Key Areas of Focus:

Overview: St. John Neumann (SJN) parish has embarked on a transformative journey in partnership with Divine Renovation (DR) since February 2023. Our mission is evolving from maintenance to a vibrant focus on evangelization, aiming to reach those not yet in our pews while deeply engaging and serving those already part of our community. Our renewed mission emphasizing creating safety, community, and belonging in order to become a Beacon of Light Drawing People Home.

Worship:

Enhancing the Sunday Experience: We are redesigning our Sunday services to be more welcoming to newcomers and engaging for regular attendees. This includes improvements in acoustics, music, and homilies, as well as creating an environment where the Holy Spirit can actively work through the liturgy.

Prayer and Support: Established prayer teams offer support after Mass, and we are enhancing our welcome process with Connect Cards to better recognize and integrate new visitors.

Grow:

Educational and Formation Programs: Thank you to the many parents and students who joined in interview panels over the summer to welcome a new Disciple Development team to SJN. The team has been in place since the end of August and is joyfully preparing to welcome people of all ages into conversations about faith in safe and nurturing ways. SJN seeks to be a place where people can grow in their personal relationships with God, with each another, and receive support as they seek to live authentic lives of faith as leaven in the world.

Parish Covenant: A new parish covenant outlines expectations for both the parish and its members, focusing on Worship, Connect, Grow, and Serve

Connect:

Community Building: We are creating initiatives and community events that will aim to foster belonging and provide spaces for parishioners to connect. We are also focusing on creating small groups to build deeper and more intimate community ties.

Feedback and Communication: Church Chats and the Beacon Newsletter are being used to gather parishioner feedback and communicate how the parish is responding to their needs, in addition to the annual engagement survey each October to measure progress.

Serve:

Leadership Development: We are working on identifying and nurturing new leaders within the parish to expand ministries and service opportunities. The “I see in you the gift of.....” model helps align individuals’ strengths and passions with parish needs.

Structural and Process Evaluations: Teams have reviewed and updated our parish structure, compensation, IT systems, and culture to ensure we are strengthened to support our mission and growth.

Progress and Next Steps:

Formation of Parish Leadership Team: This team collaborates with Fr. Dean, staff, and parishioners to guide our transformation. Many parishioners have also joined committees to work on the structural processes and guide the PLT in mission-critical efforts.

Creation of vision, values, and culture: Our vision is to Be a Beacon of Light Drawing People Home. Our mission is to get as many souls to heaven as possible. This is all supported by our values:

Survey Findings: The Parish Engagement Survey highlighted a highly educated and spiritually engaged community but also pointed to lower engagement levels. Action plans have been developed to address these findings.

The foundation has been laid over the past year to help us develop strategies going forward to move from maintenance to mission focusing on discipleship and evangelization. Based on this foundation, we will develop a strategic plan in late October informed by the upcoming Gallup Faith Member Engagement survey.

Our focus is to deepen our parish's mission, enhance our Sunday Experience, and become a true Beacon of Light for all who seek belonging and meaning, leading them to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ. We continue to seek the Holy Spirit's guidance as we move forward in our journey of renewal.

SJN is in a strong financial position due to the generosity of our parishioners as well as sound financial management by staff and the SJN Finance Council. The amounts set out in the chart below are in thousands of dollars. A break-even budget is planned for fiscal year 2025 (FY25).

Offertory Contributions:

FY24 vs. Budget

- Budget was exceeded \$172K overall.
- Note: The year-end Stewardship Appeal raised \$811K in December 2023 (\$123K over the prior December and the budget).
- Note: Lenten Stewardship Campaign yielded an annualized giving commitment increase of \$274K, some of which was realized in the last four months of FY24.

FY25 vs. FY24

- A \$171K increase is budgeted based on assuming another strong December and parishioner follow-through on commitments made in the FY 2024 Lenten Stewardship Campaign.

RE tuition, Pre-school, Interest, Other

FY25 vs. FY24 - Interest budget decreased \$37K due to smaller cash balances and decreasing interest rates.

Special Collections:

“Special Collections” income is passed through SJN to the “Support for the Poor”, “Catholic Services Appeal”, and “Missions, Disaster Supt., Clergy, ...” expense categories with no impact to SJN surplus or deficit.

Encountering Christ Proceeds:

FY24 vs. Budget - SJN received unbudgeted revenue of \$128K as its share of the diocesan Encountering Christ Campaign (ECC).

FY25 vs. FY24 - Budget decrease of \$104K as proceeds from ECC are expected to wind down this year.

Pastoral, Liturgical, Music:

FY25 vs. FY24 - Increased staffing and payroll costs of \$79K

RE, Social Outreach, Communications:

FY25 vs. FY24 - Increased staffing and program costs of \$67K

General & Administrative:

FY25 vs. FY24

- Investment of \$191K toward a goal of becoming a Divine Renovation parish and fulfilling the vision to be a Beacon of Light Drawing People Home (includes staff development, salaries and benefits for new hires, campus upgrades, and new programming). This investment may be adjusted during the year based on our progress toward our offertory contribution budget.
- Payroll and benefit savings of \$22K for some positions.

