Mrs. Eichinger's K-5 Computer Classes



Every grade level participates in lessons from CommonSense Media®. Students learn about safe and responsible use of their digital learning environments.




Here at St Ben's we have such an amazing opportunity to have our older students support our younger students' learning experiences. It is heartwarming to watch the interactions!




What's going on with PSA?
