The Month of Our Lady of Sorrows (Mater Dolorosa)

The Church dedicates the month of September to Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as Mater Dolorosa (Mother of Sorrows). This devotion recalls the Blessed Virgin Mary's spiritual martyrdom in virtue of her perfect union with the Passion of Christ. This was her role in salvation history, and what merited her place as the spiritual Mother of all Christians. This is symbolized by a single sword, or seven swords, piercing Mary's suffering heart, as foretold in Simeon's prophecy. Traditionally the Church meditates on the "Seven Sorrows" of our Blessed Mother: the prophecy of Simeon; the Holy Family's flight into Egypt; the loss of the Child Jesus for three days; the meeting of Mary and Jesus as he carried his cross; Jesus' crucifixion and death; Jesus' sacred body taken down from the cross; and Jesus' burial. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (Mater Dolorosa) is September 15th.

How Christ Continues to Touch and Heal Us The Church is the Holy Church, despite all blemishes and wrinkles. She

is the sanctified one, the "bride," that is, the chosen vessel of grace. She is the place where the holiness of God is enthroned presently and visibly. She is all this because in the sacraments, in the Sacrament, the Lord himself meets and touches us.... She is also all this, and in a way even more, because the visible, bodily appearance of Christ—the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared (Ti 3:4)—continues in the saints, indeed in the flesh, until the end of time. The Church herself is the "vine"...of the holiness of God dwelling on earth.... She is the "mother" of the saints in the strictest sense of the word, one might say in the bio logical sense, not just in the sense of one who rears a child. She "births" the saints into the world; they are nourished by her substance, bearing the features of God and hers as well. And she is not only the mother of those who are in the past, the historical ones, the already perfected saints, but also of the ones who are present, hidden, becoming; and she will, for as long as the world exists, in spite of all decay and corruption, all degeneration and catastrophe, always give birth to new, future saints....

She has already given birth to us; before any choice of our own, we are already marked with the indelible seal.... It is up to us to dare to talk to God, that is, to dare true prayer. Up to us to fall back on the seal of strength given in confirmation, like how one raises a sunken treasure up from a well. Up to us to really nourish ourselves from the "bread of life," though that means to do so as one uses food—regularly, adequately, not as a rare, solemn, or "formal" exception. Up to us, again and again, when the accumulated and tenacious filth of incessant failure becomes for us like lumps of clay so heavy on our soles that it inhibits walking, that we seek an alleviating purification and impetus for a new start in the sacrament of forgiveness...[and] internalize into ourselves the limitless possibility of what God can do with man....

In the saints...as first-fruits and harbingers of the new creation (2 Cor 5:17), which outlasts death and decline, is embodied the meaning, the success, that which from the beginning is intended as the ultimate goal: the unity of the whole world with God who is distant and yet so near.

Sacraments

Infant Baptism

Parents must be registered and active members of our parish. If they are members of another parish, a letter of permission from their Pastor is required. We also require preparation for this Sacrament. Contact Fr. Severson before the infant's due date to arrange a date and time for the baptism. Baptisms are normally celebrated at Mass.

Holy Matrimony

Couples discerning this Sacrament should contact Fr. Severson immediately after becoming engaged. A minimum of six months of preparation is required before the celebration of this Sacrament. Couples wishing to marry in the parish must be registered and active members of the parish. Couples from other parishes must obtain a letter of permission to marry outside their own parish.

Anointing of the Sick

Anyone who has been diagnosed as terminally or gravely ill, is preparing for surgery, or has had their mental or physical health condition significantly change is encouraged to request this Sacrament of healing. Call the parish office to schedule the celebration of this Sacrament.

Adult Confirmation, Adult Baptism (RCIA), and Adult Reception into Full Communion

If you, a family member, or a friend has not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, or are interested in being baptized or received into full communion with the Church, please contact Fr. Severson. An appropriate preparation process will be discerned on an individual basis.

