Today's Gospel Reflection

<u>First Reading</u>: Isaiah 22:19-23 <u>Second Reading</u>: Romans 11:33-36 Gospel: Matthew 16:13-20

The Rock of the Church

In the Gospel reading, Christ tells Peter that the rock on which he will found His church is exactly, Peter: The gates of hell will not prevail against him or against the church which is built on this rock. This seems a deeply comforting thought.

The problem is that it so often looks as if the gates of hell have prevailed against Christ's church. The problem actually begins with Peter. The apostle who is the rock of the Church betrayed the Lord he loved in Jesus' worst need. A betrayal like that seems to have something hellish about it, doesn't it?

In fact, wasn't Peter's betrayal of Christ just like the betrayal of Judas? But the Gospels say that Satan entered into Judas before Judas betrayed Christ (John 13:27). There is something hellish about the betrayal of Judas, then. Why not think that the gates of hell prevailed against Peter too? What is left of that deeply comforting thought about Christ's Church and the rock that it is founded on being safe from Hell?

But there is a difference between Judas and Peter. It is not that Peter repented and Judas didn't. The Gospels say that Judas repented, too (Matthew 27:3). Rather, the difference is this. When Judas saw the sin of his betrayal for what it was, he killed himself. He threw himself away as irredeemable. Peter came back to

Christ. He cleaved to the Lord he loved even in the face of his own brokenness. And that is why Peter is the rock on which the Church is founded. The Church is not a collection of the sinless, and it was not meant to be. The Church was founded on Peter, who loved, and sinned, and held on to the Lord anyway.

The gates of Hell cannot prevail against this kind of love. This is a deeply comforting thought.



Right now, do you think you are in a better place spiritually or do you feel you are still in a dark place and God is distant? Amid your everyday activity, complying with repetitive rules and simply going through the motions, does your mind wonder whether you are in your rightful place? If your mind and heart seem burdened maneuvering through the daily stress, then you lost your center and find yourself displaced. You are so caught up in your incredible world, drawn to being anxious, impatient, or worse—blasé and uninterested. This is a HUGE sign that you have become detached from God. Did you ever ponder that God placed you in that unpleasant situation? Why? Because you have pulled away from worship. You are unable to hear God's voice and hear the humble message He is sending you like: "Remember me?" He will corral you in such a hectic battle of wills that you cannot but realize you need to reconnect with Him. He is performing a reality check on where you need to be — resuming your communication with Him. When you dread each day that you no longer find meaning in your existence, that even completing the basic moves you must perform becomes tedious—you are in that rut. Frustrated, caught by forces pulling you in different directions, God will plant Himself before you. He simply wants to be close to you during your annoyance or boring progression. There is no way of escaping Him. He is with you in all your undertakings; God intercedes and intervenes in every spiritual fatigue you've confined yourself in. Grant your mind and heart to be still. Call on God and ask Him where He wants you to be led. Follow His prompt. Then let the fervor and His glow filter in and complete you!

THE JESUS OUESTION

Over the years I've asked many people what they believe about Jesus and who He is for them. I've always nudged them away from the expected answer simply because I was interested in who He was for them deep down in their spirits. It's been a whole wheelbarrow full of answers, yes it has, a full and varied garden.

Some said they thought He was a very good human being, though they hedged when I asked if they thought He was also of God. Others thought He was a prophet, though they also backed away from anything that hinted of the [Geous] said to [his disciples], "But who do you say divine. For some, Jesus was God dressed in human skin, as if that I am? - Matthew 16:15 He were simply playing at being human. Some labeled Him



a reformer and others a teacher. None of them dismissed Jesus as irrelevant or a remnant of the past. And for many, Jesus is the truth professed by Peter, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." He is the Word made flesh, the wisdom of God among us, the one who lives.

> In one way or another all of us must answer the question Jesus asks of His disciples in today's Gospel. "Who do you say that I am?" The question is just as relevant today as it was when Jesus asked it. For some, their yes is without doubt. For others, it is a questioning journey of coming to faith. All of us are faced with that question. Who is Jesus for us today in the way we live our life?



Why do Catholics believe they are the only true Church?

Roman Catholics believe our Church has historical continuity with St. Peter and the apostles who were present on the day of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit gave birth to the Church. Catholics believe the work begun by Peter and the other apostles continued under men they appointed and on whom they laid hands—giving them apostolic authority to carry their work into the next



generation. Apostolic authority, understood by Catholics to be historical and traceable, is a mark of authenticity and continuity of the Church. For Catholics, this essential mark of the Church is missing if a Christian community rejects apostolic authority and Peter's leadership of the other apostles—carried on by their successors in the persons of bishops and popes—over the last 2,000 years.

Nevertheless, "numerous elements of sanctification and truth" are present in separated Churches and ecclesial communities, and "the Spirit of Christ has not refrained from using them as instruments of salvation" (Responses to Some Questions Regarding Certain Aspects of the Doctrine on the Church, by the Vatican Offices of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, 2007).

Dialogue with other Christians continues, and we hope the love and respect we have for one another can grow over time. While our Church leaders have the role of conserving the faith we have received, all Christians should remember that the Law of Love must prevail. If we violate that principle, we fail to comprehend an essential truth of our faith.
