Corpus Christi OCIA class serves the littlest of His children

Early in 2023, Bismarck resident, Tracey Pruess, heard a story of a foster child entering placement with only two dirty outfits placed in a garbage bag. As a mom herself and having a pile of kids clothes she didn't know what to do with, she sat and just stared at the pile. "That child's story really bugged me." As a former foster child who was then adopted, Tracey knew she could do better. "We understand that safety is number one during these removals. Clothes is a last thought. So the idea for **Foster Hope** was born."

Foster Hope is an area 501(c)3 that collects gently used clothes, comfort items (like a stuffy or books) and fills suitcases with these items for kids to take from place to place. We also help meet the needs of various social service organizations like Morton/Burleigh County Human Services, Healthy Families, social workers in various schools, and PATH. Tracey stated, "We don't do furniture at this time, but if a need for a family comes through social services, we will post (online) for it."

This new organization has several big initiatives that started this past year, along with their suitcase donations:

- Hygiene Kits: They provide hygiene kits for foster kids as they go in to placement. Last fall, with a great donation from the Bismarck High Demonettes and Mary Mission, Foster Hope was able to start an off shoot of our Hygiene Kits called Tooth Fairies. Tooth Fairies work to get dental items such as toothpaste and toothbrushes into the hands of those that need them.
- Backpack Drive: Foster Hope was able to fill many backpacks with school supplies and donate to local schools for students who may not have had access to new school supplies for the 2024-25 school year.

Tracey recently spoke to the OCIA catechumens and candidates of Corpus Christi in Bismarck. During their time together, Tracey, Diane Huck, instructor and the students made tie-blankets to give to future foster children. Some had made these gifts in the past, while for others, it was a new experience. "I really enjoyed it and it helps others," stated one candidate. "I didn't know how needed foster care is in the area. I'm glad I could help a little bit."

May is the Month of Mary

Today we begin May, the month dedicated to the Virgin Mary. The celebration of May as a Marian month fits well with the liturgical celebrations of Easter and Pentecost as we recall Mary's great joy in her Son's victory over death as well as her presence with the apostles prayerfully awaiting the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Our Lady is centuries old, dating back at least 700 years. In 1965 blessed Pope Paul VI wrote an encyclical on the month of May, focusing on the Virgin Mary. He wrote that the piety of the faithful has long dedicated the month of May to the Mother of God. He stated in his encyclical, Mense Maio:

"We are delighted and consoled by this pious custom associated with the month of May, which pays honor to the Blessed Virgin and brings such rich benefits to the Christian people. Since Mary is rightly to be regarded as the way by which we are led to Christ, the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise."

The ways Mary is honored in May are as varied as the people who honor her. It is common for parishes to have a daily recitation of the Rosary in May and to erect a special altar with a statue or image of Mary. In addition, it is a long tradition to crown her statue. Often, the crown is made of beautiful flowers that represent Mary's beauty and virtue, and is also a reminder to the faithful to strive to imitate her virtues. This coronation is in some areas a large celebration, and usually takes place outside of Mass. Altars and coronations in this month are not just parish privileges. In homes, one can also participate fully in the life of the Church.

We all probably have our favorite images of Mary as well as our favorite devotions: Our Lady of Guadalupe, Our Lady of Fatima, Our Lady of Lourdes, Mother of Perpetual Help, the Miraculous Medal, etc. The many images and devotions express various aspects of Our Lady's vocation and mission. They help us to know the virtues of Mary and remind us to turn to her for her intercession.

We must give Mary a special place not because it is a long-standing tradition in the Church or because of the special graces that can be obtained, but because Mary is our Mother, the mother of the whole world and because she cares for all of us, interceding even in the smallest matters.

The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore the example, as well as the guide and inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church, seeks to be the servant of God and the obedient agent of the promptings of the Holy Spirit. In our pilgrimage of faith, we always walk with Marv at our side. She is our model of faith, and she helps us with her prayers to live by faith. She teaches us to believe as she believed. Let us learn from her how to love and trust God completely and how to be faithful witnesses of the risen Lord. May the Blessed Virgin Mary intercede for us and draw us closer to Christ her Son.
