Today's Gospel Reflection

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Who is in Control?

The gospel reading reminds us of a previous miracle in Matthew 8:23-27 where Jesus calmed the sea. In this event, Jesus was in the boat but He was sleeping. When the disciples awoke Him, He chastised them for their "little faith." Then the disciples were amazed and question who Jesus was that He can calm the waters and the wind obeys Him.

In this passage, Jesus was outside the boat and the disciples mistook Him for a ghost. For indeed, no ordinary person can walk on water. Yet Jesus is not just an ordinary human being. He is divine. He is God and He can control everything. At this time, the disciples proclaimed that Jesus is "truly the Son of God." They have at last recognized the divinity of Jesus.

Storms do come and go in our life. Jesus has the same message to us. *"Take courage. Do not be afraid."* May we always remember that He is God; that He is always with us; and that He is in control.

For the 2nd leg of our family vacation, our scheduled landing was triggered with horrendous thunderstorms, diverting us to yet another airport 2 hours away, for a total of approx. 8 hours journey one way! We had finally reached my son's charming domain near close to midnight and bless her heart, my elderly mother albeit weary from travel, was determined to meet her extended family come what may: "Lola!...grandma!...grandpa!" eagerly greeted us at the foyer and the overall fatigue was energized with joy and elation. After 2+ tours of duty at the frontline, my son developed PTSD, which he controls with bouts of OCD. "The house is immaculate!" my mother whispers! And if you've seen the Sound of Music, then you would remember the scene where the Von Trapp children would march to meet their new governess. Such is the military discipline familiarized at his home, but without the whistle. For example, his influenced kids are fully mindful that sprinting across 3 flights of stairs is strictly forbidden (but for the 6 year-old artist who forgets when dad is out of earshot). Our short holiday was peppered with laughter, heart-to-heart conversations and long overdue huddles that bridged the years of separation. Three generations bittersweetly reunited, frozen in time, oblivious to the pressures of the real world, nevertheless certain that the progenies' future is intact. When you reach this milestone, there is profound relief within, worthy of heartwarming pride that as a single parent, you verily did good! The myriads of worry borne for an eternity can slowly dissipate. And although our time in this world is so bloody limited, one can fervently hope and implore on His Will that Love and Religion defines their moral compass. GET OUT OF THE BOAT

As priests, we're expected to plan our own funerals, including the Scripture readings. As it happens, I chose the Gospel for this Sunday, the one about Jesus walking across the water and inviting Peter to trust and step out of the boat and come to Him. You may think it is strange for a funeral, but it's been pretty much the story of my life.

Often there have been times when I was asked to go, like Peter being asked to get out of the boat. Ultimately I realized that those were also the very times when I seemed most aware of God's presence. Oh, I think God was always there, it's simply that my own ego often got in the way. It was when I gave in that I most felt buoyed by God. In fact, the least satisfying assignment was the one I eagerly sought out, and some of those I resisted turned out to be graced. Like Peter, it's good to do what doesn't always make sense.

What does all this have to do with my choice of this Scripture reading for my funeral? Well, every time I have stepped out of the boat of security, God has been there to sustain me. I figure there is going to be no bigger "stepping out" than death, so I'm expecting God will be there as well.

Dear Padre

At what precise point in the Mass does the bread and wine turn into the Body and Blood of Christ?

For many centuries, thinkers in the Western and Eastern Churches have pondered this question. Some say the moment of consecration happens at the beginning of the sentence, "This is my body." Others say it happens at the conclusion of that sentence. Still others claim it happens sometime during the sentence. The same theories were proposed about the consecration of the cup. From the Eastern Churches, the theory was raised that it wasn't the eucharistic narrative that was consecratory, but rather the prayer of invocation to the Holy Spirit known as the *epiclesis*.

These theories continue to be debated, but to what avail? Even the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* does not specify when the consecration happens (CCC 1375-81). But knowing the precise moment it happens doesn't seem to be as important as simply knowing that the elements of bread and wine over which the prayer is prayed do become for us the Body and Blood of Christ.

This mystery of faith, moreover, adds another dimension to our lives: transformation into Christ. Whether we share in Communion at the liturgy or contemplate the Lord in the tabernacle, the loving call of the Spirit is to change our hearts. Specifically, when does that happen to us? One never knows for sure. But by participation in the mystery of faith, we're changed ever more deeply into the One whose Body and Blood we share.
