Easter Joy

The Psalm for Easter Sunday says, "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Above all days, Easter is a day of joy.

But what is joy? The answer St. Francis gave to this question is famous. St. Francis said to his Brother Leo, "When we come to St. Mary of the Angeles [our house], soaked by the rain and frozen by the cold, all soiled with mud and suffering from hunger, and we ring at the gate of the place and the brother porter comes and says angrily: 'Who are you?' And we say: 'We are two of your brothers.' And...he does not open for us, but makes us stand outside in the snow and rain, cold and hungry, until night falls—then if we endure all these insults and cruel rebuffs patiently,...oh, Brother Leo, ... perfect joy is there!"

Whatever we may think of St. Francis' explanation of perfect joy, Easter reminds us that Francis' kind of joy is not the end of the story. At Easter, we celebrate the other kind of joy, the kind each of us longs for, when every tear is wiped away, and there is no sorrow anymore—no more suffering from weather or hunger or hurtful human beings. As we sing in the much-loved hymn at Easter there is only "the cross and passion past; dark night is done, bright morning come at last!"

When we ourselves rise to meet our risen Lord, in that bright morning we will hear the Lord say, "Come away, beloved. The winter is past; the rain is gone, and the flowers return to the earth" (Song of Songs 2:10-12). In the loving union of that encounter, all the heartbrokenness of our lives will be redeemed. **That** will be perfect joy.

If all we had was the joy St. Francis describes, our courage might fail us in this life. Easter celebrates now the perfect joy waiting for us when we and all creation are reborn with our resurrected Lord into the everlasting love of God. This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it.

Restoring the Cup During Holy Communion

Bishop Larry Silva has decided to allow parishes to restore Holy Communion under both kinds (bread and wine), starting Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023. The Church has always taught the doctrine of concomitance, by which we know that under each species alone, the whole Christ is sacramentally present and we receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1390) states: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the -Office of Worship/Diocese of Honolulu Latin rite."



Joe was learning an important lesson in life. Sometimes we have to do what we don't want to; we have to go into what seems to be "the tomb of death" if we're going to find life.

Easter's Gospel is that of Peter and John going and finding the tomb empty. Curiously, they didn't become believers until they entered the tomb, until they entered death's home. It's how faith happens, finding life when we expected only death and recognizing the hand of God in it.



ear Padre Why should I believe Jesus founded the Catholic Church?

What a great question, especially during our Easter season, when the readings at Mass are about how the early Church discovers its mission and identity. Jesus intended to found a Church to carry on His mission.

Jesus chose twelve men to accompany him and learn from him. He passed on His mission to them: "Whoever listens to you listens to me. Whoever rejects you rejects me. And whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me" (Luke 10:16). Jesus called Simon Bar-Jonah "Peter," meaning "rock." Indicating His foundational role, Jesus said to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven" (Matthew 16:19).



Throughout the New Testament, we read how the apostles in their turn passed on their authority to other individuals by the laying one of hands (Acts 6:6; 13:3;1 Timothy 4:14; 2 Timothy 1:6). Initially, the only two orders were bishops and deacons but soon priests were also ordained to share some of the authority of the bishop and to be his assistants.

The Church would exist and do Jesus' work until the end of time. The whole Church, "the "Body of Christ," as Paul would call it (1 Corinthians 1'2:27), would be Christ acting in the world on His behalf. The Church and all its members are to be "the light of the world" and "the salt of the earth" (Matthew 5:13-16).
