



ST. MONICA THE COUNSELOR SAINT 331 -387 FEAST DAY – AUGUST 28



Saint Monica was also known as Monica of Hippo, an early Christian saint and mother of St. Augustine of Hippo. She is remembered and honored in most Christian denominations, on different feast days, for her outstanding Christian virtues, particularly the suffering caused by her husband's adultery, and her prayerful life dedicated to the reformation of her son. He wrote extensively of her pious acts and life with her in his Confessions. Many Christian legends recall St. Monica weeping for her son Augustine every night. Saint Monica, wife, mother, counselor, Catholic woman, servant of God and professor of the gospel, influenced her family and community in priceless ways.

Dear Monica, mother figure for all mothers, the wives and mothers of our time seek your aid. As you counseled the women of your time, please continue to advise all mothers. Our children wander from place to place, from idea to idea, seeking meaning and truth of their existence just as Augustine, your son, did. You know our pain, our prayers and desires for them. You, who endured abuse, neglect and downheartedness, come to our aid. Show us the way to peace and faithfulness, the only way that can lead to our Savior's embrace. Amen.


Holy Hour for Vocations
