The Mystery of Presence and Absence in Love

There are so many times when someone we love has to go away, or we have to go away. There are many times when, for whatever reason, someone has to move on and irrevocably change a relationship. Almost always this is painful, sometimes so painful that it leaves us feeling restless and empty, as if all the color, energy, and joy have gone out of our lives.

Parents, for example, experience this when their children grow up and leave home to start lives of their own. When a child leaves home to go to college, to get married, or take a job elsewhere, we are often left with a restless heartache that leaves us feeling empty. But after a while in the full bloom of adulthood, the child comes back to visit us our heartache can just as quickly disappear because our loved one can offer us a richer love and presence that he or she could not when they were little. The pain of losing someone turns into the joy of finding something deeper in the one whom we thought we had lost.

When Jesus was preparing His disciples for His ascension, He told them, *"It is better for you that I go away! You won't understand this now. You will grieve and have heavy hearts, but later, this will turn to joy and you will understand why I have to do this because, unless I go away, I can't send you my spirit."*

These are unspoken words that children say to their parents when they leave home to begin lives on their own; unspoken words we say to our friends when we have to move on to get married; unspoken words spouses sometimes say to each other when they have to grow in ways to make their marriage stronger, but on any given day, leave their partner with a heartache.

The interplay of presence and absence in love is a great mystery. We need to be present to each other, but we also need to be gone from each other at times. We bring a blessing both when we visit someone and when we leave after the visit is over. Presence is partly predicated on absence and there is something of our spirit that we can only give by going away.

What the pain of absence does is stretch our hearts so that the essence, the beauty, the love, and the gift of the one who is absent can flow to us without being colored by the tensions, disappointments, and the flaws of everyday life. As well, the other's absence can work to stretch our hearts so that we can receive him or her in way that more fully accepts and respects who he or she really is. That's why our children have to go away before we can accept that they are no longer children, but adults like ourselves, with lives of their own.

The mystery of saying goodbye is really the mystery of the Ascension, the most under-understood mystery both inside and outside of religion. The Ascension is about going away so our loved ones can fully receive our spirit. It's about the mystery of saying goodbye, when goodbye isn't really goodbye at all, but only love's way of taking on a different modality so that it can be present in a way that's deeper, purer, more permanent, less-clinging, and less-limited by the tensions, disappointments, inadequacies, wounds and betrayals that, this side of eternity, forever make our intimacy a work in progress.

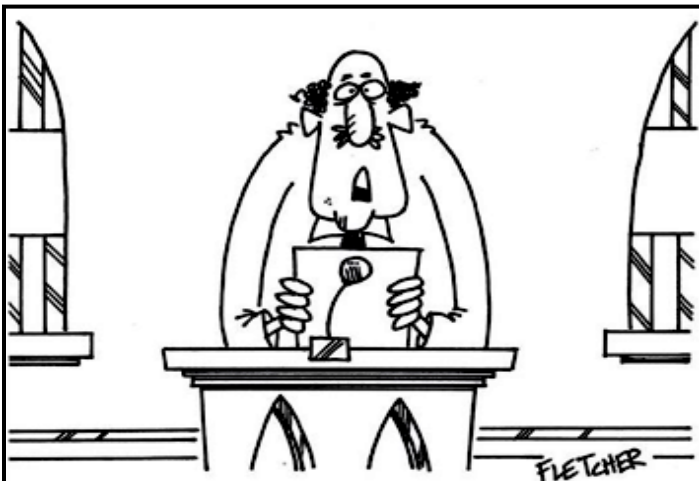

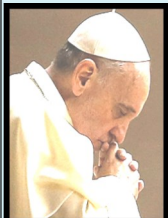
LET'S TAKE A MOMENT... By Tere Hunt

The church is a place where we can find solace, comfort, fellowship and solidarity. However, there are certain groups that are somehow overlooked due to mitigating circumstances and are often forgotten, disregarded or wholly neglected: (1) We don't seem to have enough programs for the single or those who have never been married, childless, or the divorced who becomes single and are desperately trying to provide for their orphaned families, standing in for the missing parent. (2) After graduation the kids enter college, and with their hectic schedule, are unable to attend church functions and participation gradually becomes scarce. (3) How about the sick or those unable to come to church due to an incessant battle with long-term illness, or perhaps those we might still see but are unable to share that they're sick, or terminally ill. Here at St. Jude, we are fortunate to have a range of ministries, i.e., widows/widowers' ministry, bereavement ministry who are operational so those affected don't feel isolated without the presence of their loved ones. (4) Financially struggling people feel invisible. They opt out of church activities because they can't afford it. Unable to pay their bills, they grapple with their self-worth. (5) Lastly, we discount the simply shy and extremely introverted who finds any group too challenging and feel strained to expend a lot of their energy.

