# Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 30:2, 4-6, 11-13

The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme found in the First Reading: that God can transform events that might be considered to be curses and make them into blessings.

It is interesting that the psalm does not say that God will do away with all of our difficulties. It is assumed that there will be moments of mourning and discouragement and that there will be moments when we suffer the consequences of our sins.

Our hope lies in the fact that God will soon deliver us from our grief, and will always be willing to forgive us our faults.

In these Easter weeks we celebrate the victory of life over death, of light over darkness. This is the reason for mentioning the dawn (the time of the day when Jesus rose from the dead). Yet, we still experience death (our own and the deaths of those whom we love).

We must walk through the dark valley (the difficulties and discouragements of life), but God will never ask us to face these things alone. His love will change our mourning into dancing. We will never be alone again.
