Playing It Straight

Years ago on television, at the end of the George Burns and Gracie Allen show, Gracie would talk on and on and finally George would stop her dryly with the words, "Say good night, Gracie." She would reply, "Good night Gracie." Laughter. George was her "straight man."

In Sunday's Gospel, Phillip and Thomas serve as straight men—not for a comedian but for Christ, who is explaining the deepest meaning of Christianity.

"There are many rooms in my Father's house," Jesus says. "I will come back and take you there. You know the way to where I am going." Thomas asks rather naturally, "Master, we do not know where you are going: how can we know the way?" He might as well have said, "Do your magic."

So Jesus makes a play on "the way." Thomas thinks these words means a pathway. But Jesus means something else. He says, "Thomas, you already know The Way quite well. It is me. I am the Way and the Truth and the Light. I am the Pathway to the Father. If you know me then you know the Father."

The early followers of Jesus actually called their Jesus movement, "The Way," instead of "Christianity." All puns aside, what does "The Way" mean?

It is the way to real life. Jesus is saying that the Father has been shown forth completely, in Himself, the Christ. Jesus called Him "Abba," but He is the God all ages have sought for, the One who is all good and all loving and all powerful God. Do you want to know God? Look at Jesus. Follow His way.

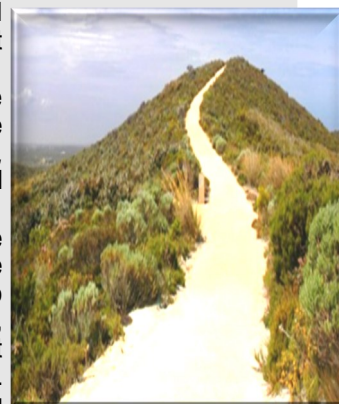
Philip does want to know "the Father," but he completely misses Jesus' play on the words, "the way." He replies, "Master, show us the Father, that will be enough for us." We can't understand your explanations, just give us the goods.

People throughout the ages had said the same thing. We want to know the goods. We want the favor of those exalted ones who have no suffering, no crop failures, no droughts, starvation, no Covid, no death. We want what they have, a luxury, power, honor, and glory. "Show us that, Father," Philip says. Maybe you and I say exactly the same thing! We are so attracted to the itches of our heart: to have exactly what we want, to avoid troubles, to live "the good life." Jesus' response: "Show you the Father? What are you saying, Philip? I AM showing you the Father. God is so present in my life (and death and resurrection) that to know me is to know the Father."

Let the meaning in. Jesus seems to say that God is totally within Him. They are one. You can see infinite love revealed!

Can you or I look at the Cross and the Resurrection and see God's infinite love embedded there? Can we see a love that is stronger than death, stronger than honor, power, riches, stronger than a "trouble-free life?"

It is The Way to freedom.

Restoring the Cup During Holy Communion

Bishop Larry Silva has decided to allow parishes to restore Holy Communion under both kinds (bread and wine), starting Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023. The Church has always taught the doctrine of concomitance, by which we know that under each species alone, the whole Christ is sacramentally present and we receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1390) states: "Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite."

