



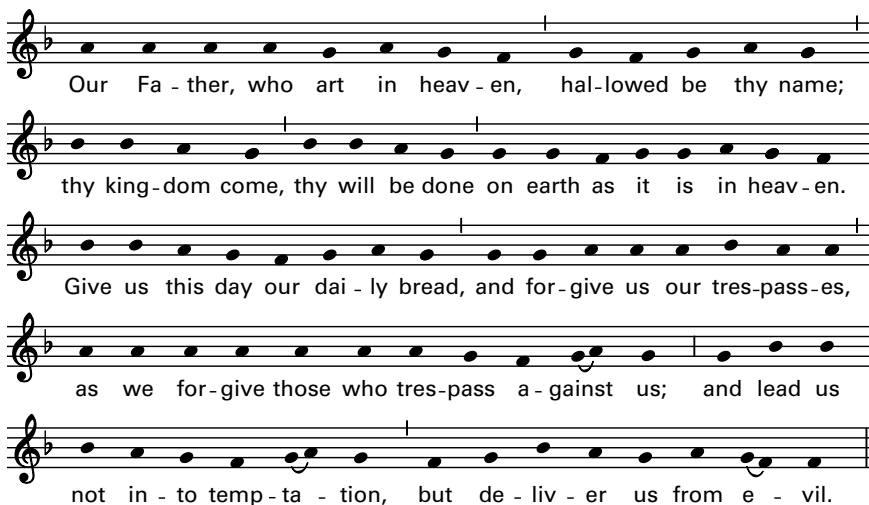

you love us.