Property, Maintenance, Utilities:

FY24 vs. Budget

- HVAC and elevator repair, campus security and signage, LED lighting, sound system upgrades, landscaping, and other miscellaneous expenses resulted in \$167K of expenses over budget.
- Utility expenses (especially electricity) were \$30K over budget. These overages were due in part to SJN's aging HVAC systems and the City of Austin's billing algorithm.
- An unbudgeted accrual of \$100K was made to cover future campus maintenance and enhancement projects. The balance of that account as of 6/30/24 was \$865K of which \$210 was already allocated to projects in process.

FY25 vs. FY24

- \$350K of major repair and maintenance costs and accruals in FY24 are not included in the FY25 budget. Major campus repair and maintenance projects in FY25 are assumed to be covered by the accrual balance mentioned above.
- \$52K increase in costs for routine campus maintenance, services, and utilities.
- \$16K increase in Diocesan insurance charges.
- \$20K decrease in staffing and payroll costs.

Diocesan Assessments:

FY25 vs. FY24

- Increase of \$15K due to increase in Cathedraticum (i.e. payments to the diocese) because of the increase in Offertory Contributions.

Permanent Mortgage: Our debt balance as of June 30, 2024 was \$1,280K at an attractive 3% interest rate through the Diocese. The debt is on schedule to be retired in the first quarter of 2027.

Dear Friends,

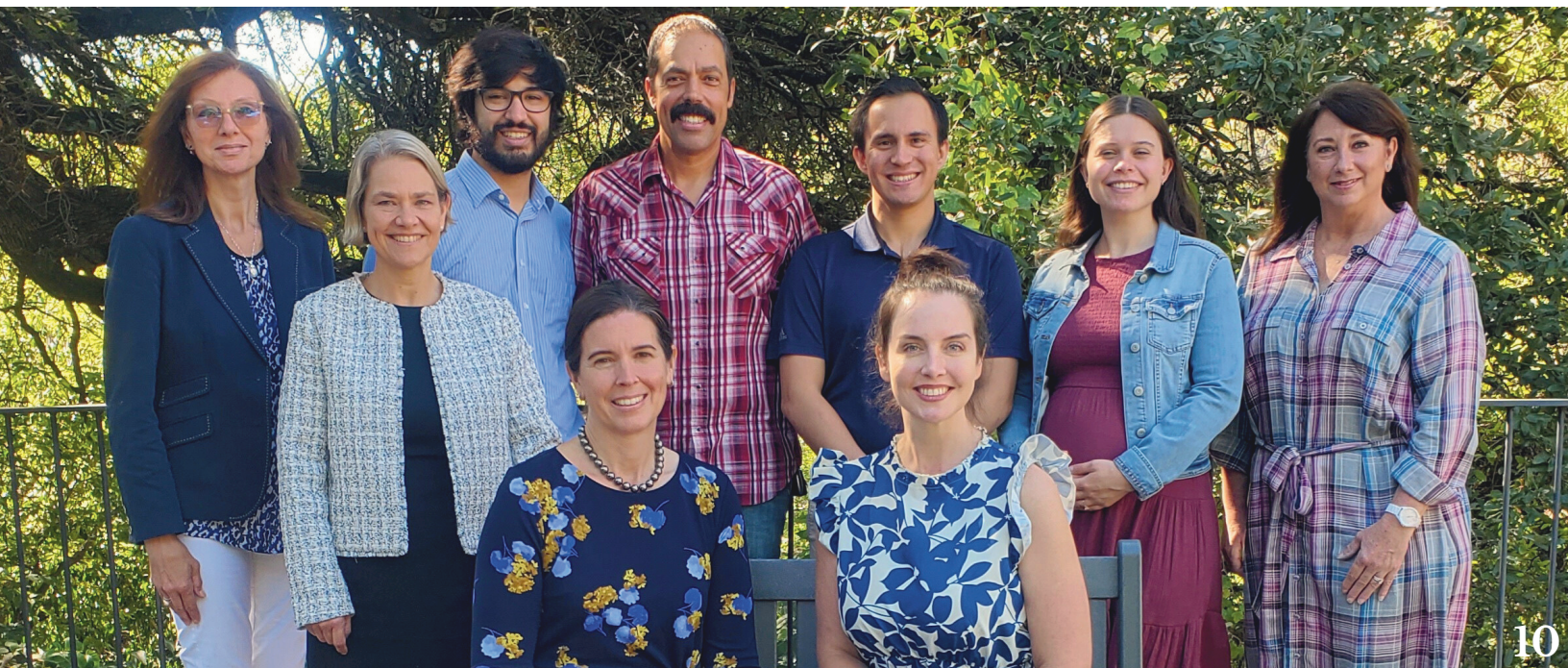