A Message From the Catholic Bishops of Montana Regarding Abortion Ballot Issue Constitutional Initiative (CI-128)

Dear People of God,

On May 3rd of this year, we issued a pastoral call to reject Constitutional Initiative 128 (CI-128) and prevent it from appearing on the November ballot in Montana. Sadly, after large amounts of out-of-state funding, Planned Parenthood and its associates have succeeded. This grave threat to unborn children, mothers, and families will be on the ballot. As followers of Jesus and faith-filled citizens of Montana, we are compelled to speak boldly in defense of the infinite dignity of every human life.

We implore voters to scrutinize the full text of CI-128. Through the careful use of undefined terms, it nullifies Montana's current abortion regulations and safeguards while creating some of the most radical constitutional provisions for abortion in our Nation.

The ballot language, or voter's summary of CI-128, is grossly insufficient and misleading. Furthermore, the full text of the initiative, which voters will not see at the ballot box, clearly raises grave moral and ethical concerns. The full text of CI-128 will place expectant mothers at risk and enshrine extreme abortion procedures in our Montana Constitution.

In section one, the full text of CI-128 establishes abortion as a right that may not be "burdened" by the government if in any way this would interfere with a mother's "autonomous decision-making." It clearly follows that any regulation of abortion can be characterized as a burden that conflicts with autonomous decision-making.

Any of the following could easily present such a "burden":

- Limitations on late-term abortion of babies who feel pain
- Any restrictions on partial birth abortion
- Any parental notification requirements of abortion procedures on minors

Montana's Supreme Court has recently struck down a law requiring parental consent. CI-128 goes even further by eliminating Montana's current requirement that parents be notified of an abortion procedure on their minor child. This initiative isolates pregnant girls when they need their parents most.

CI-128 would create significant risk in Montana for underage pregnant mothers by:

- · Imposing a culture of secrecy that would undermine families
- Exposing underage mothers to exploitation and coercion
- Providing cover for those who would victimize underage women by committing abuse, human trafficking, and other crimes

We believe that Montana's children have a fundamental right to life and to grow up safely in our State. We ask all Catholics to continue to pray, abstain from meat on Wednesdays, and share the disturbing truth about CI-128 with the people that God has placed in our lives. Again, we implore all people of good will to read the full text of CI-128 in your voter guide, search and form your conscience, stand with our children against CI-128, and vote **NO** on your ballot.

CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE 128 (CI-128) FACT SHEET

Abortion is Already Legal in Montana

- Abortion is currently legal in Montana up to the point of fetal viability – generally at 24 weeks of pregnancy, with some exceptions for after viability.
- Doctors, physician assistants and Advanced Practice Registered Nurses can perform abortions.
- Before performing an abortion on an underage girl, abortionists are required to notify her parents, with some exceptions.
- Mifepristone, or the "abortion pill" is available in Montana through abortion providers in-person and via Telehealth.

Who is Behind CI-128?

Parental Notification is at Risk

In 2012, Montanans voted 70% to 30% to require parental notification 48 hours before an abortion for girls under 16—the only remaining law in Montana ensuring parents are informed. CI-128 would abolish this law, just as the Montana Supreme Court struck down a parental consent requirement this August.

Undefined Terms Create Bad Laws

"Fetal viability"

What specific criteria determine "fetal viability"? How many weeks? What medical standards are applied? How do they affect the timing of when viability is determined?

"Healthcare Professional"

Who, in the many healthcare professions, has the legal authority to determine matters like fetal viability, medical necessity, and the protection of the pregnant patient's life or health?

"Life or health of the pregnant patient"
What is included in "health"? Is this limited to physical health? Does it include mental and emotional health?

"Burdened" and "Burden"

Does a burden include any inconvenience or delay? Does burden include any commonsense regulation to protect a pregnant girl or unborn baby?

"Autonomous decision making"

How is "autonomous decision making" understood, and what legal or medical standards support this autonomy?

"Voluntary consent"

What is the definition of "voluntary consent", especially in cases involving minors or vulnerable individuals?

"Bona fide health risk"

What is considered a "bona fide health risk," and what standards support the definition? Who has the authority to define bona fide health risk?