The church is diverse and Jesus is our common bond, so what better way than to show kindness where all can come and worship without judgment? We may not have much in common with our other kin. Jesus died for all of us, even for those that denied Him, so it is incumbent upon us to include EVERYONE. Let us make our church far reaching, even more welcoming, more inclusive and valued. Let's join our choir sing ...♪Go make a difference...we can make a difference...go make a difference in the world...♪

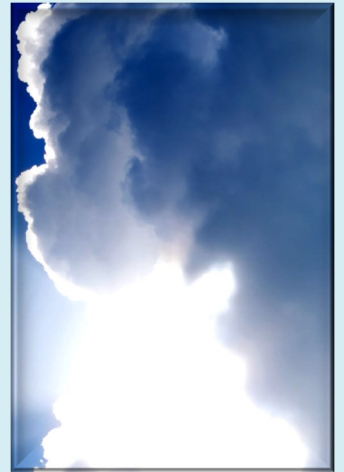
POWER UNMASKED

When the Lone Ranger and Tonto rode across our TV screens in days of old, someone would often ask, *"Who was that masked man?"* Folks never learned his identity, and it didn't matter. For that man had saved them from evil, restoring their lives. In a sense, the Ranger, with Tonto, had passed on to them the power to live safely and productively.

As he was about to return to His Father, the risen Lord said to the apostles, *"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses"* (Acts 1:8). Yet being blessed with the power that raised the Lord Jesus does not always feel much like a blessing. At times it can feel more like a burden that falls upon our shoulders, one to heal and mend as we try to bring peace and a better world.

We wonder why we always must be the one who says, *"I'm sorry."* Why must we always be the one who plans the evening out or writes the Christmas cards or calls Mom or spends time with the children or listens to someone's tale of woe? Yet such is the power of Jesus for bringing about healing to both spirits and bodies, for creating joy, for designing bridges into the hearts of others, all because the Messiah rode off on a cloud of silver to be welcomed to the right hand of God. Thus, He empowers us.

Have you ever been surprised by the good God has brought about through you?

Dear Padre

Why should I be confirmed?

In baptism, God calls you to be a priest, prophet and king. In confirmation, you receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit to live out those vocations. A priest offers prayer and sacrifice. In confirmation, you are moved to make your everyday life a sacrifice that you join to the sacrifice of Christ on the cross (Romans 12:1). *Prophet* is from *prophetes*, a Greek word meaning "spokesperson." In confirmation, you are compelled to preach the gospel (1 Corinthians 9:16), just as the apostles were when they received the Holy Spirit on the original day of Pentecost (Acts 2:2-4). When you were baptized, you were made a member of the royal family of God (1 Peter 2:9). Jesus as Jesus showed what it means to be a Servant King, so are we called to serve others in love. In confirmation, we are inspired by the love that God pours into us in His Holy Spirit (Romans 5:5). In His first public preaching, Jesus quoted from Isaiah the prophet: *"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me"* (Luke 4:18). That was the beginning of His public ministry. When the bishop anoints you with chrism, you can say the same. Your confirmation is the beginning of your own public ministry.

Msgr. Lorenzo Miranda was born in Detroit, Michigan on November 30, 1956, and grew up in Camarillo, California, where he attended elementary and high school, and was a member of Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic church in Oxnard, California. He is the fifth child of 13, with 9 brothers and 3 sisters.

- ◆ Before entering St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, he received a Degree in Engineering from Stanford University and later studied medicine at UCLA. Realizing that he was called to the priesthood, Msgr. Lorenzo joined the Missionaries of the Holy Spirit, whom he knew from Oxnard, California. Eventually, the Holy Spirit led Msgr. Miranda to the Diocesan Priesthood, and he was then ordained by Cardinal Mahony for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in 1991.
- ◆ Over the years, Msgr. Lorenzo has served the people of God in many ways. As a priest who is perfectly bilingual, he effectively served the people of God as Associate Pastor in three large California parishes in the Archdioceses: St. Anthony in San Gabriel; St. Emydius in Lynwood; and St. Albert the Great in Rancho Dominguez. During that time, he represented his colleagues in the Priest Council for 3 years.
- ◆ Msgr. Lorenzo was the Pastor of St. Louis of France church in La Puente, California from July 1, 1999, until June 30, 2009. During those years at St. Louis, he was also Dean (Vicar Forane) in Deanery #11 for three years and served on the Archdiocesan Priest Council Executive Committee from 1991 to 2001.
- ◆ Msgr. Lorenzo was elected Associate Vicar for Clergy in 2009. Eventually, he became the Vicar for Clergy and served at this position until 2016. After most recently serving as Pastor at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Downey, California for 6 years, he is now the Director of the House Prayer for Priests.

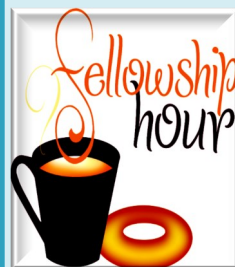
