop.
