What is a Mass Intention? Remembering Loved Ones

Have you noticed that every Mass said here at St. Michael is offered for a special intention? The entire congregation prays for that intention during the petitions (Prayers of the Faithful) when we say, "For those whom have died, and for the intention of this Mass: (name of who the intention is for)."

Masses are often offered for family, friends, and relatives that have died. Praying for the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy. Offering a Mass for someone who has died is an especially comforting gesture to the family. Mass can also be offered to commemorate joyful occasions and to give thanks to God for blessings received.

The suggested offering for a Mass is \$10 per intention. However, any amount that you would like to offer is acceptable. You may request a Mass intention by visiting the parish office during office hours or by calling 312-642-2498.

Pastor's Note: Return to ordinary time



Now that the Christmas season is over, the Church celebrates “Ordinary Time.” Ordinary time is the time we spend between the big celebrations. Sometimes we think ordinary means boring, but what it really means is the normal day-to-day activities. If you think about it, these are not boring times but actually very busy with life. Sure, we celebrate special days occasionally, but every day is not a special day. If every day were a special day, then every day would be the same and therefore no longer special. So in order to have special days, we must have ordinary days to set them apart.

During ordinary time in our Church, we focus on the day-to-day activities of Jesus. We focus on his preaching ministry, who he went to see, what he said, and how they reacted. We look at his healing ministry and other miracles that he performed. Our challenge during Ordinary Time is to see how we are being “Christ-like” in our ordinary daily life, not just in those special times. People come to Church and pray more during Advent and Lent, but what about the rest of the year? We seem to pray well during the special times, but drift away during Ordinary Time. Ordinary time does not mean vacation time; we don’t take a vacation from faith during ordinary time.

Think about it this way: when people are going through a tough time in their lives, they pray, but when things are going well, they back off. If the special seasons are the tough times in our lives, then Ordinary Time is the time when things are going well. We need to always pray, not just during the tough times, so we also need to celebrate our faith during special seasons and in ordinary times, too.

Discover Catholicism

Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Do you feel called to explore a deeper relationship with God within the Catholic Church? The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is a welcoming process for adults who wish to inquire about Catholicism, prepare for the sacraments, or become full members of the Catholic Church.

What is OCIA?

OCIA is a journey of faith, prayer, and community. It is designed for:

- Adults who have never been baptized
- Christians baptized in another tradition who wish to become Catholic
- Baptized Catholics who have not received First Communion or Confirmation

Through OCIA, participants learn about Catholic beliefs, traditions, and practices, and are supported by a community of faith as they discern their spiritual path.

What to Expect

- **Weekly Sessions:** Gather with others to explore Scripture, Church teachings, and the meaning of the sacraments.
- **Personal Reflection:** Opportunities for prayer, discussion, and personal growth.
- **Community Support:** Sponsors and parish members accompany you on your journey.
- **Sacramental Preparation:** Guidance and preparation for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Who Can Join?

OCIA is open to all adults who are curious about Catholicism, regardless of background or previous religious experience. There is no obligation to join the Church—OCIA is a process of exploration and discernment.

How to Get Started

- Contact the parish office or OCIA coordinator to express your interest.
- Attend an initial inquiry session to learn more about the process.
- Meet others who are on a similar journey of faith.

Who Can Join?

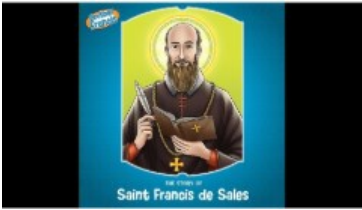
If you feel drawn to explore Catholicism or are seeking a spiritual home, consider joining OCIA. All are welcome to inquire, learn, and grow in faith.

How to Get Started

- **Do I have to commit to becoming Catholic to join OCIA?** No. OCIA is a process of inquiry and discernment. Participation does not require a commitment to join the Church.
- **How long does OCIA take?** The process typically follows the liturgical year, culminating at Easter, but the timeline can be adapted to individual needs.
- **Can I bring a friend or family member?** Yes. Support from loved ones is encouraged.

If you have made *all* of your donations through Give Central, you can print out your own tax letter. Simply log into Give Central (givecentral.org), on the top menu, click My Account:

On the left side of the page, you will see a list of options. The tax letter is the last one in the column. Click on that option.

It will then ask you to select the tax year, which will be 2025. Then, select Location. In the drop-down, you will find St. Michael in Old Town. If you have given to any other organizations that use Give Central and you use the same login information, they will all be listed.