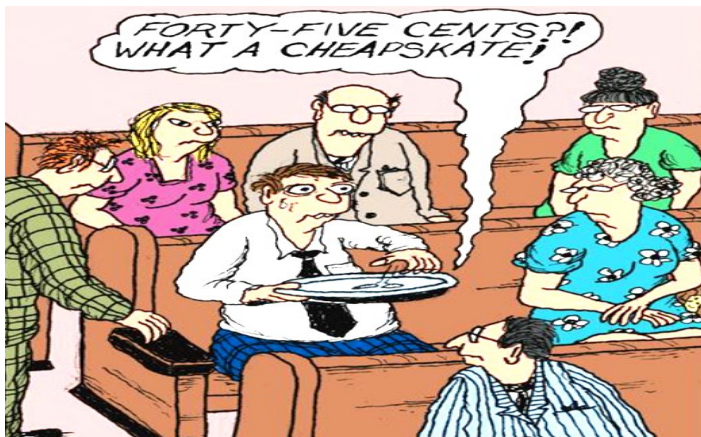

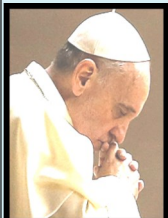

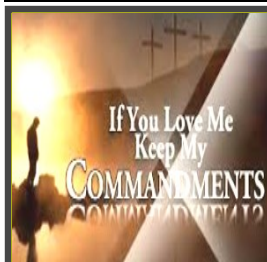

WHERE THE HEART IS

Some would say that the purpose of life is to save one's soul. And certainly we should try, with the grace of God, to live our lives in such a way that we avoid evil and do good in order to do our part in building God's kingdom on earth. At the same time, we must remember that it is God who saves us. We don't save ourselves. Eternal life and happiness are byproducts of loving others. If the focus of one's life is to be happy, one never achieves it. If one seeks to serve others, however, happiness seems to find us. So also eternal life.

Robert Frost's "The Death of a Hired Man" is a poem about Silas, an aging drifter farmhand, and Warren and Mary, a farming couple who gives Silas a room whenever he comes around. Silas comes when he is needed the least and leaves when his presence would be most helpful, all of which frustrates Warren. In the poem Silas has returned, and Mary thinks it will be his last time, that he is dying. She says to Warren that theirs is the only home Silas has. Warren simply shakes his head as if to gently mock the idea of home: *"Home is the place where, when you have to go there,/They have to take you in."* Mary says it differently, *"I should have called it/Something you somehow haven't to deserve."*

Is that not also the promise of Jesus? "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you?" (John 14:2). Something we somehow haven't to deserve.

Dear Padre

I know a Catholic couple who wanted to celebrate their sacrament of matrimony at a Mass in a forest, but the bishop didn't allow it. Why not marry in God's creation?

A marriage between Catholics or between a Catholic and a baptized non-Catholic is usually celebrated in a parish church. It can be celebrated in another church or oratory with the bishop or pastor's permission. A marriage between a Catholic and an unbaptized person can be celebrated in a church or another suitable place, although a Catholic church remains the preferred place for the celebration.

Why is the parish church the preferred site for the celebration? For Catholics, matrimony is a sacrament—one of the seven sacred signs through which God communicates love to us. When Catholics ask God to bind their union as a sacrament, the couple's love for each other is a sign of God's love for both, and their union is also a continuous sign of Christ's love for the Church. Thus, the church as a "house of God," which contains the presence of Christ, is revered as the most sacred place to make this most sacred commitment. Marriage, according to Pope Francis in a 2015 General Audience, *"is not merely a ceremony in a church, with flowers, a dress, photographs...Christian marriage is a sacrament that takes place in the Church, and which also makes the Church, by giving rise to a new family community...[Saint] Paul says that the love between spouses is an image of the love between Christ and His Church. An unimaginable dignity!"*

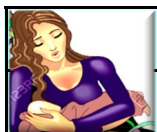

Msgr. Lorenzo Miranda was born in Detroit, Michigan on November 30, 1956, and grew up in Camarillo, California, where he attended elementary and high school, and was a member of Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic church in Oxnard, California. He is the fifth child of 13, with 9 brothers and 3 sisters.

- ◆ Before entering St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, he received a Degree in Engineering from Stanford University and later studied medicine at UCLA. Realizing that he was called to the priesthood, Msgr. Lorenzo joined the Missionaries of the Holy Spirit, whom he knew from Oxnard, California. Eventually, the Holy Spirit led Msgr. Miranda to the Diocesan Priesthood, and he was then ordained by Cardinal Mahony for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in 1991.
- ◆ Over the years, Msgr. Lorenzo has served the people of God in many ways. As a priest who is perfectly bilingual, he effectively served the people of God as Associate Pastor in three large parishes in the Archdiocese: St. Anthony in San Gabriel; St. Emydius in Lynwood; and St. Albert the Great in Rancho Dominguez. During that time, he represented his colleagues in the Priest Council for 3 years.
- ◆ Msgr. Lorenzo was the Pastor of St. Louis of France church in La Puente from July 1, 1999, until June 30, 2009. During those years at St. Louis, he was also Dean (Vicar Forane) in Deanery #11 for three years and served on the Archdiocesan Priest Council Executive Committee from 1991 to 2001.
- ◆ Msgr. Lorenzo was elected Associate Vicar for Clergy in 2009. Eventually, he became the Vicar for Clergy and served at this position until 2016. After most recently serving as Pastor at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Downey for 6 years, he is now the Director of the House Prayer for Priests.
