GROANING BEYOND WORDS—OUR DEEPER WAY OF PRAYING

“When we no longer know how to pray, the Spirit, in groans too deep for words, prays through us.” (Romans 8:22).

St. Paul wrote those words and they contain both a stunning revelation and a wonderful consolation, that there is deep prayer happening inside us beyond our conscious awareness and independent of our deliberate efforts. What is this unconscious prayer? It is our deep innate desire, relentlessly on fire, making itself felt through the groaning of our bodies and souls, silently begging the very energies of the universe, to let it come to consummation.

Allow me an analogy: Some years ago, a friend of mine bought a house that had sat empty and abandoned for a number of years. The surface of the driveway was cracked and a bamboo plant, now several feet high, had grown up through the pavement. My friend cut down the bamboo tree, chopped down several feet into its roots to try to destroy them, poured a chemical poison into the root system in hopes of killing whatever was left, packed some gravel over the spot, and paved over the top with a thick layer of concrete. But the little tree was not so easily thwarted. Two years later, the pavement began to heave as the bamboo plant again began to assert itself. Its powerful life force was still blindly pushing outward and upward, cement blockage notwithstanding.

Life has powerful inner pressures and is not easily thwarted. It pushes relentlessly, irrespective of resistance. Sometimes resistance does kill it. There are storms we cannot weather. But we do weather most of what life throws at us and our deep life-principle remains strong, even as on the surface the frustrations we have experienced and the dreams in us that have been shamed slowly muzzle us into a mute despair so that our prayer-lives begin to express less and less of what we are actually feeling.

But it is through that very frustration that the Spirit prays, silently, in groans too deep for words. In our striving, our yearning, our broken dreams, our tears, in the daydreams we escape into, and even in our sexual desire, the Spirit of God prays through us, as does our soul, our life-principle. Like the life forces innate in that bamboo plant, powerful forces are blindly working inside us too, pushing us outward and upward to eventually throw off whatever cement lies on top of us. This is true also of our joys. The Spirit also prays through our gratitude, both when we express it and even when we only sense it.

Our deepest prayers are mostly not those we express in our churches and private oratories. ***Our deepest prayers are spoken in our silent gratitude and silent tears.*** The person praising God's name and the person bitterly cursing God's name in anger are different ways of groaning, both praying.

One of the oldest, classical definitions of prayer defines it this way: prayer is lifting mind and heart to God. Too often in our efforts to pray formally, both communally and privately, we fail to actually lift our hearts and minds to God. Why? Because what is really in our hearts and minds, is not something we generally connect with prayer at all. Our frustrations, bitterness, jealousies, lusts, curses, and quiet despair are usually understood to be the very antithesis of prayer, something to be overcome in order to pray. But a deeper thing is happening under the surface: our frustration, longing, lust and escapist daydreams, things we are ashamed to take to prayer, are in fact already lifting our hearts and minds to God in more honest ways that we ever do consciously.




LET’S TAKE A MINUTE... By Tere Hunt

LIVE BY FAITH

The story of Abraham is one of extraordinary blessing. However, his story is also one of extraordinary faith. At major points of his life, Abraham had no idea what was in store for him or his family. He was directed to leave his home and become a wandering herder. He was an immigrant in a foreign land, bereft of social support structures. He was promised descendants but waited many years for that promise to be realized. Once he had an heir, he was then told to sacrifice that son of promise without any assurance of a favorable future. Time and again, Abraham was asked to live by faith.

The phrase "seeing is believing" is misleading; it is really an expression of skepticism that means, "I won't believe it unless I see it." However, true belief means that we accept something even though we don't see it, don't understand it. That is a very difficult way for most of us to live. Yet live like this we must, whether we are believers or unbelievers, because so much of life is beyond our control or understanding.

So how do we learn to live by faith? We have something that Abraham did not have. We have his story to encourage us. In that story we see that again and again he stepped forward in faith, and God brought things together. If God did this in Abraham's life, surely God can and will do it in ours. We must only live by faith.

Dear Padre,

When I was young, we never had eucharistic devotions. Why are they so popular now?

Prior to the Second Vatican Council, many Catholics found solid food for their spiritual lives in eucharistic devotions, which include visiting the Blessed Sacrament (eucharistic adoration), attending Forty Hours devotion, and assisting at benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

However, as the modern liturgical movement began picking up steam, scholars and theologians began questioning the amount of energy and attention going toward eucharistic devotion. They urged us to focus our spirituality more clearly on the Mass—the action of the sacred liturgy and the Eucharist itself—and to understand that all eucharistic devotions outside of the sacred liturgy are meant to direct us back to the action of the Mass, the eucharistic sacrifice, and its high point of Communion.

The drop-off in eucharistic devotions after Vatican II can be positively understood as an attempt to take the insights of liturgical reform seriously and develop a more liturgical piety. At the same time, the resurgence of eucharistic adoration is a worthy retrieval of a beloved practice that both scholars and the faithful understand as complementing a full, conscious, and active participation in the sacred liturgy that is the "source and summit" of our lives.


