Today's Gospel Reflection

First Reading: 1 Sirach 27:4-7

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

I once followed the Jesuit, Larry Gillick, a blind person, in the literal dark. Larry lost his sight before his tenth birthday, but as an adult he joined the Society of Jesus and became a marvelous spiritual director. On a retreat, we went for a walk in the dark and got far from the retreat house, with no neighborhood around us. So, the blind following the blind. As we went, he upped the ante and said to me, "Do you want to go on a trust walk?" Why, of course, I blindly said.

First he had me do the famous "fall backwards" that some readers would have done—only problem was Larry could not see! I will to fall back, and he caught me, and we were happy. With Larry conquering his malady, all was good...except there was a "next step." He announced that he, a person unable to find his way, would lead the way. With my hand on his shoulder and a scarf around my eyes to make certain I won't cheat, we went forth. It was indeed a walk of trust. Even though I anticipated that anything whatsoever could happen, it did not. Larry was so used to guiding people spiritually that for him, it did not mean walking blindly into the unknown, it meant going ahead with increasing confidence that we are accompanied by God, no matter what might come around the dark bend in the road. What was I myself supposed to learn? To trust recklessly with only sightless guidance? Perhaps sightlessness is the only way to see!

Jesus says in our Gospel that we have "wooden beams" in our eyes when we relate to others. Maybe we must close our eyes for a while in order to see around these. We should stop projecting on others our own blockages, and work on the much larger wooden beams in our own psyche instead. This understanding does not imply that we should entirely give up relating to another person. Jesus is just saying that we need to clarify our own vision to help someone else. None of us will have perfect "vision," but we should seek continually to clarify what we do see.

The steady blind guidance Larry gave me was an act of seeing I have never known. So as we begin Lent, let us close our eyes and be guided.

WHO ARE YOU? REALLY!

Like it or not, we often get our sense of who we are from others. Some people either make us feel worthwhile, or they treat us like we have little value. We all want to be accepted, to be part of the crowd, to look like we have made it. This is one reason we fall for so many fads of the day. *"Everyone has one. Everyone is doing it."* Teenagers aren't the only ones who think like this. It may take a long time before we can move beyond the opinions of others. Many never do.



So, who are you? Really! Are you hiding behind something, some pretense? Are you trying to look like someone you're not? Today's readings remind us, as many have said, *"Actions speak louder than words,"* and as Christ said, *"By their fruits you will know them"* (Matthew 7:16). What is deepest within us eventually shows itself.

Sorach offers several examples of this. He claims that sometimes the dark side of our personalities comes out when we least expect it. But then there are times when we surprise even ourselves with our own goodness. Luke offers similar examples from both nature and human experience. Try as we might, we cannot completely hide who we truly are. And why should we? The last phrase of today's Gospel is profound. *"From the fulness of the heart the mouth speaks"* (Luke 6:45). That is where we find who we are. Really!

FIND PEACE IN DIFFICULT TIMES

If you follow news about national or world events, the reporting can rob you of peace. With stories of financial insecurity, unemployment, disease, depression, and divisions, how can we find peace?

Talk it out. Bringing worries into the light and confiding them to someone we trust can cut them down to size. Even better—talk about worries with God. Prayer has the added advantage of surrendering your problems into powerful hands. *"Jesus, I trust in You!"*



Focus on what you can do, not what you can't. Stress results from feeling powerless. Focusing on what we can't do can "paralyze" our problem-solving abilities. Start making a list of steps you can take toward solving your problem. Whatever is beyond your control, leave to God.

Immerse yourself in God's all-powerful love. Whether we feel it or not, whether we believe it or not, we are God's precious children. He watches over us very closely. He knows what we can handle and is more than ready to help us with all the rest.
