## Today's Gospel Reflection

First Reading: Jeremiah 31:7-9

Second Reading: Hebrews 5:1-6

Third Reading: Mark 10:46-52

In the Gospel reading, blind Bartimaeus will not stop yelling for Jesus to have pity on him, until Jesus finally calls for him.


At this point the funny parts of the story start. Why doesn't Jesus go over to Bartimaeus? Why wait for the blind man to find his way to Jesus? And when Bartimaeus does find his way to Him, Jesus asks him what seems like the dumbest question: "What do you want me to do for you?" What on earth would anybody suppose Bartimaeus wants? He's blind!

And when Jesus heals him and Bartimaeus can see, Jesus says that Bartimaeus' faith has saved him. But why? What does Bartimaeus' receiving his sight have to do with his being saved?

Here we need to notice what Bartimaeus actually says to Jesus in answer to Jesus' question to him. Bartimaeus does not say to Jesus, "I want my sight." He says, "I want to see." To want sight is to want a capacity which can be used for all kinds of purposes—raising sheep, making money. But to want to see is to want the connection with reality that the exercise of sight makes possible. Wanting to see is wanting to know the true nature of reality, hidden in one way from a person when he is blind.

Once we see what Bartimaeus asks for, the funny parts of the story make more sense. When Jesus calls Bartimaeus to himself, he gives Bartimaeus a small period of time to consider what he REALLY wants before Jesus asks him. Then the presence of the Lord and that question serves as a call to Bartimaeus to commit himself to just one heart's desire—and Bartimaeus finds it: I want to SEE.

Seeing isn't limited to seeing the blue of the sky or the road to home. It is also a matter of seeing the truth about things, or even of seeing the Truth himself. So Jesus gives Bartimaeus all that he asks for. Bartimaeus sees not only the world around him, but also his Lord. And in seeing Jesus, Bartimaeus accepts the Giver together with the gift of sight. Although Jesus gives Bartimaeus the option of going away, Bartimaeus insists on staying by Jesus and follows Him. Bartimaeus SEES the Lord which was what he desired. And that is why Jesus rewards Bartimaeus because his faith has saved him.



**LET'S TAKE A MINUTE... By Tere Hunt**





## SHOUT WITH JOY

After the previous Sunday's focus on suffering, today's readings depict excitement. They had been locked away and now they are free. These were vulnerable people that others did not value. Now they are going home. They have been gathered in God's embrace. Who wouldn't rejoice?

The Gospel tells of one man who is blind and begging. However, his blindness did not prevent him from seeing. He seems to have known who Jesus was and that Jesus could help him. And so, he cries out, "Have pity on me" (Mark 10:47). This man was begging outside of the city. Because of his blindness, he was shunned and rendered unemployable. All that was left for him was to beg—and beg he did. Not for money, but for sight. Only then was the man healed. He had believed that Jesus has the power of new life. Like the people in the First Reading, he was given a chance for a new life. No longer was he an outcast; he could now join the community. No longer was he confined to begging. He could now flourish in life.

These are not merely awe-inspiring stories. As disciples we have been called to continue Jesus' ministry in our lives—to embrace those who are lost and help them find the warmth and security of home. We are called to help those struggling with life's hardships to see the compassion of Jesus.


## Dear Padre,

### Why does Jesus refer to himself as the Son of Man? What does the title mean?

Jesus refers to himself as the Son of Man seventy-six times in the Gospels, so it's clearly one of his favorite titles. When people call him the Messiah, Jesus often corrects them by calling Himself the Son of Man. That title has at least three meanings: the Son of Man in all His humanity, the suffering Son of Man, and the Son of Man who will come again.

Jesus used the title to stress His true humanity and identify with us. Jesus as Son of Man must suffer and die. Every time Jesus prophesies about His death, it is as the Son of Man. Jesus connects the title with His passion and death, linking it to Isaiah 53, the great Song of the Suffering Servant. Also, in using that title Jesus is explicitly saying that He is the one fulfilling those prophecies of Isaiah and Daniel, as when He said in the synagogue, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing" (Luke 4:21).

The Son of Man is God's powerful representative (Daniel 7:13) coming to establish the kingdom of God. To do so, the Son of Man suffers, dies, and rises. That one title, Son of Man, summarizes much of Jesus' work of redemption. He became fully human, suffering and dying to establish the kingdom of God.

### ◆ **Family Bucket List Ideas**

What are good ideas for a bucket list that families can do together that help them to grow stronger in their faith? Here are some ideas for you to consider adding to your family bucket list:

1. **Memorize one Bible verse a week or month.**
2. **Read a devotion together every morning (or night).**  
Sitting down together as a family to read the Bible and a devotion is a great way to open discussion about faith in God.
3. **Create a family prayer jar and fill it with requests.**  
A family prayer jar can be made out of something as simple as a mason jar. Or you can find a larger box or jar and decorate it. Add to the prayer jar every night when you sit down to eat dinner together. And pray for one or two requests each day.
4. **Attend church more consistently.**  
Life gets super busy at times. Between sports games, vacations, and other things, we sometimes get out of the habit of going to church. Look at your schedule each month and try to make a goal to attend church regularly.
5. **Volunteer at church or at a local organization together.**
6. **Play worship music in your car.**  
Crank up the worship music in the car and enjoy praising God together!

7. **Teach your kids about tithing to God.**  
Teach your kids at a young age about giving back to God. A great way to do this is by letting them put money in the offering basket each week.
8. **Focus on the Sunday Readings each week.**  
Read and discuss all week.
9. **Have family worship nights at home.**  
If your family loves to sing and dance, open up YouTube and search for worship songs for kids
10. **Talk about your God sightings each day.**  
Have kids name ways they have seen God that day. A great time to talk about God Sightings is at dinner time!
11. **Say a blessing over your children every morning and evening.**
12. **Forgive each other.**  
Families spend a lot of time together. And often times that means we fight or don't get along...which means we have a need to forgive one another.
13. **Start a family gratitude journal.**  
When we can write down the things that we are grateful for, we can start to see how much God provides for us and blesses us. Teaching our children to be grateful is so beneficial for them!
14. **Hang a family prayer list on the fridge.**  
Check it off when God answers your prayer. Use this Family Prayer List to help your family see the many ways God answers our prayers!
15. **Do a random act of kindness for someone.**  
Brainstorm with your family ways you can show kindness to someone you know. Then do it!
16. **Play Bible Trivia games.**  
Bible Trivia games are fun and are a great way to help your children learn the Bible! You can find some good ones on YouTube.
17. **Go on a hike in God's creation.**  
Family hikes are fun and are a great way to spend time in God's creation and enjoy the beauty of all that He has created.
18. **Go to the grocery store and buy items needed for the food pantry.**  
This is a great way to teach your children about helping to feed those in need. Some items that are always needed is ramen, spam, and Vienna sausage. Disposable diapers, baby wipes, and \$10 gift cards to Walmart, Target or Wendy's is a big help!


