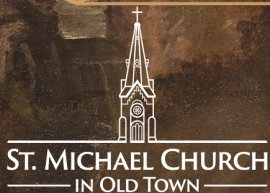

Pastor's Note: Faith Today



Today's Gospel focuses on the faith of the Gentile woman and how great her faith in Jesus. This is a direct opposite of last week's Gospel on the faith of Peter and how little it was. Think about it, here is Peter, the follower of Jesus, who left his family and business behind to follow Jesus. Who, when invited to, got out of a boat in the stormy sea and walked on the water toward Jesus. And he was called 'one of little faith.' But the Gentile woman, living in a foreign territory, comes to Jesus with her problem and expects Jesus to cure her daughter. She is called one of 'great faith.'

The difference between the two faiths is what happens when their faith is tested. When Peter saw how rough the waters were and how strong the wind, his faith wavered and proved to be small. But the Gentile woman, whose faith was tested, first by being ignored by Jesus, then rejected by the apostles, and finally rebuked by Jesus, persisted. Proving the depth of her faith. How is it that the followers of Jesus, who followed the same religion of Jesus, who practiced their faith had little faith? While the foreigner who practiced a different religion or maybe no religion had the greater faith?

I believe it has to do with what we see as faith. If faith is purely religion and the practice of it, then the followers of Jesus would have the greater faith. But if faith has to do with belief and acting on our beliefs, then the Gentile woman did show the greater faith. When Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water, he was putting his belief in Jesus to practice but when put under strain, the belief was overcome. When the Gentile woman came to Jesus to have him cure her daughter, she also was putting her belief in Jesus to practice, but when she was challenged, her belief persisted. So, faith is not just believing something, it is putting it into practice and persisting when opposed.

Today we face many challenges to the practice of our faith. Not just the covid virus, which maybe keeping us from coming to church, but criticisms that it is outdated, it has no impact on reality, or just a panacea for dealing with problems. Let us ask God to help us persevere in the practice of our faith, in the face of trials, so that it will be a 'great faith.'

Why do we light candles?

To understand why Catholics light candles in church, consider these reasons:

- Symbol of Prayer: Candles represent prayers being lifted to God.
- Presence of Christ: Lighting a candle signifies the light of Christ in the world.
- Remembrance: Candles are lit in memory of loved ones or for specific intentions.
- Focus and Reflection: The act of lighting a candle helps individuals focus during prayer or meditation.
- Community Support: Candles can symbolize solidarity and support for communal prayers or intentions.
- Tradition: Lighting candles is a longstanding tradition in Catholic worship, enhancing the sacred atmosphere.

Small votive and vigil candles are available for lighting in the church. The votive candles are \$.50 - and vigil candles are \$5.00 .

Discover Catholicism

Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Do you feel called to explore a deeper relationship with God within the Catholic Church? The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) is a welcoming process for adults who wish to inquire about Catholicism, prepare for the sacraments, or become full members of the Catholic Church.

What is OCIA?

OCIA is a journey of faith, prayer, and community. It is designed for:

- Adults who have never been baptized
- Christians baptized in another tradition who wish to become Catholic
- Baptized Catholics who have not received First Communion or Confirmation

Through OCIA, participants learn about Catholic beliefs, traditions, and practices, and are supported by a community of faith as they discern their spiritual path.

What to Expect

- **Weekly Sessions:** Gather with others to explore Scripture, Church teachings, and the meaning of the sacraments.
- **Personal Reflection:** Opportunities for prayer, discussion, and personal growth.
- **Community Support:** Sponsors and parish members accompany you on your journey.
- **Sacramental Preparation:** Guidance and preparation for Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

Who Can Join? OCIA is open to all adults who are curious about Catholicism, regardless of background or previous religious experience. There is no obligation to join the Church—OCIA is a process of exploration and discernment.

How to Get Started

- Contact the parish office or OCIA coordinator to express your interest.
- Attend an initial inquiry session to learn more about the process.
- Meet others who are on a similar journey of faith.

Who Can Join?

If you feel drawn to explore Catholicism or are seeking a spiritual home, consider joining OCIA. All are welcome to inquire, learn, and grow in faith.

How to Get Started

- **Do I have to commit to becoming Catholic to join OCIA?** No. OCIA is a process of inquiry and discernment. Participation does not require a commitment to join the Church.
- **How long does OCIA take?** The process typically follows the liturgical year, culminating at Easter, but the timeline can be adapted to individual needs.
- **Can I bring a friend or family member?** Yes. Support from loved ones is encouraged.

In June 2021, Br. Scott Partin, C.Ss.R., made his first vows at St. Michael Catholic Church in Old Town, marking the beginning of his journey as a Redemptorist. He is now preparing to take the next step in his vocational journey by making his profession for the diaconate at the same church.

Br. Scott hails from Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and spent 17 years in New Orleans, where he began volunteering at the National Shrine of Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos. His experience there inspired him to learn more about the Redemptorist congregation, which he officially joined in 2018.

Currently, he is a priestly candidate for the Redemptorists and has recently completed his pastoral year, during which he served six months in Mexico and another six months at St. Alphonsus Catholic Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Br. Scott received his Master of Divinity from the Oblate School of Theology in San Antonio in 2025, further preparing him for a life of service as a son of St. Alphonsus.

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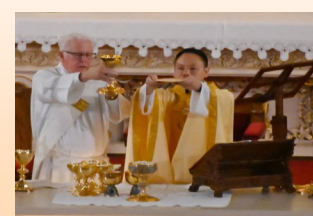
