

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER OLSON

Dear Parishioners and Friends.

The Gospel for this weekend is the story of Martha and Mary. Martha is busy getting things ready when Jesus arrives while Mary is not busy doing things, instead she is next to the Lord listening to him speak. One way to look at this Gospel passage is to see Mary as busy holding on to what is fundamental, the teaching of Jesus.

Our times and culture are filled with so many different and divergent ideas that holding onto some fundamentals strikes me as particularly important. In St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, he warns the Ephesians, and us, that we should not be "carried about by every wind of teaching and clever cunning of men." Paul tells the Ephesians to speak the truth in love and thereby

The truths we have regarding the human condition are those fundamental things which in the grand narrative of human history have proven to be true and which are confirmed in the Christian Tradition.

When faced with claims which are contrary to common sense, I think it important not to get caught up in the weeds of some argument, but rather, to go back to basic principles. There are some basic principles which really seem applicable to our times. For example, there are two sexes and men and women are different and a man cannot become a woman simply by saying so, and vice versa. Parents are the appropriate first teachers of their children, especially in areas of sexuality. Talking to little children about their "gender identity" doesn't belong in any school's curriculum and anything like a drag-queen story hour should not be paid for by taxpayers. It might seem this is a pretty narrow focus, but right now the cultural fight is about sex and gender. Christians need to confirm and re-affirm our basic understanding of the human person and our relationship to our

God who made us "male and female." And, yes, I know the complexities of the arguments. You can look at the Growing In Faith video I made last March discussing this. You can find that video through our website, under Faith Formation. Complexities and exceptions do not set aside basic principles nor basic biology.

There is currently a proposal from the Federal Government to take away funding for school lunches unless public and private schools, such as ours, promote a gender fluid policy regarding transgender identity. These government policies are still being formulated and its impact is uncertain, but you can see disputes over cultural issues, and especially over sex and gender, have real implications in everyday life.

Our task as Christians is, as St. Paul said, to speak the truth in love and thereby grow up into Christian maturity.

Let's go out and make Jesus famous, Fr. Olson




